# Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixth Sunday in ordinary Time! Today's readings all have to do with making "right choices." The first reading from the Prophet Jeremiah places two very different scenes before the people. They must make a choice. While it may seem obvious to us it was not necessarily the case in the time of Jeremiah.

"Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul posits belief in the resurrection of Jesus as crucial to having faith, for if Jesus has not

"But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep." And finally, today's Gospel from Luke is the first part of the "Sermon on the Plain." Luke prefers Jesus on level ground with his people and he configures this narrative for a mostly Gentile audience. Again, the choice to follow the rather radical path of Jesus' teachings is not always an easy choice. But the reward is to be blessed. "Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold your reward will be great in heaven!"

Every red-blooded American believes in freedom of choice Thanks to leaders such as those we honor on this Presidents' Day weekend we live in a country of freedom. "I can do what I want!" However, today's scriptures remind us that all choices are not the same. Some bring blessing and some bring woe. Israel was threatened by very hostile enemies who wanted to annihilate God's people with military might. They sought safety in making strong alliances with a protector country. Jeremiah had a different approach and cursed those who wanted to trust in human beings over God. Jesus also had a strange idea of what would lead to blessedness: Being poor, hungry, weeping, being hated and persecuted. And he had a strange list of things that would bring woe: Riches, full stomachs, laughter, popularity. They sound like the American dream, don't they? Yet Jesus had a different dream called the kingdom of God and with a great reward in heaven.

St. Paul based his whole message on this dream. He staked his life on the resurrection of Jesus. Dead people do not come back to life. But if it didn't happen for Jesus, our faith is worthless. And we too who believe can share in the resurrection. Believing in life through death gives us a different way of looking at how we use our freedom. It may be that the American dream may not be the most important thing for us to chase. This kind of belief could make leaders pay more attention to the warnings of Jeremiah. It could also give us hope when all seems hopeless, we can turn what seems to be barrenness into a fruitful harvest. As we celebrate this Eucharist together, may we remember that: "It is in dying that we are born to eternal life."

Today's bulletin contains an important two-page letter from Bishop John Barres concerning the recent signing into state law of the "Reproductive Health Act." I urge everyone to read our Bishop's letter which is in solidarity with all the Bishops of New York State. It is our duty as Catholics and citizens to be well informed and to exercise our constitutional rights. Bishop Barres has also posted a special video on this topic which can be accessed on the diocesan website (drvc.org).

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of additional note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, an invitation to a fun-filled Night at the Races on Saturday, March 2<sup>nd</sup>, reservation info for the Sodality of Our Lady's Annual Retreat next weekend February 22-24, an order form for the new round of Parish Picks (first drawing this Monday, February 18<sup>th</sup>) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.





# St. Raymond Memorials



Often people ask if there is something they could memorialize in memory of a loved one. Besides having *Mass Intentions*, there are other opportunities for individuals, families and groups to remember a loved one in a tangible and sometimes lasting way. Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the *Bread and Wine*, the *Rose for Life* and the *Sanctuary Lamp*. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.

Your baby is about 16" - 20" long and weighs between 4 - 9 pounds. With only one month to go, a layer of fat is produced and stored beneath the skin, for both insulation and as a food supply. Antibodies that give immunity to diseases are building up. The amniotic fluid is

totally replaced every three hours, and the baby absorbs a gallon of it every day, more if the fluid is sweetened! Your baby's heart pumps 300 gallons of blood per day and the placenta begins to age. The center of the baby's bones are still hardening, but the bones in the head are soft and flexible for delivery.

Even though your baby could survive outside the womb at this point without much medical help, due to the recently passed "Reproductive Health Act," signed into law by Gov. Cuomo, it is now legal in the state of New York to have this little one killed through the gruesome procedure of abortion for any reason! Please continue to pray for your spiritually adopted baby and for his or her mother, that she will trust in God and be graced with a generous, courageous and loving heart and bring her baby to a live birth.






# **Lecture Series**

The Forgotten Heroes is a feature documentary that tells the story of courageous Italians, including sports idol Gino Bartali, who carried out ingenious schemes to rescue and protect Jews in Nazi-occupied Italy. Although Gino Bar-tali is a sports legend, his most daring triumph came when he risked his life countless times to save Jews threatened by Nazi extermination. The story of Bartali and the secret network that he was a member, is just one example of the heroism exhibited by thousands of ordinary Italians and Catholics who risked their lives to save others from capture and death.





February 11, 2019 Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you..." (Jeremiah 1:5)

At the very heart of our beliefs about who we are and why we exist, is a message of love. God creates us out of love. Out of love, He redeems us by the sacrifice of his Son, Jesus. He calls us to an eternal destiny with Him because He loves each sacred human life, created in His image.

That we are created in God's image is reaffirmed in our nation's Declaration of Independence, reminding us that we "are endowed by [our] Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." The right to life is the foundation and starting point for every other God-given human right. When that right is attacked or denied, all other rights and liberties begin to crumble.

You are probably aware that on January 22, 2019, the 46th anniversary of Ros v. Wade (the Supreme Court decision that declared an absolute constitutional right to abortion), Governor Andrew Cuomo of New York signed into law the "Reproductive Health Act", which he himself called "the most aggressive" abortion law in the country. It was then "celebrated" by his lighting up One World Trade Center and the Alfred E. Smith Building in Albany.

It is our obligation as citizens and as Catholics, to be well informed and to make our voices heard in the public square when evil and injustice threaten the sacred gift of life at any stage.

On a human level, this gruesome law should be appalling to people of every faith, or no faith. The Reproductive Health Act allows for abortion on demand with no restrictions throughout all of pregnancy. This means that as a choice, an abortion could be performed on a full-term infant as the mother is going into labor.

This law might also open the door to taking away conscience protections from medical personnel, and could be used to force doctors, nurses and other medical staff to perform or to assist in abortions. Governor Cuomo claims that he is protecting women's rights, when in fact, this law endangers the lives of women by allowing non-physicians to perform abortions, and it removes any objective standard of care due to the patient.

The Act has also removed criminal penalties when an unborn child is deliberately targeted for death in a crime. Two and a half weeks after the bill became law, the Queens District Attorney said he could not prosecute a man for the stabbing death of his unborn child in the womb of his girlfriend, because of the passage of the Reproductive Health Act.

Unimaginably, the law also repeals protections for infants who are accidentally born alive during the course of a failed abortion. This amounts to infanticide, the killing either by direct

means or by neglect of an infant who is alive outside the womb. The law is silent on reducing the pain and suffering of infants, especially those being aborted late term.

Brothers and sisters, this law is an abomination that cries out to Heaven for justice. We cannot be silent in the face of such a blatant attack on the most vulnerable among us. I invite you to do several things:

- Stay informed and educated regarding these issues and the battles ahead of us, such as
  assisted suicide and legalized surrogacy. Two outstanding resources available to you are:

- Get involved. Both web pages listed above offer easy links to contacting your elected representatives. Let the Governor and our other elected officials know that this Act violates the dignity of the human person and that you do not support it.
  - Get involved in the efforts already underway at your parish, such as Respect Life Committees. In addition, our Diocesan Respect Life Office can direct you to ways that you can support and promote the sanctity of life locally, on Long Island.
- 3. Pray. Pray the Holy Rosary. Ask the intercession of Our Blessed Mother Mary, Protector of Mothers, Defender of Life and the Family, to strengthen us so that we may be compassionate, courageous witnesses to the truth. Ask also for the intercession of Saint Thomas More, patron of statesmen, politicians, lawyers and judges, who lost his life for refusing to renounce his conscience and give in to the tides of political power and privilege.

Pray for our elected officials and for all people and pray that our politicians come to understand their profound obligation to defend the most defenseless among us. Any Catholic who actively supports an attack on the sacredness of life, chooses to place him or herself in grave moral danger and outside of the Communion of the Church. We pray for their souls, for a spirit of repentance, for a return to the truth of the love of God. It is God's love that formed each one of us in our Mother's womb.

A civilization that not only will not protect, but actually celebrates an attack on its most vulnerable members is morally bankrupt and stands on the verge of collapse. We pray for the courage of the martyrs, that an awakened spirit of evangelization and voices raised together will move hearts and minds, and call us back to our God-given senses, to the God who made us, who loves us, and who offers us our eternal destiny in love.

Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us!


