Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Hospitality is a keynote in Gospel living. It is a sacred duty rooted in our Judeo-Christian life. To some it is casual; to others it is complicated by cultural boundaries and regulations. How do I see hospitality playing out in my daily life? In the first reading from Genesis, Abraham is filled with a hospitable spirit towards God and his two messengers. Abraham was feeling uneasy about his earlier doubts and now wanted to show his faith and trust in God and his promises. "Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves and afterward you may go on your way." Then in the second reading from Colossians, Paul celebrates that the mystery of salvation is also proclaimed to Gentiles so that everyone has the hope of glory in Jesus Christ. "It is him whom we proclaim, admonishing everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone perfect in Christ." And finally in Luke's short gospel passage, we see the balance between hospitality in action and sitting at the feet of Jesus. Martha versus Mary pits hospitality, which is a lot of performing social duties against listening to every word of Jesus. Martha and Jesus do not agree on what is the most important thing. Mary has chosen the better part and Jesus supports her in her position. It is a big step in saying that women are as welcome as men to sit at the Lord's feet, and Jesus encourages them to do so. "There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

Protocols and boundaries are observed differently throughout the world. I remember years ago when I was assigned to a parish with Father Simon Fernando, a priest from Sri Lanka. One day he came to my room to talk about something. I happened to be sitting on the floor against the couch eating something on my coffee table. I know it sounds kind of awkward, but it was comfortable for me. Anyway, when I asked Father Simon to have a seat on my easy chair, he went right down to the floor like me. He said that he could not sit higher than me. That was his culture. Jesus lived in a culture that had men and women gather separately. Men were the formal hosts while women served. It was the accepted way in Jesus' culture. Mary in today's gospel crossed the line as she knelt at Jesus' feet. Martha did not and Jesus ignored the regular boundaries of hospitality.

Now we may see these as unreasonable boundaries and yet they still exist in our world. We need to sometimes put aside our cultural and personal biases and honor the ways of others. We need to carry the word of God from today's scripture into the practice of our daily lives, and interactions with all the people we meet and work with. Hospitality and right living in all our relationships are fundamental to our well-being. Good hospitality always calls for tolerance and understanding. The Holy Spirit reminds us that what is acceptable to us may be quite different from someone outside of our own culture. May the Eucharist we share call us to put our differences aside and recognize that we are all brothers and sisters in Jesus.

'We Give Thanks to God'

We give thanks to God for today's decision of the United States Supreme Court in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. This just decision will save countless innocent children simply waiting to be born.

On this historic day, our gratitude extends to the millions of heroic Americans who have worked tirelessly toward this outcome for nearly a half-century. Women and men, children and adults, believers and non-believers, people of every culture and background have advocated for life. They have been a charitable and compelling voice for the voiceless, and today, their voice has been heard.

As Catholics, we have prayed and fasted, held vigils, offered Masses, and peacefully witnessed in these last five decades. We have joined others in educating schoolchildren, opening pregnancy care centers, walking with mothers, offering post-abortion counseling, and marching, year after year, to the United States Supreme Court to witness for life. Today, our voice has been heard.

With the entire pro-life community, we are overjoyed with this outcome of the Court. However, we acknowledge the wide range of emotions associated with this decision. We call on all Catholics and everyone who supports the right to life for unborn children to be charitable, even as we celebrate an important historical moment and an answer to a prayer.

We must remember that this is a judicial victory, not a cultural one. The culture remains deeply divided on the issue, which will be evidenced by the patchwork of state statutes pertaining to abortion across the country. To change the culture and build a culture of life, we need to enact family-friendly policies that welcome children, support mothers, cherish families and empower them to thrive. We outlined our vision for a pro-life New York in our recent statement, available here, and we rededicate ourselves to helping every expectant mother to carry her baby to term.

Building a culture of life is not solely the responsibility of the government or those heroic individuals working on the front lines, in crisis pregnancy centers and other ministries. All of us need to respect the dignity and sanctity of human life in everything we do: in how we treat our children, spouses and parents; in the way we behave in our place of work; in sum, how we live Jesus' two great commandments to love God and love our neighbor.

Love, charity and reverence for human life from the moment of conception through natural death - these will build and sustain a culture of life.

Millions of Americans have worked tirelessly for almost 50 years towards this outcome. We thank them with every fiber of our being. Their vital work continues, and we commit ourselves to it.


PASTORAL COUNCIL NEWS
