

### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The purpose of today's readings is to get us to pay more attention to God who pays more detailed attention to us than we can ever imagine. In the first reading from Jeremiah, we have the prophet very candidly complaining of the hardships he has to endure in serving as God's spokesperson. Everyone seems to have turned against Jeremiah yet through it all he knows that God will never abandon him. "But the Lord is with me like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph." Then in the second reading from Romans, while death comes to all through the sin of Adam, the grace of salvation comes from one man. Jesus Christ. "For it is by the transgression of the one the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one-man Jesus Christ overflow for the many.' And finally, in Matthew's gospel we see Jesus preaching not to be afraid, but to trust in God. He knows everything about us and is always there for us. "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father."

"Did you hear the latest?" We live in a world where cable news, online news services and the people we follow on social media update the news every 30 seconds. Opinions are offered, followed by more opinions ad nauseum. "Did you hear the latest?" becomes less a question than an invitation to confusion. When Jesus spoke of "the latest" his aim was to share truth that was important and life-changing, rather than gossip and passing trivialities. The news Jesus shared, and we are called to hear on a daily basis is the "Good News" that out of love for us God pays more attention to us than we can imagine. And we are called to pay attention to God. God is always trying to reach out to us. He did so through the prophets of the Old Testament right up to his greatest revelation in Jesus Christ, his Son. Jesus constantly proclaimed that the kingdom which lasts forever is already in our midst. God pays attention to everyone and everything. It's just that his views of the latest news don't appear as an internet posting or TV news report. God's view is the important news. Because of God's love, nothing will be secret for those who remain faithful in looking for love and helping others in this world. Just pay attention to him!



Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. God's whole plan for our salvation is directed to our participation in the life of the Trinity, the communion of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Our sharing in this life begins with our Baptism, when by the power of the Holy Spirit we are joined to Christ, thus becoming adopted sons and daughters of the Father. It is strengthened and increased in Confirmation.

It is nourished and deepened through our participation in the Eucharist. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ we are at the same time united to his divinity.

Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life. "Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me" (Jn 6:57). By being united to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit dwelling

in us, we are drawn up into the eternal relationship of love among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As Jesus is the eternal Son of God by nature, so we become sons and daughters of God by adoption through the sacrament of Baptism.

Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation (Chrismation), we are temples of the Holy Spirit, who dwells in us, and by his indwelling we are made holy by the gift of sanctifying grace. The ultimate promise of the Gospel is that we will share in the life of the Holy Trinity. The Fathers of the Church called this participation in the divine life "divinization" (theosis).

In this we see that God does not merely send us good things from on high; instead, we are brought up into the inner life of God, the communion among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In the celebration of the Eucharist (which means "thanksgiving") we give praise and glory to God for this sublime gift.

Eucharistic Devotion
A little over a week ago we celebrated the
Solemnity of Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This
Feast was added to the Church calendar in
1856, but devotion to the Sacred Heart dates to
the Middle Ages. It is a feast on which we
honor the great love that Jesus has for us,
pouring out His blood on the cross as His
Sacred Heart was pierced by a lance.

On December 27, 1673, on the feast day of St. John the Apostle, Jesus appeared to Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque in France. She rested her head at the chest of Jesus in this vision and He revealed to her the desires of His Heart, which was to inspire devotion to His Sacred Heart. Jesus told her, "My Heart is so full of love for men that It can no longer contain the flames of Its burning love. I must discover to men the treasures of My Heart and save them from perdition." The famous image of the Sacred Heart with a crown of thorns around it comes from St. Margaret Mary's vision. Jesus requested three things in this vision:

To receive Communion frequently,

To receive Communion, especially on the first Friday of each month for 9 consecutive months, and

To Observe a Holy Hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament (an hour of silent prayer in front of the Eucharist in the tabernacle or exposed in a monstrance).

As the great apostle of this devotion, the Jesuit priest Henri Ramiere wrote, "It is in the Eucharist that we truly find the Heart of Jesus nearest to us; it is in the Eucharist that He unites himself in a most intimate way to us, and we to Him.

Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion

> Saint Teresa of Calcutta Foundress († 1997) Feast: September 5

"We cannot separate our lives from the Eucharist; the moment we do, something breaks."

In 1973, Mother Teresa decided to have her sisters do a daily hour of Adoration. It became their "family prayer," with the first half hour given to the rosary and the second to silence. The sisters drew miraculous strength from this period of prayer. And Mother Teresa noted, "From the time we started...we have doubled the number of vocations." She prayed for adoration to spread throughout every parish. "If I can give you any advice, I beg you to get closer to the Eucharist." Excerpt from Magnificat Magazine




### Ocean Financial Federal Credit Union Supports St. Raymond!




