Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The readings this weekend try to focus us on hearing God's presence in our lives, even with all the hustle and bustle that goes on. What do we listen for? How will God communicate with us? In the first reading from 1 Kings, the prophet Elijah is sent on a journey where he is to listen for the Lord. He doesn't hear him in the wind, an earthquake or in fire. Only when there was a tiny whispering sound did Elijah know it was God. "After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this Elijah hid his face in his cloak and went and stood at the entrance of the cave." Then in Romans, Paul laments the fact that so many of his own people have not accepted Jesus even though their own tradition leads right up to him. "Brothers and sisters: I speak the truth in Christ, I do not lie; my conscience joins with the Holy Spirit in bearing me witness that I have great sorrow and constant anguish in my heart." And finally, Matthew's gospel depicts the time when Jesus walked on the water and Peter responded by doubting. As he also walks on the water at Jesus' command, he loses his focus and begins to sink. Then Jesus reaches out his hand and pulls Peter up. The point is that Peter should never have gotten out of the boat and challenged Jesus' power. He should have kept his focus on Jesus both in and out of the boat. "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

Prayer is part of the lives of all Catholic Christians, but our expectations may vary from person to person. We have communal prayer like when we are at Mass and then we also have private prayer. We encounter God in both, but what are our expectations? How do we listen to God's voice in both types of settings? Listening for God's voice and presence in our lives has always been a mystery. Maybe we have forgotten how to listen, or we aren't hearing correctly. The example of Elijah shows us that we need to embrace silence, no matter how busy we are. Our spiritual growth requires a quiet place. Life's problems and challenges seem insurmountable enough. Quieting down is important, and we need to make it happen in our daily lives. When you make an appointment with a doctor, you keep it. Do the same with God. Take time to pray. The amount of time is not important, the fact that you pray is. Remember, we live in time, but God doesn't. God's whispering surrounds us with every breath we take.

Try to become more aware of it and look and listen in places you may not have been aware of before. The fierce storm rocking the apostle's fishing boat can be like the struggles of the early Church and of the Church now. There are many crises and struggles strong enough to drive people away. But remember that the Church cannot fail because of the Holy Spirit. Tough times can serve to strengthen our faith no matter how fiercely storms rage. And we can always trust in the Real Presence of Jesus both in our sacramental lives and within ourselves. So, take courage, listen and be not afraid.

Enjoy some refreshments and friendship with fellow parishioners and see if you will be a Backwards Money Drawing winner. All "ticket agents" remember to get your tickets back by next Sunday, the 20th.

THE TWELVE STATIONS OF THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST BACKGROUND

In the Year of the Eucharist in 2005, the Poor Clare Nuns of Perpetual Adoration in Hanceville, Alabama, built a garden containing the Twelve Stations of the Most Holy Eucharist with the intention of teaching people about the Eucharist and inspiring pilgrims who visit the Shrine.

Before building the garden, the Poor Clares studied Scripture in depth from a Eucharistic lens. This garden, unique to the Shrine, features the Scripture passages that the Nuns studied to compose the Twelve Stations.

As pilgrims wind their way through the garden, the stations explain salvation history, starting with Melchizedek in Genesis all the way to the Marriage Supper of the Lamb in the book of Revelation. Each of the twelve stations points to the reality that the Eucharist is entwined throughout both the Old and New Testaments.

The stations are filled with solid Catholic teaching, including the Passover feast foreshadowing the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross and "Bethlehem" translating to "House of Bread."

For the next eleven weeks, we will present one station for your meditation for the week.

Week 1 Thought: Since the priesthood is necessary for the Eucharist, how can I encourage priests and seminarians?

THE STATIONS OF THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST



STATION ONE MELCHIZEDEK, THE KING OF SALEM: FORESHADOWING OF A EUCHARISTIC PRIESTHOOD

"THE LORD HAS SWORN AND WILL NOT CHANGE HIS MIND, 'YOU ARE A PRIEST FOREVER AFTER THE ORDER OF MELCHIZEDEK."" PSALM 110:4

Melchizedek was "...a priest of God Most High" (Hebrews 7:1) and King of Salem. He is mentioned in the story in Genesis, Chapter 14, when Abram (soon to be Abraham) comes to Melchizedek after winning a battle. Melchizedek gives Abram a blessing and brings an offering of bread and wine (cf. Gen 14:17-20). In the Book of Psalms, David refers to Melchizedek when prophesying about the coming Messiah: "The Lord has sworn, and he will not repent: 'You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek'" (Ps 110:4).

In the Letter to the Hebrews, the author references the High Priest and the connection of Jesus to that role, "...Jesus has gone as a forerunner on your behalf, having become a high priest forever after the order of Melchizedek" (Heb 6:20).

What is the connection with Jesus? As we see in Psalm 110, Jesus is the priest appointed by God "... according to the order of Melchizedek." He is the King of Salem, which traditionally is identified with Jerusalem. Jesus was meant to come from the line of David, but Jesus is also a priest forever. David was never a priest, so where does Jesus get his priestly lineage? Jesus' lineage comes from Melchizedek as it says in the Letter to the Hebrews. He is both the great King and the great High Priest.

The Assumption of Mary and the Holy Eucharist By Deacon Steven D. Greydanus, Excerpts from National Catholic Register Blog, August 15, 2021

In November of 1950, Pope Pius XII defined in his Apostolic Constitution Munificentissimus Deus a mystery of faith that was believed from the days of antiquity – that the Blessed Virgin Mary, "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

As we contemplate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary (August 15th), the message of this monstrance is profound as there is there's a close relationship between the mystery of the Holy Eucharist and the mystery of the Mother of God which sheds light on her Assumption into heaven. "The bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh." Our Lord, the bread of life, is the eternal Word made flesh. "The Word became flesh," St. John tells us right at the beginning of his Gospel. The mystery of mysteries, that we call the Incarnation, took place within Mary's body. To serve so sacred a function in the plan of God is to be not only blessed, as Mary proclaims in her great prayer, the Magnificat, in today's Gospel, but holy in the sense of "set apart."

Mary, and Mary alone, is wholly united with her Son in an absolutely unique way, extending to every aspect of his life and his mission. It's the reason for her Immaculate Conception, her perpetual virginity, and her Assumption into heaven. The Lord has done great things for her, and we join with all prior Christian generations in calling her "blessed." Mary reigns in heaven not only as our Queen, but as our mother and as our model – the model disciple. We are invited not only to venerate her, but to imitate her in the hope of coming to share in some measure in the gifts she has in the highest degree. "SPIRITUAL FOOD ... TURNS THE PERSON WHO EATS IT INTO ITSELF, AND THUS THE PROPER EFFECT OF THIS SACRAMENT IS THE CONVERSION OF MAN INTO CHRIST, SO THAT HE MAY NO LONGER LIVE FOR HIMSELF, BUT THAT CHRIST MAY LIVE IN HIM." St. Thomas Aquinas

Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion

St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross Nun & Martyr († 1942) Feast: August 9

"To have divine love as its inner form, a woman's life must be a Eucharistic life. Only in daily, confidential relationship with the Lord in the tabernacle can one forget self, become free of all one's own wishes and pretensions, and have a heart open to all the needs and wants of others."

Edith Stein was born in 1891 in a German Jewish family. Despite her Jewish upbringing, Edith considered herself agnostic. That all changed when she read the autobiography of St. Teresa of Avila – which led to her conversion to Catholicism.

She eventually felt called to be a cloistered Carmelite nun, like her hero St. Teresa, and took the name Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. In 1938, she was sent to the Netherlands to escape the Nazi regime, but in 1942, she was arrested in retaliation for the Dutch bishops' defiance of Hitler. She was martyred in a gas chamber in Auschwitz.

St. Teresa Benedicta believed that women in particular need a relationship with Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. She stated that, by nature, a woman longs to give herself to another and be completely embraced in turn. But no other human can completely fulfill that role for her. "Only God can welcome a person's total surrender." Therefore, the Eucharist is the only place where one can know that they are loved completely, absolutely, securely, infinitely, and eternally.




