

Father Chuck's Corner

Alleluia! Alleluia! Happy Easter! Let the great 50 Day Feast begin! "This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad." During this past week we have been focusing on Jesus, from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his Last Supper with the apostles, his Crucifixion and Death on Calvary and today his glorious Resurrection. Now is the time for us to take the next step on our faith journey. In today's gospel, the implications of Jesus' Resurrection sink in gradually for Mary Magdalene, Peter and John, the Beloved Disciple. Whatever they thought they knew about Jesus during his earthly life must now be reconsidered. Scattered facts about Jesus give way to completely new relationships for these people who had felt pretty secure in their identity.

Because of the Risen Jesus, Peter in today's first reading sees that God's plan is much wider than Peter ever expected. Mary Magdalene and John now begin radically new relationships with Jesus. Mary will later be called "the apostle to the apostles." She too must grow in faith. Between Paeer and John, it is John who truly believes. The ramifications of Jesus's Resurrection unfold over time, creating for each of these three characters a very new relationship with Jesus and with each other.

Jesus' followers, then and now are tempted to add his Resurrection to what else they know about him, but not regarding it as a "big deal" that requires major changes in their lives. Allowing the Resurrection to change completely their relationship to Jesus and one another can be quite scary. Jesus is not interested in being "squeezed in" to one's life. Faith is not a wall to protect Christians but rather an invitation that allows us to love as generously as God does. Every faith journey has a next step. The question we must ask ourselves is "Am I ready to take it?" Today we hearken back to the promises made for us at our baptism. Today we make those promises anew with the grace of a Lenten journey that has hopefully brought us closer to Jesus. This Easter Mass helps our relationship with Jesus and one another to grow. It keeps telling us, "With God's grace, you can do all things that God invites you to do." So, let your Easter joy now shine for all to see! On this great and glorious day, I am happy to announce that our parish website has been completely redone. I think you will agree when you

check us out that we certainly have "new life" online. Go right to saintraymonds.org and you will find your same parish on the same site but with a whole new look. And there's more to come so keep checking us out. Also, I want to invite



all parishioners to receive a gift from St. Raymond Parish. We now have a parish subscription to *FORMED* which is a wonderful Catholic resource of entertaining movies, inspiring talks, faith formation material, popular eBooks, and all in one place. 




