

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The call of all of us as disciples of Jesus is to live the works of mercy. They should be a constant, visible and even central aspect of our life as a follower of Jesus Christ. In the first reading from the Prophet Isaiah, the Israelites are to share what they have with all those in need, whether they are hungry or homeless. When they do, they will be close to the Lord and protected by him at all times. **"Then you shall call the Lord and he will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: Here I am!"** The Responsorial Psalm and Gospel Acclamation both echo that following the ways of the Lord is living in the light. **"The just man is a light in darkness to the upright."** **"I am the light of the world, says the Lord: whoever follows me will have the light of life."** Finally, the short gospel passage from Matthew shows Jesus using the examples of salt and light as signs that a person is living as a true disciple. The seasoning of one through good works is like salt and when one's life of faith is being lived it shines for all to see. **"Just so, your light must shine before others; that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."**

Learning "stuff" about our faith is very important so that we can understand and grow deeper in our relationship with God. This is all good. But there can also be another side to all this learning. By learning a lot, we can get caught up just in our heads over all sorts of matters. Faith can become an assortment of statements or explanations or arguments. Faith becomes just "**thinking the right stuff.**" And we find ourselves forgetting that faith is really about doing the right stuff. Are we people who mostly talk about our faith or do we actually demonstrate the "**power**" of it. And the power of a faithful life is not really power at all but living a life of service. It is living the power of love, which is really the only real evidence that we have any sort of authentic faith at all. If right thoughts and right sayings don't manifest themselves in the choices we make, our faith is more of an illusion.

It is a lot easier to give our assent to what the Church says and teaches and call that faith. But it is a lot harder to accept the challenge from God to give of ourselves in the complete, selfless way he asks, by being radically merciful, and wastefully generous, and relentlessly forgiving and sincerely humble and unstoppably kind. These are God-things which can make the difference in the lives of others and in the transformation of the world.

And this is how we become salt, making situations a little bit better, more hopeful, more beautiful and uplifting. And this is how we become light, the light that brightens other's lives, bringing warmth to their hearts and souls. Each of our lives says something and what we say comes out most clearly by what we actually do in our lives, how we treat people. Let's use what we believe in our heads to shape what really matters; the choices we make. That's where our faith will truly rest.

I will repeat this paragraph one last time. I recently spoke with Father Jim Isabacki who is trying to build a small school for his people back in Uganda. At this time, Father Jim faces a road-block in completing the task. I said I would try to help so I have asked if anyone would like to make a donation to assist Father Jim, I would collect the money and get it to him as soon as possible. If you would like to donate, please do so by dropping off any donation to my attention at the rectory. If using a check, make it out to St. Raymond Church and write "**Fr Jim's School**" on the memo line. The goal at this point is to raise an additional \$5000. I know many people remember Father Jim fondly and still keep in touch with him. Any donation amount will be most appreciated. Thanks to all who have already donated and those who will still do so.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is the **Healing Mass** on Wednesday evening, February 11th, the **Come and See Centerfold**, the **Communal Prayer Before Mass** (found on the inside back cover), an invitation to join **FORMED** (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great week. **Smile, share, put your faith into action and remember: A ship in the harbor is safe, but that is not what ships are built for.** God bless always.



SUMMARY OF THE
READINGS FOR
THE WEEK

For the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, in the Gospel Jesus teaches his disciples that their lives are meant to be salt and light in the world, calling them to live in a way that blesses others and glorifies the Father, as he proclaims, "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world," reminding us that "your light must shine before others" so that all may see good deeds and praise God.

Tuesday of this week is the Optional Memorial of Saint Scholastica (religious), who was the twin sister of Saint Benedict and founder of the order of Benedictine sisters.

Wednesday is the Optional Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes in which the Church recalls the first of eighteen apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Saint Bernadette Soubirous at the Grotto of Massabielle in Lourdes, France during 1858. During these apparitions, the Blessed Mother revealed



"I am the Immaculate Conception" and encouraged everyone: "Penance, penance, penance, pray for sinners."

Friday, is the Memorial of Saints Cyril (Monk), and Methodius (Bishop), who are 9th-century Byzantine brothers revered as the "Apostles to the Slavs" and known for their evangelization and translation of Bible into the local language.

This week, the First Readings come primarily from 1 Kings chapters 8-12. The readings tell of the dedication of Solomon's temple, the wisdom and

leadership of Israel's kings, and the divisions and challenges of the kingdom. These passages highlight God's faithfulness to his covenant, the importance of prayerful leadership and obedience, and the dangers that arise when leaders and people turn away from faithfulness to God.

The Gospels this week emphasize Jesus' compassionate presence and His call to deeper faith, whether through physical healing, challenging established norms, or providing abundantly for those who follow Him.

On Wednesday (Mark 7:14-23), Jesus teaches that "what comes from within... is what defiles the man," challenging listeners to interior conversion of heart rather than mere external observance.

As the week progresses, the Gospels of Mark continue with Jesus' encounters that broaden understanding of faith. On Thursday (Mark 7:24-30) he ministers to a woman whose faith leads to healing, proclaiming that "great is your faith,"

On Friday (Mark 7:31-37) he heals a deaf man, showing that Christ opens ears and hearts to receive God's word. On Saturday (Mark 8:1-10) he generously feeds a great crowd, revealing his compassionate provision in abundance.



In the Gospel for Sunday, February 15th (Sixth Week in Ordinary Time) Jesus deepens the meaning of the law by moving from external observance to interior conversion, teaching that true righteousness flows from the heart, for "I have come not to abolish but to fulfill" the law.

Daily Prayer This Week

This week's Gospels call us to live a faith that shines, heals, and provides compassionately in everyday life, shaping how we pray, work, and love.

Monday – Healing Presence



“As many as touched him were made whole.” (Mark 6:56) Jesus’ healing presence reminds me that true restoration begins when I bring my needs, stresses, and relationships into His nearness rather than carrying them alone. In family and work life, I am invited to trust that Christ’s quiet presence can bring wholeness even when solutions are not immediate.

My Prayer: Lord Jesus, draw me close to you today and heal what is weary, anxious, or broken within me.

Tuesday – Sincere Faith

“This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me.” (Mark 7:6) Jesus challenges me to align my outward religious practice with an interior love that shapes how I speak, work, and serve others. This Gospel calls me to examine whether my daily choices reflect genuine faith or mere routine.

My Prayer: Father, purify my heart so that my words and actions flow from sincere love for you.

Wednesday – Interior Conversion

“Hear me, all of you, and understand.” (Mark 7:14) Christ teaches that true holiness begins within, urging me to confront attitudes and habits that quietly shape my behavior at home and at work. By listening attentively to his word, I allow God's grace to transform my heart from the inside out.

My Prayer: Holy Spirit, help me listen deeply and change what needs conversion within me.

Thursday – Persistent Trust

“For saying this, you may go; the demon has left your daughter.” (Mark 7:29) The faith of the woman who persists before Jesus encourages me to bring my concerns to Him with humility and perseverance. In moments of discouragement or unanswered prayer, I am reminded that trust opens the door to grace.

My Prayer: Jesus, strengthen my faith so I may trust you even when the path is unclear.



Friday Be Opened

“Ephphatha!”—that is, “Be opened!” (Mark 7:34) Jesus’ healing command invites me to open my ears to God’s voice and my heart to the needs of others. This Gospel challenges me to listen more attentively in my relationships and respond with compassion rather than impatience.

My Prayer: Lord, open my ears to your word and my heart to love as you love.

Saturday – Compassionate Provision

“They ate and were satisfied.” (Mark 8:8) Jesus’ feeding of the crowd reassures me that God sees human need and responds with generous care. When resources feel limited and responsibilities heavy, I am called to trust that Christ can multiply even my small offerings.



My Prayer: Lord Jesus, help me trust in your abundance and share generously what you have given me.




Food donations can be brought to the Ryan House during its open hours or non-perishable food can be left in the bin on the Ryan House porch or in the Altar Server's Sacristy.

Saints Cyril and Methodius were two brothers and Byzantine Christian theologians known as the "Apostles to the Slavs". Born in Thessalonica, they were pioneering missionaries who significantly influenced the religious and cultural development of the Slavic peoples.



Scholastica was an Italian Christian consecrated virgin and the sister of Benedict of Nursia. She is traditionally regarded as the foundress of the Benedictine nuns. Saint Scholastica is primarily recognized as the patron saint of nuns and, more broadly, of religious sisters.






