Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Feast of Pentecost! Our celebration of Pentecost brings to a close the Easter season and ushers us back into Ordinary Time with week number nine. Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church with scripture imagery that feeds our faith. The locked room where the disciples were gathered in fear and uncertainty, howling winds, the sudden appearance of the Resurrected Jesus, the descent of the Holy Spirit, speaking in various languages-all this can set our hearts and imaginations on fire. God's ongoing plan continues. In the first reading from Acts, Luke speaks of a certain fulfillment with the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. A new creation is now taking place as the Church is being birthed. It is fitting that the Holy Spirit's gift as tongues of fire will show that the word of God is to be proclaimed to all the world. "And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul expounds on the power, truth, and unifying quality of the Holy Spirit. "For in one spirit we were baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one spirit." And finally, John's gospel ends the Easter season by once again telling of the appearance of Jesus to his disciples in the locked room on the same day he was raised from the dead. Jesus offers them peace and the Holy Spirit in this first resurrection appearance. "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

All of us have fears and anxieties. Sometimes those feelings threaten to paralyze us, and we freeze up, thinking we are totally helpless. Where can we turn? The apostles felt like this before Jesus appeared to them. But when he did, fears dissolved as they were gifted by the Holy Spirit and the teachings of Jesus became crystal clear. Though fear is very real, we decide how much it controls us and in what direction it moves us. On Pentecost, the room full of fearful disciples became a room full of courage and purpose. The Holy Spirit grabbed hold of the apostles to affect the genesis of the Church. Pentecost encourage us too, to grab hold of the Holy Spirit and allow us to be led by and to the goodness of God. God's plan of salvation continues now as we go back into Ordinary Time. Today's feast provides the energy and grace we need for the rest of the Church year. Remember that we are a community of faith. No one does it alone.

We clearly need each other. The Holy Spirit has given us all gifts to be used for the mission of the Church. We are one body with many parts. Our duty as Catholic Christians is to fulfill the mission started by Jesus through his disciples and reaching to the ends of the earth down through all the ages.

St. Raymond Parish is celebrating Pentecost in a special way this year. The banners of our various parish ministries are being displayed in our church throughout the weekend. There will be *Hospitality* in the school cafeteria after all the morning Masses. Information about our parish's ministries as well as copies of our new updated *Parish Ministry Guide Booklet* will be available for everybody. We have been trying to get our ministries back in action after the COVID-19 years and we hope to encourage new members to join. Please stop by after Mass, have some refreshments, share some fraternity with fellow parishioners and see what is going on. We'd love to have you aboard.

Last Sunday we had our semi-annual Parish Blood Drive. Parishioners donated *84 pints* of blood to help meet this crucial need. Thanks to all who gave blood and thanks to our Parish Blood Drive Committee for organizing this most important community event.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Parish Social Ministry, a request for Parishioner Emails to foster better communication from the rectory, the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back cover of the bulletin), an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.
