### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Seventeenth Sunday in ordinary Time! It's kingdom time and the readings today show us that God desires that we set our minds and hearts, our prayers, and efforts on seeking and building his kingdom. We need to reflect on whether the desires of our hearts and our lives are in line with God's desires. In the first reading from 1 Kings, we see that Solomon is now the king of Israel. He is young and inexperienced, yet he knows that his task as king is to serve the God of Israel. He asks for wisdom to do just that. God's response to him was one of perfect approval. "I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one to equal vou." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul reflects on God's graces which brings us goodness and guides us to the kingdom. "Brothers and sister: We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." And finally, Matthew's gospel of parables concludes with three short ones that emphasize the kind of single-mindedness required for possessing the kingdom of heaven. God's kingdom is so full of richness that whatever it takes to acquire justifies the effort. Whether it is a treasure buried in a field, or fine pearls, or a net for catching fish, the effort expended is well worth the reward of God's kingdom. All these parable revelations are to justify the words of Jesus: "Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth; for you have revealed to little ones the mysteries of the kingdom."

What would be your wish for anything if you had one to make? Would it be for the good of others or a selfish one? God was pleased with Solomon's wish because it was for something that would serve the good of others, namely understanding for God's chosen people. Now God does encourage us to ask him for any desire in our heart, but we should also be mindful to pray for the good of the larger community. This is what we do in the Prayer of the Faithful at Mass. In the gospel parables, the first two turn our attention from wishes and requests to treasure hunting. They encourage us to give everything we have for the treasure of the kingdom of heaven. If you had to give everything you had to who or what would give your all? And what would the kingdom of heaven look and feel like here on earth? Would it look like one big family who made sure everyone had enough food, clothing, and shelter? Just what would you be willing to do for God's kingdom right here on earth?



Is Christ present during the celebration of the Eucharist in other ways in addition to his Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament?

Yes. Christ is present during the Eucharist in various ways. He is present in the person of the priest who offers the sacrifice of the Mass. According to the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council, Christ is present in his Word "since it is he himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church."

He is also present in the assembled people as they pray and sing, "for he has promised 'where two or three are gathered together in my name there am I in the midst of them' (Mt 18:20)" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, no. 7). Furthermore, he is likewise present in other sacraments; for example, "when anybody baptizes it is really Christ himself who baptizes" (ibid.).

We speak of the presence of Christ under the appearances of bread and wine as "real" in order to emphasize the special nature of that presence. What appears to be bread and wine is in its very substance the Body and Blood of Christ. The entire Christ is present, God and man, body and blood, soul and divinity.

While the other ways in which Christ is present in the celebration of the Eucharist are certainly not unreal, this way surpasses the others. "This presence is called 'real' not to exclude the idea that the others are 'real' too, but rather to indicate presence par excellence, because it is substantial and through it Christ becomes present whole and entire, God and man" (Mysterium Fidei, no. 39)

### Why do we call the presence of Christ in the Eucharist a "mystery?"

The word "mystery" is commonly used to refer to something that escapes the full comprehension of the human mind. In the Bible, however, the word has a deeper and more specific meaning, for it refers to aspects of God's plan of salvation for humanity, which has already begun but will be completed only with the end of time. In ancient Israel, through the Holy Spirit God revealed to the prophets some of the secrets of what he was going to accomplish for the salvation of his people (cf. Am 3:7; Is 21:28; Dan 2:27-45).

Likewise, through the preaching and teaching of Jesus, the mystery of "the Kingdom of God" was being revealed to his disciples (Mk 4:11-12). St. Paul explained that the mysteries of God may challenge our human understanding or may even seem to be foolishness, but their meaning is revealed to the People of God through Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit (cf. 1 Cor 1:18-25, 2:6-10; Rom 16:25-27; Rev 10:7).

The Eucharist is a mystery because it participates in the mystery of Jesus Christ and God's plan to save humanity through Christ. We should not be surprised if there are aspects of the Eucharist that are not easy to understand, for God's plan for the world has repeatedly surpassed human expectations and human understanding (cf. Jn 6:60-66).

For example, even the disciples did not at first understand that it was necessary for the Messiah to be put to death and then to rise from the dead (cf. Mk 8:31-33, 9:31-32, 10:32-34; Mt 16: 21-23, 17:22-23, 20:17-19; Lk 9:22, 9:43-45, 18:31-34).

Furthermore, any time that we are speaking of God we need to keep in mind that our human concepts never entirely grasp God. We must not try to limit God to our understanding but allow our understanding to be stretched beyond its normal limitations by God's revelation.

Eucharistic Adoration Is More Powerful Than You Can Possibly Imagine By Maryella Hierholzer, Excerpt from National Catholic Register Blog, April 23, 2021

Over the past several years, I have been impressed with the work of a young priest in Baltimore, Fr. James Boric. His efforts at starting and arranging housing for people directly involved in the street evangelization of the Catholic faith has been most fruitful. Still, what is most amazing is how he is determined to establish perpetual Eucharistic Adoration from the Basilica of the Assumption in Baltimore. "Now is the time for perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in Baltimore city. This city needs Jesus Christ."

Fr. Boric cites an example of how establishing Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration changed Ciudad Juárez 10 years ago when it was the most dangerous city in Mexico because of drugs and gang violence. Missionaries, led by Fr, Patrico Hileman, intervened and in 2013, they established Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in the heart of Ciudad Juárez. By 2015, the number of murders dropped to 256, notes Father Boric. As Father Hileman said very clearly, 'When a parish adores God, day and night, the city is transformed.' Fr. Boric concludes, that "when Jesus is brought into a city, things get better. Period."

Postscript: During his 5 years as rector of the Baltimore Basilica, Fr. Boric established perpetual adoration, expanded hours for the sacrament of reconciliation, hosted archdiocesan Rosary Congresses, and grew the urban ministries. young adult and With his encouragement, 4 parishioners entered the seminary and 3 women entered religious life. In 2022, after much discernment about a long-held attraction to monastic life, he received approval to join the Hermits of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel at their Carmelite hermitage in Lake Elmo, MN.

Holy Hours

Holy hours are the Roman Catholic devotional tradition of spending an hour in Eucharistic Adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. The bishops have created a variety of holy hours that focus our prayer to Jesus Christ on peace, life, vocations, and other topics that are at the heart of the life of the Church and the world.

Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion St. Peter Julian Eymard Priest and Founder († 1868) Feast: August 2

"The Eucharist is the supreme proof of the love of Jesus. After this, there is nothing more but Heaven itself."

Peter Julian Eymard was born on February 4, 1811, in La Mure, France. He grew up in a poor family after the French Revolution, at a time when the Catholic Church was under control by the government. Despite his father's disapproval and illness, Peter entered the seminary and ordained when he was 23.

In 1845, while carrying the Blessed Sacrament in procession on the Feast of Corpus Christi, Father Eymard felt an intense call to Christ in the Eucharist and resolved to "bring all the world to the knowledge and love of our Lord; to preach nothing but Jesus Christ, and Jesus Christ Eucharistic."

This call led Father Eymard to form the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament, an order of priests dedicated to spreading devotion to the Eucharist, in 1856. The men who joined the congregation guarded the Blessed Sacrament 24 hours a day and soon attracted lay persons to do the same. This practice of prayer and devotion before the Blessed Sacrament became known as Eucharistic devotion.

"Love our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Visit him often. Dedicate yourselves entirely to love the Blessed Virgin and to the interior life."

### Do-It-Yourself (DIY) Chemical Abortion

Over half abortions are now committed through the two step chemical abortion pills. The FDA has drastically reduced safety regulations on these abortion pills and access to these pills is becoming easier and easier. CVS, Walgreens, and Rite-Aid have announced that they intend to begin selling the abortion pill at their pharmacies. The chemical abortion is a two step regimen. The first pill, Mifepristone, cuts off oxygen and vital nutrients to the baby. Within 24-48 hours, the baby dies. The second pill. misopostol, forces the baby out of the mother's womb. The mother experiences cramping, contractions and heavy bleeding, that lasts several days and at times, longer. The chemical abortion is potent, always lethal to the baby and, at times, to the mother. Dr. Johnson, an OB/GYN doctor and former abortionist explains in the Liveaction.org "What Is Abortion" video, that usually the mother's death is from an undiagnosed ectopic pregnancy, where the baby never makes it to the uterus, the baby dies, cannot be removed without professional medical care, and the mother slowly bleeds internally. Even though the FDA severely loosened restrictions on DIY chemical abortions, it only approved the abortion pill for the first 10 weeks of pregnancy. But the abortion industry is openly advertising the abortion pill for well past the 10 weeks, thereby, putting women's lives in jeopardy, too. We know the abortion industry doesn't care about the babies. They have fought for years to keep the killing of the babies in the womb legal throughout the entire nine months of pregnancy for any or no reason. But, they have always claimed that they care for women and want the best medical care for them. Is giving women powerful chemicals to ingest into their healthy bodies, good medicine?
