Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The readings today make the point that it's God's wisdom that is the true way. In the first reading from the Book of Sirach, the prophet speaks of keeping God's commandments in order to be saved. Why do so? Because: **"Immense is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power and all seeing."** Then in the second readings from 1 Corinthians, Paul states that it is a mature wisdom coming from God that if known and accepted by the people would have prevented the crucifixion of Jesus. But as it was written written: **"What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him, that God has revealed to us through the Spirit."** And finally, in Matthew's gospel we see Jesus teaching a new wisdom. He is upending what the crowd might have thought. He is making them uncomfortable with new revelations. **"Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."**

This saying of Jesus sounds so authoritative, so important, so wise. Seems Jesus was waiting for the right moment to spring it on the people. As we know, the Law was immensely important to the Jewish people, divinely given and foundational. Jesus wanted to be very clear, so he made this statement, affirming them as the Chosen People, affirming what they had been taught and obeyed for centuries. All their beliefs were valid. But now he wanted them to realize that the Law wasn't an end in itself. It was the groundwork, the preparation for someone who would bring all of it to fulfillment as the fullest expression of God's presence among his people. Jesus is someone who doesn't abolish but fulfills. He will make things better, more than they were before. God always strives to transform things and people into what they were meant to be all along. God always adds to what is, not taking away.

When we think of God's laws we tend to see them in a negative way. **"Do I have to?"** We don't get excited to always do the right, moral thing. We'd rather do the thing that gives us some fleeting pleasure. We think that our way is better or more reasonable. Following God's commandments, his teachings and priorities makes our lives worse.

But Jesus is really saying: **"I have not come to abolish your happiness, but to fulfill it."** Remember the essential truth that everything that comes from God is good for us. That includes the challenging, difficult stuff that requires hard work and perseverance, giving of ourselves in small or large ways. Choosing the right thing does not always make life rosy or pain-free. Quite the opposite, because giving of ourselves always costs something. But if we trust and hope that our lives will be brought to a kind of fulfillment, we will have the dignity and harmony to which we were created.

This Wednesday, February 18th is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season. The bulletin contains the times Blessed Ashes will be distributed. Beginning on Wednesday we will also celebrate a 12:15pm Mass from Monday through Friday during Lent. The Stations of the Cross will also start being prayed this coming Friday, February 20th at 7pm and on each of the Fridays of Lent. On Monday, February 16th there will be a special **Holy Hour** in preparation for entry into Lent on Wednesday. All are invited to come and spend this time with each other and Jesus in prayerful preparation for Ash Wednesday.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from **Parish Social Ministry**, info from **Religious Education** (Faith Formation), especially about the **Valentine's Day Party** on Saturday, February 28th, the Lenten Series on **"Understanding the Mass"** beginning on Wednesday evening, February 25th, the **Come and See Centerfold**, the **Communal Prayer Before Mass** (found on the inside back page), an invitation to join **FORMED** (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great week. **Get ready for the transition into Lent. Smile, share and remember: If God is not enough, nothing will ever be enough.** God bless always. **-Father Chuck**





Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on **Ash Wednesday** and all the **Fridays of Lent**. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**. This means

limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence.

Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** fast and abstinence.

The Holy Season of Lent is an opportunity for all Christians to grow in faith through prayer, fasting and works of charity. St. Raymond Parish offers the following opportunities to assist you on your spiritual journey. Perhaps you can join us for some of these prayer gatherings during the coming weeks. ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE

"Robert J. Lifton, an American psychiatrist, conducting a fascinating psychological study of the Nazi doctors who planned and managed the notorious German death camps. How could German physicians participate in mass murder and preside over killings while they themselves were idealists? They justified themselves in the following ways: They allowed themselves to be seduced by the 'If it's legal, it must be moral' fallacy. They denied that those who were being killed were fully human. They avoided the reality of the horrors around them. They convinced themselves that while what was being done was unpleasant, it was necessary &, for the long run, for the good of mankind. Incredibly, they saw genocide as a health measure. Lifton calls this elaborate lattice of self-deception 'psychic-numbness.' Lifton drew an analogy to the thinking of Hitler's time to those who favor abortion, although he clearly stated that he did not mean to compare the average American pro-abortionist/pro-choicer to Nazi doctors. He stated 'that most have never seen an aborted baby, & do not appreciate the humanity of the unborn. Yet there does seem to be a definite reluctance to learn, a deliberate ignorance. The truth is suspected, but the truth is painful: it cannot be confronted. This in itself is a form of 'psychic-numbness.' It will be very difficult for good people to admit that every day we fail to face the wretched reality of this modern day holocaust, more than 3,000 American children will be put to death - without trial, without appeal for the crime of being unwanted." SUMMARY OF
THE READINGS
FOR THE WEEK

The Gospel for Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time is the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:17–37) in which Jesus teaches that all God's law and the prophets are fulfilled in Him, calling His followers to a righteousness that surpasses mere external observance; "I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."

Monday of this week is the Optional Memorial of Saint Onesimus (Layperson and Disciple), a converted slave remembered for his transformation from a runaway servant to a faithful brother in Christ, exemplifying the power of forgiveness and reconciliation in Christian life. Tuesday of this week is the Optional Memorial of Saint Alexis Falconieri (Religious Lay Founder), who was one of the Seven Founders of the Servite Order. Saturday of this week is the Optional Memorial of Saint Peter Damian (Bishop & Doctor), who honored for his zeal in promoting holiness and integrity within the Church.

Wednesday is the Ash Wednesday which is a obligatory day of fasting and abstinence. It marks the beginning of Lent, calling the entire Church to repentance, fasting, prayer, and almsgiving as we walk with Christ toward Easter.

This week, the First Readings focus on growth in Christian virtue, repentance, the choice of life in fidelity to God, and authentic conversion. Monday and Tuesday draw from the Letter of James, encouraging us to find joy in trials, seek wisdom with steadfast faith, and persevere in doing good as fruits of maturity in Christ; Wednesday's Liturgy on Ash Wednesday calls us to heartfelt repentance with "return to me with all your heart" (Joel 2:12–18), emphasizing genuine conversion as we begin Lent. From Thursday through Saturday, the First Readings

from Deuteronomy and Isaiah present the covenant choice between life and death, and portray true religion as active mercy and justice, urging us to live out mercy with integrity and compassion as we prepare for deeper union with God during this Lenten journey.

The Gospels this week weave together authentic discipleship, that is to rely on God alone, to discern God's presence beyond mere signs, and the cost and gift of following Jesus, that is to embrace the cross with hope and to extend mercy to others.

On Monday (Mark 8:11–13): Jesus, when confronted by the Pharisees seeking a sign, responds with "no sign will be given to this generation," inviting disciples to trust beyond signs and wonders. On Tuesday (Mark 8:14–21), Jesus admonishes the disciples not to be hardened in heart over bread.

On Ash Wednesday (Matthew 6:1–6, 16–18), Jesus teaches genuine piety in almsgiving, prayer, and fasting, "your Father who sees in secret will repay you," emphasizing interior disposition over outward show.

On Thursday (Luke 9:22–25): Jesus announces His suffering and resurrection and calls all who follow Him to "deny himself and take up the cross daily," highlighting self-giving fidelity. On Friday (Matthew 9:14–15): Jesus explains fasting in the context of His presence, pointing to persistent longing and readiness for union with Christ. On Saturday (Luke 5:27–32), Jesus calls Levi the tax collector, inviting him to discipleship and eating with sinners, exemplifying mercy over exclusion.

For the First Sunday of Lent, February 22nd, Jesus is led by the Spirit into the desert where, after forty days of fasting, He resists the devil's temptations by grounding His identity and mission in fidelity to the Father. This Gospel sets the tone for Lent by inviting us to deeper reliance on God's word and trust in His saving will.


My Prayer: Lord, give me courage to follow You even when the path is demanding.
