

# Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's Lenten blessings be yours on the Second Sunday of Lent! The gospel of "The Transfiguration" that we hear proclaimed today is really a call to heed our own transfiguration for that is the only way we will be able to help build the Kingdom of God. The first reading from Genesis expresses what the journey of faith entails; namely listening to the word of God and making an obedient response. Abram was challenged by God to step out of his comfort zone. When doing so and trusting in God, many blessings will come his way. "All the communities of the earth shall find blessing in you." Then in the second reading from 2 Timothy, Paul assures the believers that there is great strength available to help in enduring hardships for the sake of the Gospel. "Beloved: Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." And finally, Matthew's story of "The **Transfiguration**" has as it's purpose to reveal that Jesus is the Son of God. Jesus is divinely changed in the midst of brilliant light and white garments. Moses and Elijah are there plus a divine voice declaring who Jesus is comes from a cloud. Clear instructions are given on what to do (listen) and what to say (nothing). "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

God invited Abram and all of us to go from where we are most comfortable forward into a new way of life. This command of God includes a promise to make us a great nation, not a new government, but a new kingdom of acceptance without excluding anyone. Now this command of God has no blueprint for how it should happen. He basically just says to do it and I will be guiding you on the way. "And you will be the hope of the future." What we have are faith, trust, patience, and the ability to muddle through amid the dark. So where do you feel God is leading you? Just remember that today's gospel is introduced by, "Take up your cross and follow me." None of us are better, smarter, or holier. He chooses us simply because we are and that should be enough to realize that we should do something. We are called to a new way of thinking, to change our ideas about how things should be. If we really listen to the Gospel and Jesus preaching, then we know that our world hardly reflects God's vision. Jesus literally groaned with compassion when he saw injustice. Perhaps, compassion is the one virtue we could all embrace more generously this Lent. Who knows? It might help us all to overcome the vitriol in our airways and human encounters. As Jesus was transfigured on the mountaintop, may our lives be totally changed this Lent into the likeness of Jesus for all to see.

As we enter the Second week of Lent I'd like to call your attention to some great Lenten programming and spiritual resources that can be an inspiration for deepening one's faith at this time. First of all, if you haven't already, please sign up for **FORMED** (it's free) through the parish website. Once you have registered, will have a vast array of videos, audios, documentaries, teachings and movies that will enhance your faith and at this time, your Lenten journey. Don't miss out-sign up today! I promise that your will not be disappointed. Also, I recommend the short YouTube video "The **Veil Removed**" for your viewing. It is a short video but a most powerful one about what happens at each celebration of the Holy Mass. View it once and you will go back to it again and again. And finally, you may have heard of the acclaimed series, "The Chosen" from Angel Studios. There are currently three seasons available for viewing. It is about the life of Jesus as he begins his public ministry, calls the apostles and travels about healing and teaching the good news. Without a doubt this series is top notch for Christian viewers and a most suitable accompaniment for your current Lenten journey or at any time of the year.

All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

# THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS STATIONS 1-7



### THE FIRST STATION-JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DIE

Just as Jesus was wrongfully accused, sometimes people falsely place blame on me to escape the responsibility themselves. And yes, sometimes I also put others down in order to build myself up. When Jesus was condemned to death, even those who had once followed Him went along with Pilate. Do I care more about being accepted by those around me than returning your love? Help me Lord. Be with me Lord.

### THE SECOND STATION-JESUS IS GIVEN HIS CROSS

Lord, help me remember the humble and loving way You carried Your cross up to Calvary when I experience life's heavy burdens and strife. Sometimes I think I can't go on. Help me remember I am not alone. You are always with me. May I imitate Your virtues of love, humility and perseverance while dealing with my crosses and offer them up on behalf of my sins, for the sick and less fortunate. Help me to understand that there is nothing You and I can't get through together.





### THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. Jesus, You fell under the weight of my sins. I fall by accepting temptation and giving into evil. I fall when I give in to gossip or hurt others. You carry my sins to death so I can be free. Help me, Jesus, to really understand all that You have done for me. Help me to make my burden lighter.

### THE FOURTH STATION-JESUS MET HIS MOTHER

I need to have the strength and faith of Mary when I am faced with the loss of a loved one. Lord, while I know death is not an end but really a beginning, please give me the strength of faith that Your mother showed, and help me to be strong for the others who are grieving.





### THE FIFTH STATION-SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS

I need Your help to get me through these tough situations that I encounter during my day. Help me discover my options through prayer. Please help me to be nicer to those who are against me, and let me be trusting in my relationships with my friends, family and neighbors. I have enough to handle on my own. Why, then, am I further burdened with worry about family members or friends? Why does it always seem to be me who has to take on their problems as well as my own? Lord, show me the way.

### THE SIXTH STATION-VERONICA WIPES THE FACE OF JESUS

Every day I see people who are suffering or in need of help. They seem to be everywhere. I wish someone would help them. I'm so busy; I just don's have the time. That isn't really true. I guess I just don't want to be involved. I have my own problems, I don't need to take on any more. O Lord, teach me to see Your face in the faces of those who need comfort. ### THE SEVENTH STATION-JESUS FALLS AGAIN

He knows He must continue in order to save me and lead me on the path to God. He loves me so much that He just keeps on going-for me. ### THE EIGHTH STATION-JESUS MEETS THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM

How difficult I find it sometimes to think of others particularly when I am troubled or hurting. Sometimes I get so wrapped up in myself that I shut others out, and I wonder if I can go on. Lord, You have shown me love and compassion for others even when they scorn You. Please help me to look beyond the exterior of others and help me to show compassion as You did. Please don't let me be selfish. Instead, let me always be merciful in my journey through life.



### THE NINTH STATION-JESUS FALLS THE THIRD TIME

I Sometimes fear the future. I become afraid of change. I am just so unsure of myself, let alone others. I need confidence. I need to know I am not alone. I need to understand that I am worthy of love and respect. Lord, forgive me for each day of my life that I sin against You. Sometimes I have the best intentions, but I turn away from You anyway. Help me to appreciate all you have done for me. Give me strength and wisdom to seek kindness in others and see myself in the image and likeness of God.

### THE TENTH STATION-JESUS IS STRIPPED OF HIS GARMENTS

My possessions are very important to me. I surround myself with beautiful and expensive things. I have far more clothes than I really need, and sometimes I spend money on silly things and forget about others who don't even have necessities. Dear Jesus, you not only sacrificed everything, You laid down Your life for me. Help me to be a strong spiritual follower in faith. Please show me the right way towards eternal happiness by following Your example.





### THE ELEVENTH STATION-JESUS IS NAILED TO THE CROSS

O, my God, sometimes I persecute others because they are different. I am embarrassed when I think of some of the things I've said about others. It's so easy to gossip. Sometimes I just don't like people because of their skin color or religion. Give me the courage to not give in to the pressures of putting others down. Dear Jesus, please forgive me and the others like me, and help me, instead to be Your messenger of love and care to all I meet so that they may experience Your love and concern through me.

### THE TWELFTH STATION-JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS

Jesus, give me the strength so that I can survive the mysteries of life that are ahead of me. I know I'm going to fall many times. Give me the courage to stand back up. Let me recognize all the good things that surround me each day of my life. Our heavenly Father gave all of us a beautiful world. You even died so our sins would be forgiven. May I be like You in Your perfect example of sacrifice and love. Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.





### THE THIRTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS

Lord I am truly sorry for forgetting You. I am sometimes preoccupied by my life when I should be focusing on You. I really don't know why, but I always seem to let all the things in my life crowd you out. Often, when I do pray, I do not concentrate on my prayer. I sometimes just say the words and don't pay attention to what I am saying. Help me to show that You are my first priority by setting aside time for You each day.

### THE FOURTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS LAID IN THE TOMB

Dear Jesus, following Your death, helplessness and despair was felt by many. Your death on the cross left those who really knew You empty inside. Lord, when I am feeling empty inside, help me to attain inner strength and peace to make it through the day. Knowing that You love me and believe in me, gives me the reassurance I need. Help me to face my problems, and to remember that You are with me always until the end of time.





### CHEMICAL ABORTIONS

65% of abortions today are done chemically rather than surgically. This is great financially for the abortionists, as there is less of a need for buildings and staff because the abortion pills are distributed through telemed/mail order. In addition, the cost to the abortion centers to obtain the 2-day pills is \$80. and the charge to the clients is up to \$800. depending on the gestational age of the baby. They described pregnancy in the same category as cancer or pneumonia. That's how exactly the FDA approved the drug combo....Doctors have for years warned the FDA of the dangers these drugs pose to their patients. The FDA has long ignored those warnings....They Never: Studied the safety of the chemical abortion drugs under the labeled conditions of use. They don't even know how safe the drugs are when women use them as directed. They: Ignored the potential impacts of the hormone-blocking action the drugs have on the developing bodies of adolescent girls. They: Disregarded the substantial evidence that chemical abortion drugs cause more complications than even surgical abortions. They: Eliminated necessary safeguards for pregnant girls and women who undergo this dangerous drug regimen. Chemical abortions pose risk of severe side effects including hemorrhaging, the need for follow-up surgery, and even death. Multiple peer-review studies... found that there is a 53% greater risk for an ER visit for chemical abortion complications 4x than that after a surgical abortion. Also, 34% of post-abortive women report an adverse change in themselves, including depression, anxiety, abuse, and thoughts of suicide..." (Gloria Schreiber, CEO The Life Center of L.I.) Whom do you think is better off because of this newest, advanced procedure? The baby? Definitely not the baby -Every abortion, no matter the method, is deadly to the innocent, human life growing in the womb. The girls/women? Isn't this just another assault on a girl's/woman's body and health? The abortion industry? Less expense. more profit.


