Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of the readings for the last Sunday before Lent reminds us that God's word should spur us on to be examples of his peace and goodness. In the first reading from the Book of Leviticus, God instructs Moses to challenge the people of Israel to be holy, just as God is holy. The way this is shown is in how the people treat each other. "You shall love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul warns against boasting about the things of the world. True wisdom comes from knowing that you belong to Jesus. "If anyone among you considers himself wise in this age, let him become a fool, so as to become wise." And finally, Matthew's gospel continues the Sermon on the Mount as Jesus deals with two points: retaliation and love of enemies. Jesus raises the bar of retaliation by eliminating all forms of compensation for wrongdoing. And Jesus moves us further along by declaring the virtue of loving one's enemies. All this may seem impossible but remember: This is real life as it is lived in God's kingdom. "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

It is so hard to be good; much easier to be angry and stay that way. When negativity holds sway over us, we will be eventually consumed by it. But we are called as Christians to live the Gospel way of life which is not an easy task. What can we do with all the voices of distractions that hold us at bay in this world? Well, there is nothing like a random act of kindness to transform a person's day. A smile, a tender touch, a greeting a welcome-all these can go a long way, especially when done at random and not planned. We have all heard today's Gospel message hundreds of times. All the sacraments we receive in our lifetime remind us of our commitment to live lives of peace and forgiveness. When we hear God's message it is always pretty much the same, yet it speaks to us in different ways each time we hear it. We are most surely a stubborn people and set in our ways, but the Gospel is always pointing us to a better way of living.

Alone our efforts are often difficult but together our efforts can come to fruition much more easily. That's why we are a worshipping community. The Eucharist, the Sacraments, God's Word are never static or frozen in time. They are always alive and full of God's grace. Maybe today you hear his word a bit differently than in the past. God's message is always changing as we move through life. Remember the Holy Spirit is constantly working so that God's grace can grow, change, and inspire our lives. Take some time to examine your conscience. Jesus knows you and loves you, encouraging you to embrace what is good. No, living in the light of the Gospel is not an easy thing, but sacred things are always well worth the challenge.

This Wednesday, February 22nd, we begin the Holy Season of Lent with the observance of Ash Wednesday. Blessed Ashes will be distributed at the following times: 7:15am Mass, 8:45am Mass, 12:15pm Mass, the 4pm Prayer Service and 7:30pm Mass. Beginning that day there will also be a 12:15pm Mass Monday through Friday throughout the Lenten season. And the Stations of The Cross will be prayed each Friday evening at 7pm in the church. In addition, there will be other special Lenten prayer gatherings offered throughout the season. Check the Lenten page in the bulletin for more detailed information each week.

All donations for the *Midnight Run for the Homeless* should be left in the altar server sacristy area no later than this Sunday, February 19th. Our seminarian, Patrick McCormack will be picking up all the donations on Monday. So, remember, all donations no later than this Sunday. Thanks for your generosity in helping the homeless nearby receive some much-needed clothing.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. 
Abstinence & Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM 8th MONTH GROWING BABY IN UTERO

We've only one month to go! At this time, your spiritually adopted baby is about 16" - 20" long and weighs between 4 - 9 pounds. A layer of fat is produced and stored beneath the baby's skin, both for insulation and as a food supply. Antibodies that give immunity to diseases are building up. A gallon, per day, of amniotic fluid is absorbed by the baby and the fluid is totally replaced every three hours. Your spiritually adopted baby's heart pumps three hundred gallons of blood per day, and the placenta begins to age. The center of the baby's bones are still hardening, but the bones in the head are soft and flexible for delivery. When ready to be born, your baby will move downward, with his or her head low against the birth canal. The baby is completely formed, just growing in size and length. Even though your baby could survive outside the womb at this point without much medical help, it is still legal in New York, and other states, to have the baby killed through abortion for any or no reason. (Minnesota is the latest state that just legalized the killing of the babies through abortion up to the time of the baby's birth.) Please continue praying for your little one, that his or her parents will choose life and bring their baby to birth.

Each Thursday during Adoration from 3 pm - 4 pm, we pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and the Rosary of Our Lady for the specific intention of an end to abortion and the return to the respect, dignity and protection of all God's children from conception until natural death. Please join with us in prayer; the power of prayer is great!




