

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of today's readings is that no matter how much or how little we have, God calls us to give him our entire lives. In the first reading from 1 Kings, the prophet Elijah is trying to teach the people that the God of Israel is the very source of life. When Elijah tells the poor widow to set aside her fears and trust in the word of God, she responds with complete faith. She trusts that there will be enough food to feed her and her son, even after first feeding Elijah. **"She was able to eat for a year, and he and her son as well; the jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, as the Lord had foretold through Elijah."** Then in the second reading from Hebrews, the one sacrifice of Jesus has taken away sin and he will come a second time to bring salvation to all who eagerly await him. **"But now once for all he has appeared at the end of the ages to take away sin by his sacrifice."** And finally, Mark's gospel offers a contrast between some extravagant scribes and a poor widow. These scribes in today's gospel were corrupt ones. They focused only on themselves, their honor, glory, and sense of self-importance. They prey on widows by cheating them out of their estates when they acted as trustees. When Jesus sees that she has put in a few coins, he remarks that her small offering was worth more than all the amounts put in by the rich. Why? Because they gave from their surplus while the widow gave from what she truly needed to survive. **"Amen I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury"**

God calls us to give meaningful and mindful giving. We are called to give more than what is extra, to give more than our surplus. Giving until it hurts in the name of Jesus helps us to identify with those who suffer and gives us spiritual strength to face our own trials. Sometimes God asks more of us than we think we can give. If we are called in this way and we give in to it, God will replenish us in unforeseen ways. There are many ways to give ourselves and give of ourselves. Sometimes the giving is even one's life. And giving isn't only for widows and saints or martyrs. Saints are ordinary people who grew in faith and widows are ordinary spouses who find themselves on the margins. What's interesting is that Jesus does not discount the rich who gave a lot. He simply points out that the widow gave much more. Remember too that it isn't necessarily all or

Giving when it hurts should not come from guilt and we are not called to be destitute. Just remember that Jesus is harsh towards those who give for show. Sometimes a small gift can be priceless. Most of all know that God appreciates all that we do give. Sometimes we give more than at other times. After all we are human beings and God loves us in our humanity as human beings.

The month of November signals to us that the year will be ending before you know it. Parish life is picking up with more people becoming engaged in the various ministries and activities that give life to our parish mission. The Sacrament of Confirmation was celebrated these past weekends for our 9th graders. Religious Education is off and running for our children in grades 1-8. Generous volunteers have stepped forward as catechists helping our children learn and grow in their faith and relationship with Jesus. While we haven't been able to resume full instruction for Baptism Prep and Pre Cana, parents and couple are still being helped and baptisms and marriages are regularly being celebrated. The Folk Group is back at 12noon Mass, CYO has its program in full swing, the Consolation and Bereavement ministries are in action and the Sodality of Our Lady resumes its Holiday Fair next Saturday, November 13th. So, things are happening and hopefully, by being smart and safe more will happen to enhance our parish life as we move forward.

Remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave church today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from **Parish Social Ministry**, info from **Religious Education**, an ad for the **Christmas Fair** sponsored by the Sodality of Our Lady which will be held next Saturday, November 13th in the school cafeteria, ads for the upcoming **Christmas Plant Sale** and the **Christmas Cash 50/50** raffle, both which will take place on Gaudete Sunday, December 12th, the **Litany of St. Joseph** and other prayers, an invitation to join **FORMED** (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

She left to get it, and he called out after her, "Please bring along a bit of bread." She answered, "As the LORD, your God, lives, I have nothing baked; there is only a handful of flour in my jar and a little oil in my jug. Just now I was collecting a couple of sticks, to go in and prepare something for myself and my son; when we have eaten it, we shall die." Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid. Go and do as you propose. But first make me a little cake and bring it to me. Then you can prepare something for yourself and your son. SPECIAL ONE YEAR MEMORIAL CANDLE

As you know, several years ago we have upgraded our devotional candles by both the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph. The older ones were outdated and ready to break down. In addition we have added four new statues in the rear of the church with smaller new candle stands. They are Mother Teresa, St. Therese of the Little Flower, St. Anthony and St. Jude.
