## Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Easter blessings be yours on the Fourth Sunday of Easter! Today's message is to hear the voice of Jesus as the Good Shepherd who is familiar, authentic, distinctive, and reassuring. In the first reading from Acts, Peter hits his fellow Jews hard by adamantly proclaiming that Jesus, whom they crucified, was the promised Messiah. Feeling remorse, they asked what they could do so they could still be connected to Jesus. Peter told them that they could be united with Jesus by baptism and repentance of sins. "Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand persons were added that day." Then in the second reading from 1 Peter, we see the image of the Good Shepherd attributed to Jesus who will always protect those who return after going astray. Peter is clear that patient endurance of suffering is a key element for a relationship with Jesus. "Beloved: If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good, this is a grace before God." And finally, John's gospel presents Jesus as the gateway for all the sheep to enter through. He knows the sheep and goes ahead of them. They will recognize him and so trustingly follow. And that is the way for life in abundance. "I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture."

In a sense, today's gospel is all about "voice" recognition" authentication and security. Jesus draws a sharp distinction between himself and the Pharisees. He is a "good shepherd" not a "hired hand" who has no genuine concern for the flock. Jesus insists that the sheep will follow the true shepherd because they "recognize his voice." The sheep in Jesus' time were kept in a common enclosure and by repeated listening, the sheep would become familiar with the voice of their shepherd and thus be able to distinguish it from others. It is through the Gospel texts that we become accustomed to the voice of Jesus, our Good Shepherd. There are so many voices reaching our ears each day, all trying to gain our attention by claiming some kind of authority. The question of authenticity is also clouded by those who label "fake news" any information they don't like. Jesus speaks distinctly and authoritatively because he is the "Good Shepherd," not simply one among many.

The tech world uses the term "gatekeeper" to describe software that detects intrusive malware and keeps it out of systems and computers. In Jesus' day a good shepherd blocked the gate to keep out thieves from disturbing the sheep. In a sense the shepherd was not just the gatekeeper but also the gate. Jesus identifies himself as the "Good **Shepherd,**" the gatekeeper, and the gate. Our safety and salvation rest in him alone. Now while we identify as the sheep in the scriptures, we are also often asked to be shepherds. Not only bishops and pastors are called to this task. Parents, grandparents, teachers, counselors, medical personnel, and other caregivers and all those who serve and protect, are entrusted with the charge to be good shepherds.

As we enter the month of May which is a month dedicated to the Blessed Mother, it is a good time to turn to Our Lady and ask her to intercede for our needs, both personally and communally. To me praying the Rosary each day of May is a great way to have Mary steer you to meditation on the important mysteries of our faith. As we used to write on our papers during one of my grammar school years, "All for Jesus through Mary" sums up the direction our lives should be taking. So, find that time and space and pray the Rosary each day. I promise you that it will enhance even more your journey through Eastertide.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an invitation to Jukebox "Cinco de Mayo" Bingo on Friday evening, May 5th, a request for Parishioner Emails to help foster communication from the rectory, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand), the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back cover), and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have great first week of May. *Keep your Easter smile shining. And remember: Time flies, whether or not you're having fun.* Pray the Rosary! God bless always. *-Father Chuck*






