

## Father Chuck's Corner

**Greetings and God's blessings be yours on this great Feast of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Jesus). And of course, Happy Father's Day to all our Dads.** Thanks for all you do to for us and our family. You are the special role models to us, your daughters, and sons. Today's Feast of Corpus Christi began to be observed in what is now Belgium in 1246. It was extended to the universal Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264 in order to strengthen belief about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Now this belief is one that the Church in 2022 is trying to also strengthen throughout our country. The first reading from Genesis shows the priest known as Melchizedek using bread and wine to offer as a sacrifice of thanksgiving. This is in the time of Abraham, our Father in Faith. **"Blessed be Abram by God Most High, the creator of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who delivered your foes into your hand."** Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul affirms the tradition that Jesus took bread on the night he was arrested and declared it to be his Body and likewise the cup of wine as his Blood. He told them about the importance of remembrance and what following this action of Jesus meant. **"For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes."** And finally, Luke's gospel is the account of the only miracle that appears in all four gospels, namely when Jesus fed 5000 people with five loaves of bread and two fish. Nothing is explained as to how Jesus did this only that all the people were satisfied. The Eucharistic overtones running throughout this narrative are loud and clear. Miraculously feeding the hungry by prayerful invocation, an abundance of food and the presence of the Kingdom of God are intrinsic to this event. The culmination says it all. **"They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets."**

Beginning today, the Catholic Church in the United States is starting a three-year effort to highlight and affirm the importance of the Real Presence of Jesus in Holy Communion. Basic to this effort is to get everybody on the same page about what Holy Communion is and is not. It is not simply bread and wine. Through the prayer of consecration, a **"transubstantiation"** occurs which believes that the substance of ordinary bread and wine has been replaced by the substance of the essence of Jesus' Body and Blood. Nothing changes as far as size, taste, smell, color and so on goes. **But the bread and wine are truly now the Body and Blood of Jesus!**

This is a non-negotiable aspect of our Catholic faith. When one receives, he or she is receiving the real Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. That is why reverence to the Eucharist is so important and that our **"Amen"** upon receiving should reflect the transformation that will affect everyone's life who receives. Watch the short video **"The Veil Removed"** on YouTube today! It says it all!

So how should we celebrate this Feast of Corpus Christi in 2022? We should continue to show reverence and to allow the Eucharist to have its full effect in our lives as individuals and as members of a faith community. It should affect how we address the common good of all society. It should influence how we think about all kinds of issues from healthcare to housing to immigration and so forth. Too often we dismiss such issues as merely political. Remember that when we say our **"Amen"** the moment before receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus we are not only affirming our belief about the substance of the consecrated host but also our willingness to recognize the individual and communal blind spots with which we may have become too comfortable. The Eucharist gives us the strength 24/7 to become what we receive, another Christ.

**Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today.** It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from **Parish Social Ministry**, info from **Religious Education**, the **Parish Synod Survey** for all parishioners to fill out and return, the statement from the New York State Bishops entitled: **"Toward a Pro-Life Future in the Empire State,"** a call for the last chance to purchase tickets for the **"Go for the Green 50/50"** (drawing today June 19th at 2pm), a request for **Parishioner Emails** to foster better communication from the rectory, an invitation to join **FORMED** (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.





## ST. JOSEPH IS PATRON SAINT OF FATHER'S DAY

*"If a person cannot find anyone to teach him how to pray, let him take this glorious saint for his guide, and he will not lose his way."* — St. Teresa of Avila referring to St. Joseph. 



## Toward a Pro-Life Future in the Empire State A statement by the Catholic Bishops of New York State

Humanity's salvation history was forever changed when a poor, devout Jewish girl from Galilee affirmatively said yes to life and set in motion the birth, ministry, sacrificial death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Mary's fiat ("Thy will be done.") was a gift of love to humanity, given freely in spite of her inability to know all that would entail, but with more faith in the Lord than fear of the unknown. In this month of Mary, we have an opportunity to reflect on her example, even as Americans grapple with gathering societal unrest over the issue of abortion.

***Any women—regardless of age, religious belief or affiliation, marital status or immigration status – who is pregnant and in need, can come to the Catholic Church and we will give you the services and supports you need to carry your baby to term, regardless of your ability to pay."***

Since the 1973 U.S. Supreme Court decision in *Roe v. Wade* effectively opened the door to abortion on demand throughout the land, an estimated 63 million unborn babies across the country have been killed in the womb before they could even draw their first breath of air. As we await a decision on *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, the recently argued Supreme Court case that could potentially overturn *Roe*, we pray for a positive outcome even as we acknowledge that abortion in New York would continue unfettered, and even be actively promoted as a social good by many elected officials. Sadly, New York, which legalized abortion three years before the *Roe* decision, has long been the abortion capital of the country, a tragic and sobering distinction. Through the years, advocates for legal abortion have skillfully framed the narrative as one of "choice," and "reproductive freedom," completely ignoring the biological reality of what abortion is: the intentional killing of an innocent child in the womb. Even as sonogram technology and advances in neonatal medicine clearly show us the truth that what is being "terminated" is a human life, the pro-abortion movement refuses to address the science. The

abortion industry has been so successful in its messaging that the right to abortion has become inextricably linked to the notion of women's rights and equality for a significant portion of the country, which is why the prospect of a nation without *Roe* has led to fear and anxiety for many people. Millions of our fellow Americans – even, it must be said, many of our fellow Catholics – have succumbed to this false notion, and we must respond to it in charity and with sensitivity, but with clarity. The fears and anxieties of a young woman faced with an unplanned pregnancy are valid. She is likely terrified. She may be overwhelmed with a plethora of legitimate questions: How will she provide for her other children with another baby on the way? Will the father abandon her? Will she be able to continue her education? Where will she and her family live? Who will provide childcare when she goes back to work? For many, abortion seems the only way out. These feelings are real, and the challenges of an unplanned pregnancy are difficult. This presents a pastoral challenge for bishops, clergy, Church leaders and, indeed, for all faithful Catholics. Often, the Catholic Church is unjustly accused of being more concerned with the baby in the womb than with the mother and child once the infant has been born. As false as this notion is, it is incumbent upon us as shepherds to acknowledge and address that misperception. As far back as the 1980s, the late John Cardinal O'Connor, a giant of the pro-life movement, made a pledge that we reaffirm today: Any woman – regardless of age, religious belief or affiliation, marital status or immigration status – who is pregnant and in need, can come to the Catholic Church and we will give you the services and supports you need to carry your baby to term, regardless of your ability to pay. Furthermore, we will not abandon you and your baby after delivery, but, rather, we will see to it that you have the resources that you and your child both need and deserve. No one will be turned away from life-affirming care. If you have had an abortion that you regret, whether recently or in the distant past, please come to us as well, so that we may offer you services to help you to heal. We ask every Catholic parish, every Catholic Charities program, every Catholic

health facility, every Catholic school, every Catholic college and university, and every religious community in our state to proactively engage with us in this pastoral effort. Together, through the New York State Catholic Conference, we have gathered a list of many of the available resources at [www.nyscatholic.org/HelpForMoms](http://www.nyscatholic.org/HelpForMoms). You can also find a map to all Catholic parishes, schools and Catholic Charities agencies in the state at [www.nyscatholic.org/places](http://www.nyscatholic.org/places). But our state and local governments must do their part as well. Elected officials constantly fall over themselves in rushing to announce new initiatives to ever expand abortion in order to garner votes. New York has long been one of the few states to require taxpayers to fund abortion through Medicaid. Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers have access to endless state funding streams. Perhaps the most egregious piece of abortion expansion legislation anywhere was the 2019 Reproductive Health Act. Championed by our previous governor, this act legalizes abortion on demand through nine months of pregnancy, declares abortion to be a fundamental right, allows non-physicians to perform abortions, and even removes criminal penalties for forced or coerced abortions. This year, our current governor codified a provision in the state budget requiring all health insurance plans to cover abortion, with virtually no exemptions for religious employers. Most recently, significant taxpayer funds were redirected to increase abortions in New York State.





Meanwhile, programs to support women who make the choice to keep their babies, to the extent that they exist at all, are starved for funding and are not well promoted. Yet many political leaders typically cater more to abortion providers and advocates than to women who might well make a different choice, if only they were aware of and had other options.

We understand full well that no Supreme Court decision will reduce the availability of abortion in New York. With that reality as a backdrop, state government has nothing to lose and everything to gain by working toward reducing the rate of abortion. There is common ground to be found, even in a state like New York. The recent state budget provision dramatically expanding postpartum Medicaid eligibility is proof of this. But why not work together to do more?

- We envision a New York where post-abortive women who are suffering emotionally are given the services they need to heal, and the acknowledgment that their pain is real.
- We envision a New York where religious organizations can provide needed services to pregnant women and moms while remaining true to the tenets of their faith.

All of these goals can come to pass, even in a state like New York. Let us not put our trust in mere judges, legislators, governors, or presidents. Rather, let us put our faith in God, for whom nothing is impossible. Politicians can change policies and laws, but only God can convert hearts and minds.

So, in this month of Mary, mother of Jesus and mother of us all, let us pray through her intercession for an end to abortion in our lifetime and let us work toward making New York a state where even if abortion is not illegal, it will one day be unthinkable.

This week-end we will begin our annual Spiritual Adoption Prayer Program. Before his death, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen was told by Our Lord that those who pray "The Prayer for Life" each day for nine consecutive months for a baby in danger of being aborted, would intercede for that baby, and his or her life would be spared. Since the infamous Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton Decisions of 1973, over 63 MILLION babies have been brutally killed through abortion. And now that we are awaiting the Supreme Court Decision on the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health case. many state legislatures, fearing that the Court may overturn the Roe v. Wade Decision, have pushed bills that will ensure that access to abortion will not be hindered and, in many cases, are more extreme than Roe v. Wade, by including abortion-on-demand for any reason up to and including the time right before the baby's birth, non-physicians doing this surgery, tax payer funding of abortion and no religious exemption for those medical personnel or hospitals who do not want to participate in abortions. At a time like this, we need much prayer and fasting in order to turn our country from the ever growing "Culture of Death" to a "Culture of Life". The Spiritual Adoption Program is a very simple but powerful prayer. If you wish to join us, please sign one of the pledge cards located in the pews, detach it, place it in one of the plastic boxes located at each of the Church's vestibules, and keep the other half of the card which has the "Prayer for Life" for yourself to pray for the next nine months. The signed pledge cards will be placed on St. Joseph's altar for the entire nine months. Won't you please join with us and be an intercessor for your spiritually adopted baby whose life is in danger of being killed through abortion?
