Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on **Trinity Sunday!** We resume Ordinary Time Sundays with this great feast about God. The purpose of today's readings is to have us approach the Most Holy Trinity as our mystery and also our identity. We should never create God in our own image and likeness. The first reading from Exodus is the account of Moses encountering God on Mount Sinai. Moses is privileged to not only see God passing by in a cloud but also to hear attributes associated with the divine name. "Thus, the Lord passed by him and cried out, 'The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." Then in the second reading from 2 Corinthians, Paul pleads with the community to encourage one another and to live in peace. He then calls on the Holy Spirit in a blessing for the community. "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." And finally, John's gospel points out that belief in Jesus places one at the core of the Blessed Trinity which is basic to almost all Christian denominations. The doctrine of the Blessed Trinity was proclaimed at the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD and though the word Trinity is not found in the scriptures, the elements that eventually became the foundation blocks of this doctrine are found in the Gospels and the letters of Paul. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but have eternal life."

It is said that a God that can be so easily explained is not really worth worshipping. That said, I would say we have the right God. How do you explain the unexplainable? There are a lot of attempts to explain the Trinity, but they all are just flirting with the mystery. The reading from Exodus espouses the essence of God as merciful, gracious, slow to anger and rich in fidelity. We believe that God has created us in his own image and likeness. The problem is that too often we have returned the favor. For some the only trinity they worship is "Me, Myself, and I." Pope Francis tells us that: "The self needs to be in a horizontal relationship with each other and a vertical one with God. That way our lives become Trinitarian, like that of God." We praise God as a community of persons. And all Christian prayer is Trinitarian. Communion with the Most Holy Trinity should be the goal of all Christian worship. And likewise, all Christina worship is mystery. Always pray: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen"

Last Sunday, on the Feast of Pentecost, our parish celebrated the birthday of the Church by showcasing the various parish ministries with banners hung in the church and with ministry information material in the school cafeteria during hospitality after the morning Masses. In addition, our new Ministry Guide Booklet was made available at that time. Copies can always be gotten at the rectory and will be a part of each parish registration packet going forward. A special privilege for me this Pentecost was to confer the Sacrament of Confir*mation* on 10 of our adult parishioners at the 5pm Mass on Saturday. Hopefully the Holy Spirit will encourage their fuller participation in the life of the Church right here at St. Raymond Parish. I also hope the same for all of us!

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an ad for the upcoming *Night of Comedy* sponsored by the Knights of Columbus next Saturday, June 10th, an invitation to the next Fatima Prayer Vigil on Monday evening, June 12th, a request for *Parish*ioner Emails (to foster better communication from the rectory), the *Communal Prayer Before Mass* (on the inside back cover of the bulletin), an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great first week of June. Smile, share and remember to pray: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen God bless always.

ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE




