### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Easter blessings be yours on the Third Sunday of Easter. Today we are invited to reflect on a tenet from the Creed that we pray at Mass. It is when we proclaim that we "look forward to the resurrection of the **dead.**" In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter reminds the people that Jesus was put to death and then raised by God. He and the other apostles are witnesses to this. "The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnessed." Then in the second reading from 1 John, Jesus is proclaimed to be the righteous one who died for our sins. And to know him is to keep his commands. "But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him." And finally, in Luke's gospel we have a further resurrection appearance of Jesus to his disciples. Even when they keep seeing him, they are still astonished and frightened. This time he eats with them and then explains how he was the fulfillment of the scriptures starting with Moses. "Thus, it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in the name of the nations, beginning from Jerusalem."

Try to imagine what you would have done if privileged enough to see the risen Jesus. What would you do? What would you say or think? How would you feel? I'm not sure how I would have reacted in such a situation. I would probably be shocked, but then what, who knows? But you know what the bigger question is, one that has bigger consequences for your life in this time and place. The more important question is if you were to encounter the risen Jesus, would you even notice? Now you might think this a silly question. Of course, you would recognize Jesus if he was right in front of you. But this sort of thing was being played out in today's gospel. On the road to Emmaus, two disciples were with a man they didn't know, or so they thought. Only after a heartfelt conversation and a meal together do they realize they were walking with Jesus all day long. Then even when Jesus comes again to them and more of the disciples, they still are not sure what they are seeing. Jesus has to calm their fears and show them his hands and feet. Basically, he has to tell them: "Hey, it's really me!"

I would say that Jesus is coming to us today in ways we don't expect. He comes on his terms, not ours. He wants to have an encounter with us, not once in a while, but over and over again.

He is saying to us: "It's really me," through a man asking for a handout, through a teenage son or daughter coming in tears to reveal an unexpected pregnancy, through the personality of someone you don't like at all, or through a relative you struggle to forgive, or a parent who let you down, or a boss you can never please or a political party you oppose, or any group you look upon with suspicion or hatred. "It's really me." And Jesus also comes to you in the difficult times, through your sorrows and every experience that aggravates you and makes you angry. And most of all, Jesus is even with you when you turn your back on him and sin. That's the kind of God we have. So, I ask again, "If you encountered the risen Jesus, would you even notice him?

As I mentioned in last week's bulletin Father Theo Iloh will be leaving St. Raymond Parish at the end of April and returning to his home diocese in Nigeria. His bishop is calling him to take up a position as both a seminary and college professor. We will all miss Father Theo and I know you join me in wishing him all the best in his next priestly assignment. Father Theo will celebrate his last parish Mass at St. Raymond's at 12noon on Sunday, April 28th. There will be a parish reception immediately following in the school cafeteria. All are most welcome to come and express your personal best wishes to Father Theo at both the Mass and reception.



# The Parts of the Liturgy of the Eucharist

As we continue our journey through the Mass, we come to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Growing up as an altar server, the preparation for the Liturgy of the Eucharist was always one of the most action-packed moments of the Mass. There are several things to bring to the altar and an order to how they should arrive. As we have noted, every part of the Mass has a background and a significant meaning, even some of the quick (and sometimes quiet) gestures in this part of the Mass. There are special cloths, shiny chalices, candles, bread, wine, and water, among many other things. All of them will serve a purpose, and with the words of Christ, the bread and wine will become Christ himself—his true Body and Blood—his true presence with

# What is the Liturgy of the Eucharist?

As the General Instruction for the Roman Missal teaches, "At the Last Supper Christ instituted the Paschal Sacrifice and banquet, by which the Sacrifice of the Cross is continuously made present in the Church whenever the Priest, representing Christ the Lord, carries out what the Lord himself did and handed over to his disciples to be done in his memory. For Christ took the bread and the chalice and gave thanks, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take, eat, and drink: this is my Body; this is the chalice of my Blood. Do this in memory of me.' Hence, the Church has arranged the entire celebration of the Liturgy of the Eucharist in parts corresponding to precisely these words and actions of Christ, namely:

At the Preparation of the Gifts, the bread and the wine with water are brought to the altar—the same elements, that is to say, which Christ took into his hands.In the Eucharistic Prayer, thanks is given to God for the whole work of salvation, and the offerings become the Body and Blood of Christ. Through the fraction and through Communion, the faithful, though many, receive from the one bread the Lord's Body and from the one chalice the Lord's Blood in the same way the Apostles received them from the hands of Christ himself" (GIRM, 72).



### The Parts of the Liturgy of the Eucharist

For an in-depth summary of the parts of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we turn to the Catholic Encyclopedia: "The Liturgy of the Eucharist, the essential part of the sacrifice, includes: the preparation of the altar; the preparation of the gifts: bread, wine, and water are brought to the altar ([and in many places] the money offerings or offerings for the poor), [typically] the offertory song is sung during this preparation; the priest washes his hands; an invitation to prayer is prayed by the priest. There follows the Eucharistic prayer, which is a prayer of thanksgiving and sanctification and the center of the Eucharistic celebration. It contains: the preface, expressing thanksgiving in the name of the entire people of God; the acclamation or sanctus (holy, holy, holy), which is recited by the priest and people or sung, the Eucharistic prayer; the invocations for the Church, the epiclesis; narration of the institution and consecration of the bread and wine in the words of Christ; the fulfillment of the command given by Christ to the Church to carry on this mystery of the sacrifice, called the anamnesis; the offering of the victim to God the Father in the Holy Spirit; the intercessions for the living and the dead and for the faithful present; the final doxology, and concluding Amen" (Catholic Encyclopedia, Thomas Nelson Inc., Nashville, 1976, p. 197). Now that is a table of contents! Although this listing may seem complex, we'll be taking each section one at a time, breaking it down so we can understand the importance of each part in the Mass and its importance for us. As we journey through the parts of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, remind yourself that these pieces all serve a grand purpose: our pathway to the true presence of Christ on the altar at Mass!

### For Reflection:

· Consider beginning this journey by reflecting on each of the New Testament accounts of the institution of the Eucharist: 1 Cor. 11:24, Mt. 26:26–30, Lk 22:24–30, Jn 13:1– 15, Mk 14:22–26. You could reflect on one passage each day during the week in preparation for participation at Mass on Sunday.

## Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Word-Among Us

Have you ever taken a difficult class and struggled to understand the subject? Maybe you had to get extra help from the teacher after class.

Perhaps the teacher had to explain a hard concept more than once or find different ways to present it before understanding finally dawned on you.

Jesus is like that patient and sympathetic teacher. Today's Gospel reading shows how his disciples needed extra help to understand his resurrection. Jesus didn't expect them to get it right away, so he found more than one way to get his message across.

First, two angels appeared at Jesus' empty tomb to announce that he had been raised from the dead. But when the other disciples heard the story, it seemed so farfetched that they didn't believe it (Luke 24:1-11).

Then Jesus appeared to two disciples on the road to Emmaus and spoke with them. He even taught them about the words in Scripture that point to his resurrection. And still these disciples didn't recognize Jesus right away (Luke 24:13-34)!

That brings us to today's story, when Jesus appears suddenly in the disciples' midst. They are terrified! He immediately reassures them and even eats a piece of fish to show them that he is flesh and blood, not a ghost. He then opens their minds "to understand the Scriptures" so they can see that he has fulfilled all of God's promises (Luke 24:45). Suddenly things are making sense.

We will never fully know or understand Jesus during our time on earth. But that doesn't mean he wants to keep us in the dark. It may take time to grasp his love for you. You may need lots of nudges from his Spirit to get you going in the right direction. And that's okay. Like any good teacher, Jesus builds on your understanding one step at a time. He may reach you through a homily or a Bible passage that speaks to a problem you're having. Or maybe it's through a relative or friend whose faith inspires you. He will always find ways to draw you closer so that you can enjoy a life of deeper joy and friendship with him.

# Eucharistic Witness Venerable Archbishop Fulton John Sheen (†1979)

An argument can be made that the most well-known and recognized Catholic priest in the United States in the middle of the last century was the Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen. His television series, Life is Worth Living, reached an estimated viewing audience of 30 million people each week. This priest of the Diocese of Peoria influenced countless men and women of his generation. What can we learn from his Eucharistic witness?

#### Made for Love:

Fulton Sheen recognized that human life is essentially relational. This is another way of saying that we were made for love—made to love God and love one another. Grace enables one to grow in this regard, and as we see in the lives of so many saintly people, it is their frequent contact with Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist—participation in Mass, receiving him in Holy Communion, and adoring him in the reserved Blessed Sacrament—that makes them who they are. Jesus, the source of all holiness and grace, stretches their hearts and increases their capacity to love.

### Belief Intensifies Love:

Fulton Sheen loved the Holy Eucharist because he believed in Our Lord's words when he spoke about the Bread of Life (Jn 6:22–59), and his belief, in turn, deepened his understanding of this great mystery. As his understanding increased, so too did his love. When it comes to the people in our life, including Our Lord, the belief we have in them and our understanding of them are related to one another. Fulton Sheen's belief in the Holy Eucharist deepened his understanding of Our Lord, which in turn intensified his love.

### Feeding and Being Fed by Love:

Relationships must continually be fed, or they will die, and this is true in our relationship with Our Lord. We feed the relationship, and we are fed by it. When Fulton Sheen was ordained a priest, he made the commitment to pray a holy hour every day before the Blessed Sacrament, and he kept his promise.




