Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time as we enter the month of November! This Sunday we are being challenged to courageously lead Christian lives that help spread the Gospel message. While there are risks to living our faith, our joy will be complete when Jesus comes again. The first reading from 2 Maccabees shows us a troubling time for God's people. It had become hard for many of the people of Israel to remain faithful to the Mosaic law. Today's story tells of seven brothers who refused to violate the law and so were put to death one after the other. Throughout their ordeal they proclaim that they will enjoy eternal life in the presence of God. One brother at the moment of death sums up their collective feelings. "It is my choice to die at the hands of men with the hope God gives of being raised up by him, but for you, there will be no resurrection to life." Then in the second reading from 2 Thessalonians, Paul prays that God will give the strength and grace needed to remain faithful servants in word and deed. "May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ." And finally, Luke's gospel presents a scene where a group of Sadducees are trying to embarrass Jesus regarding the resurrection of the dead. Remember that the Sadducees denied the resurrection of the dead and adhered strictly only to the written law of the Torah. They concoct a fanciful "what if" about seven brothers dying without children and having the same wife in succession. Jesus' response zeroes in on the fact that marriage and all it involves takes place during life on earth. But in the coming age, the afterlife, all bets are off. There is no marriage and no dying in heaven. Things related to the here and now do not apply in the afterlife. "They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise."

The use of the number 7 in both the Old Testament reading and the gospel is given because 7 is the biblical number for perfection. The seven perfect brothers in Maccabees keep the faith while the Sadducees use 7 also to twist a family obligation into a scandal. Jesus teaches that we should strive for perfection while at the same time knowing full well that we will not achieve it. How we treat others reflects what we think of ourselves and our relationship with God. Living the gospel challenges complacency. If we live confident in the Holy Spirit moving us, how confident are we in the Spirit's inspiration so as to take action?

We must remember that we are made for heaven. It is our destination, but the Holy Spirit calls us to action here and now. We need to see Jesus in others and do the work of loving others. Love is an action. We are called to get up, jump in and be the hands and feet of Jesus. That room in heaven awaits us, and Jesus is the way to get there. We should always be asking whether our current way of life is following Jesus and if it is pleasing to him.

At this time, I am announcing another new and exciting fund-raiser for the holiday season. *It is* called Countdown to Christmas. This will replace our usual Christmas Cash raffle that we have had for the past 12 years. This raffle will start on Thanksgiving Day and conclude on Christmas Day. There will be 32 individual cash prizes totaling over \$5000. There is a calendar page along with an instruction page explaining how *Countdown to* Christmas works. You may have already received this information in either the regular envelope mailing for November/December or in a general parish wide mailing that has also been sent. So, check the Countdown to Christmas centerfold pages and make sure you get your tickets in by the day before Thanksgiving, so you won't miss any of the daily drawings.

Also, in keeping with upcoming festive time, we will once again have our *Christmas Plant Sale*. There is an order form in the bulletin that shows you what we have to offer. The Christmas Plants will be picked up on Sunday, December 11th at our Gaudete Sunday celebration during hospitality in the school cafeteria. Because of the supply and demand we need all orders by Sunday, November 27th. Payment is due at pick-up on the 11th, not before.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Besides the aforementioned, there is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, an invitation to the Christmas Fair, sponsored by the Sodality of Our Lady next Saturday, November 12th, an order form for the I.H.M. Silver Circle raffle, and invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

FIRST READING 2 Mc 7:1-2, 9-14

It happened that seven brothers with their mother were arrested and tortured with whips and scourges by the king, to force them to eat pork in violation of God's law. One of the brothers, speaking for the others, said: "What do you expect to achieve by questioning us? We are ready to die rather than transgress the laws of our ancestors." At the point of death he said: "You accursed fiend, you are depriving us of this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up to live again forever. It is for his laws that we are dying." After him the third suffered their cruel sport. He put out his tongue at once when told to do so, and bravely held out his hands, as he spoke these noble words: "It was from Heaven that I received these: for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again." Even the king and his attendants marveled at the young man's courage, because he regarded his sufferings as nothing. After he had died, they tortured and maltreated the fourth brother in the same way.
