Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! This is the first weekend in the month of July. I hope everyone can enjoys this Independence Day weekend within the guidelines of sensible socializing. The attendance at Mass has increased a little bit each Sunday which is very gratifying. Maybe more people are feeling at ease about attending and receiving Holy Communion. If not though, it is totally understandable. The obligation to attend Mass is still suspended and you are encouraged to participate with Mass on tv or online and make a Spiritual Communion in your prayer during the Mass. If you come to church, please remember to wear your mask at all times till you receive Holy Communion. And keep the social distance seating with your fellow parishioners. Even though we have to follow certain restrictions when attending church, it is still much better that we are able to pray together in person as our parish community and receive the Eucharist.

Today's readings point out that being a disciple of Jesus as not a burden of labor or servitude, but rather one of joy. The first reading from the prophet Zechariah talks about the king who will rule Jerusalem in a humble way as a servant of God. And his kingdom will be a universal one that reaches throughout the earth. "His dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the river to the ends of the earth." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul challenges the people to nourish the Spirit of Christ that dwells within all baptized members of the Church. The same Spirit that raised Christ from the dead will give life to all the faithful. "Brothers and sisters: You are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you." And finally, Matthew's gospel emphasizes a very positive picture of Jesus as the one who reveals divine wisdom. "No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him."



Our own weariness and need are the gateway into the mercy of Jesus. Becoming human sensitizes Jesus to our needs. Bringing him our own fatigue from life's heaviness will lighten our load and make us more receptive to the needs of others. The spiritual life is not a solitary journey. Our untamed independence often leads us astray as we get distracted from the path or we tire from the effort. That is why Jesus calls us to willingly "voke" ourselves to him. When life is difficult, we often dream of better times when troubles are over and, life is happy again. And of course, those who caused our troubles pay for their wrongdoing. But scripture offers us a different scenario where final victory is won by a meek leader. Meek in the Greek means "not easily provoked" which is an excellent characteristic of the heart and mind of Jesus. It is the perfect balance point where the control and direction of one's temper displays moral character and power. A raging fire burns down a house, but the energy of a controlled one heats it. The yoke spoken of by Jesus is a symbol of discipleship. Without it we cannot become a disciple of Jesus. Our weariness is the door into the mercy of Jesus. The only qualification is that we be a "little one" and have a need to turn to him with. In placing our vulnerabilities and needs before Jesus and seeking out wisdom people to walk with us, we will be refreshed and able to carry our own weight in discipleship with joy. May the sacrament we receive at Mass be met in humility to allow the full power of mercy to transform





We wish all a Happy and Blessed Fourth of July!!!







