Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The purpose of today's Gospel is to show how Jesus' pronouncement about paying Caesar a census tax avoids the trap set for him and silences his critics at the same time. In the first reading from the prophet, Isaiah, the people of Israel are being challenged to put their trust in God and return to their homeland. Those who cooperate with God are much wiser and become loyal servants of heaven. "For the sake of Jacob, my servant, of Israel, my chosen one, I have called you by your name, giving you a title, though you knew me not." Then in the second reading from the First Letter to the Thessalonians, Paul gives thanks to God for the faith shown by the people while attributing their strength to the power of the Holy Spirit. "For the gospel did not come to vou in word alone, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with much conviction." And finally, Matthew's gospel continues to show Jesus being at odds with the Jewish leaders, this time about paying takes to Rome. The question posed by the Pharisees is a set up and Jesus sees right through their little trap. His answer is not an answer. When looking at a coin he says rather flippantly to pay Caesar what is his and give God what is his. Now what does that mean? Jews believed everything belonged to God, so what does that mean about a Roman coin. It is the pharisees who must make a choice. "So, Jesus said to them: Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."


In this gospel, Jesus is hit with a "loaded question" that is designed to trap him. There doesn't appear to be any good answer, so Jesus turns the table by asking his own question. His devastating question can only bring a silent response. Jesus doesn't get into the political question about the validity of paying taxes. Yet, whatever side he chose would lead to his arrest. By allowing Caesar his due, Jesus opposes both the Zealots and the Pharisees. The practical reality of paying taxes is a given. Yet Jesus does not give a blueprint for modern day Church/ State relations. We have to decide what are the needs of the competing claims of God and government. Civil society may make legitimate demands on our tax dollars in order to provide necessary services. But as to what belongs to God, from whom we believe every good gift comes, I would suspect that Jesus would have a simple one-word answer: everything! Shouldn't that determine what we give back? It's all a matter of who is number one in your life.

The events of the past two weeks have certainly been difficult and challenging, first for the people of Israel, then those in Gaza, and coupled with the ongoing war in Ukraine plus other troubled spots throughout the world, it seems we are losing the battle of trying to live up to the nobility of being a human being. The atrocities that have occurred in Israel and Ukraine have no place in our world. Then there is the terrible suffering that comes upon so many innocent people because of the wanton disregard for human life. Our best response is prayer coupled with concrete support for those suffering and whose very existence is threatened. The world God created, and Jesus Christ saved is one where all people should live in peace and harmony. Differences should not be divisive but rather complementary. Unfortunately, this is not a lesson that we have learned very well. So, we must continue to trust in God's providential care and the good works and intentions of decent people throughout the world. And we pray, unceasingly, for an end to all war and violence. May our Blessed Lady, through the power of the Holy Rosary help bring our world to a better place.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from *Parish Social Ministry*, info from *Reli*gious Education (Faith Formation), especially about the upcoming Fall Ball on November 4th for our young boys and their adult escorts, a notice for the All Souls Novena of Masses that will start on November 2nd which is All Souls Day, the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold, the Communal Prayer **Before Mass** (found on the inside back cover), an invitation to join *FORMED* (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.



Praying in front of a Planned Parenthood building is a somber, sobering experience. For this is the place where a desperate teen or woman goes, or is pressured into going, for help with her unplanned pregnancy. Sometimes the girl/woman comes by herself, but most of the time she is driven by young friends, a boufriend or an older male. Because the parking lot is in front of the PP building, it is difficult to speak with the girl as the car is entering the parking area. A few times, the car slow downs and help and literature can be offered to the girl. However, most times, when the driver sees those praying the car speeds up so that contact with the girl is not possible. In all the years participating in these prayer witnesses, there is one constant - the girls/women have a sad, fixed stare and there is no interaction between the driver and the girl. The driver parks the car, the girl exits and walks into the PP building, alone. The driver stays in the car. The stark reality of the girl's aloneness and vulnerability and what will be taking place inside that building - to her and her baby - hits and the prayers for her, her baby and all who work in that building continues. The tragedy is that many have believed the false promise that abortion will solve the problem of an unplanned pregnancy. However, it just compounds the problem because of the negative aftereffects of the abortion. If you or anyone you know is suffering from having had an abortion, there is help available. 

STATION ELEVEN

THE ROAD TO EMMAUS:

JESUS, RECOGNIZED IN THE

BREAKING OF THE BREAD

"WHEN HE WAS AT TABLE WITH THEM,

HE TOOK THE BREAD AND BLESSED,

AND BROKE IT, AND GAVE IT TO THEM.

AND THEIR EYES WERE OPENED AND

THEY RECOGNIZED HIM; AND HE

VANISHED OUT OF THEIR SIGHT."

LUKE 24:30-31

After His glorious Resurrection, Jesus first comes to two disciples who were walking to Emmaus. He reveals to them that He is truly the Risen Lord in the "breaking of the bread" (Lk. 24:35).

"And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened, and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight" (Lk. 24:30-31).

What is the connection to Jesus?

Jesus reveals Himself fully in the Eucharist. We must be of great faith to see Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Lord, when You walked with the disciples on the road to Emmaus, You listened to all they had to say. Besieged by their own worries and disappointment, they did not recognize You as the One of Whom they spoke. They did not recognize You until "the Breaking of the Bread." Their eyes were then opened, but You had vanished from their sight. In the Holy Eucharist, though not visible to our bodily sight, we recognize You in "the Breaking of the Bread." As we listen in silent adoration, our hearts - like those of Your disciples burn within us. And we repeat to You now the disciples' plea and bid You to stay with us; for it is nearly evening. Stay with us, Lord, and may we always be with You.

Each week, we will present another of the twelve stations for your meditation for the week.

Week 11 Thought: Since the Eucharist is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus, we are in His Presence at every Mass. How can I thank Our Lord for this foretaste of Heaven?

Sign of the Cross

"In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." Once we have finished the entrance hymn or antiphon at the beginning of Mass, there is a familiar gesture we do at every Mass and frequently with our prayers: we make the Sign of the Cross. When we make the Sign of the Cross...we enter a sacred tradition that goes back to the early centuries of Christianity, when this ritual was understood to be a source of divine power and protection. The early Christians made the Sign of the Cross quite often, desiring to tap into the power that lay therein.

Since we use the Sign of the Cross so frequently, it is important to recall what a meaning-packed gift it really is. The gesture itself points us to the Cross of Jesus-it reminds us of his saving sacrifice-the place where Jesus gave everything out of love for us to conquer sin and death. The words we say remind us that we have been brought into the life of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is important to notice that we pray "in the name" and not "names." Praying in the singular "name" recalls that God is One God in Three Persons. In addition to reminding us of the Trinity and the Cross of Christ, the Sign of the Cross also reminds us of our Baptism, when we were brought into God's family and given a share in the life of God: we are literally baptized "... in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit"!

Saints Who Promoted the Eucharistic
Saint Teresa of Ávila
Religious, Mystic & Doctor of the Church († 1582)
Feast: October 15

Teresa was a woman of piety, wit, and charm. At the age of twenty, she entered the Carmelite convent, where she battled both health problems and distractions in prayer. Meditating on the sufferings of Christ brought her into close union with God. She felt God calling her to reform the Carmelite order.

A strong-willed leader, she set out to restore the austerity and contemplative character of the first Carmelite convents. Teresa encountered opposition from many individuals, yet she traveled throughout Spain and successfully founded 17 convents. Teresa grew in holiness through prayer, meditation, and frequent reception of the Eucharist. She was sustained by the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. She needed nothing more. Her deep devotion to God helped her do great things for the Church.

St. Teresa invited all her sisters and others — "Be with Him willingly; don't lose so good an occasion for conversing with Him as is the hour after having received Communion. Reflect that this is a most advantageous hour for the soul, during which Jesus is very pleased if you keep Him company. Take great care...not to lose it. This, then, is a good time for our Master to teach us, and for us to listen to Him, kiss His feet because He wanted to teach us, and beg Him not to leave."

St. Teresa taught five lessons: (1) Develop a hunger for heaven, (2) Seek spiritual progress in your prayer life by opening up yourself to the work of the Holy Spirit, (3) Pursue continual conversion so as to keep alive your desire for holiness, (4) Be an instrument of God for Church reform to bring us back to what Jesus at Bethany called the "better part" and "one thing necessary," and (5) Develop your devotion to St. Joseph ("If a person cannot find anyone to teach him how to pray, let him take this glorious saint for his guide, and he will not lose his way.")






