

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme for today's readings is to live justly. This means putting aside our differences in order to help those in need, for God's sake and theirs, not for our glory. In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet recognizes that the people are often lukewarm in their prayers and devotions. He challenges them to strengthen the bonds within the human family through acts of kindness and words of healing. "If you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul knows his weaknesses and his fears. He is grateful to God for any success granted him in proclaiming the Gospel. "For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified." And finally, Matthew's gospel focuses on the examples of salt and light. Jesus has just finished proclaiming the Beatitudes and now he addresses his disciples directly. Being a disciple has similarities with both salt and light. The challenge is to grasp those similarities. Jesus makes salt and light an identifiable mark of being a good disciple. First, he says: "You are the salt of the earth." And then he says: "You are the light of the world."

After speaking about the hungry, oppressed and homeless, Isaiah then tells his people not to turn their backs on "your own." And Jesus speaks of a city on a hill where our lights are to shine, not so that we can be seen; but that others may give glory to God. So, in our weakness, fear and trembling, how do we shine *"our light"* on our own? Many people around us hunger not only for food, but for acceptance and kind words instead of hate. These are "our own." Many people are oppressed not only by what is or has happened to then but by what they fear might happen to their children, their parents and others. They are "our own." Many people around us are homeless, not only because they do not have a place to live, but also for a 100 reasons-ranging from abuse, addictions, poverty, and illness; leaving them with no sense of security or safety no matter where there are. They are "our own." And some people around us are naked because they don't have the proper papers, the right-colored skin, or the resources to gain what they need for protection and well-being. These too, are "our own."


Jesus said that a city on a hill cannot be hidden. In other words, what we do or don't do will be seen in the face of what is happening to our own. We are challenged to do something, whether big or very small, but something! And we must recognize that today's problems are far more than any single group, or Church or political party can solve alone. But none of these problems are too big for God to handle; if in all humility, we allow our hearts to seek God's will, our feet to go where God leads and our hands to do what God wants us to do. That's when our deeds will give glory to God. At this Mass, God will come to us in humility, his very self in the form of bread. What then in humility and gratitude can we do in return?



St. Raymond Memorials

Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the **Bread and Wine**, the **Rose for Life** and the **Sanctuary Lamp**. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.

Flowers, the Paschal Candle, Advent Wreath Candles and other holy items we can use for religious services. Then we also have a certain lasting type of memorial called a "Memorial Brick" that can be set in one of four beautiful outside locations.
