

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of today's readings tries to develop an attitude of trust in God's power and gratitude for his goodness. In the first reading from 2 Kings, Namaan was healed because he trusted in God's word spoken to him by the prophet Elisha. Besides the physical healing there was also a spiritual transformation that took place in Namaan. "Now I know there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel." Then in the second reading from 2 Timothy, Paul, though imprisoned, keeps faith that God's word continues to be trustworthy and reliable. "If we have died with him, we shall also live with him." And finally, in Luke's gospel we have the story of the 10 lepers who were healed with only one coming back to show gratitude. The one who came back was a Samaritan, a foreigner to the Jews but not to God and Jesus. Jesus shows that he is the personification of God's mercy, which is available to all who have faith. Jesus said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

God is generous in his mercy, remaining faithful to us even when we become unfaithful to him. In our human frailty, we bear many wounds. Some are physical, but others are emotional, mental, and or spiritual. It is not our own willpower that will heal us, but rather God's power and mercy. For this we must be truly grateful. The crosses that come our way have meaning and purpose. They are not meant to randomly inflict pain or hardship. There is reason for suffering, even though we can't see it. God asks us to trust in his wisdom, mercy and goodness. Our trust will help us endure. Trust and faith go hand in hand. Trust leads us to a deeper faith in God and such a faith helps us to trust more deeply in God. Faith and trust can be deepened through prayer, the scriptures and frequent reception of the sacraments.

Now it is very natural for us to question and wonder at God's ways. Our human intellect cannot fully comprehend the wisdom of God. Sometimes we must follow blindly, relying on God's mercy and love. We can be assured that God will reward our trust and faith in his time and in his way. As we gather at the table of our altar for Mass, preparing to receive Holy Communion, let us ask for the trust and faith that we need to accept our crosses and the gratitude God deserves for the goodness and mercy he has shown us.

This weekend at all the Masses we continue our special *Stewardship Appeal*. I will be speaking at all the Masses on this *Commitment Weekend* in hopes of having as many parishioners as possible submit a Commitment Weekend Intention Card. These cards will be distributed at each Mass and I will guide us in filling them out. A packet will be given to each person or household. Everyone should have received a mailing during the week that highlighted the goal of this appeal. The important thing is that with thoughtful and prayerful reflection over these past three weeks, I hope that we can all make a response of some kind that helps St. Raymond Parish increase its weekly offering for the benefit of our parish's mission.

Our 2019 Backwards Money Drawing is in full swing. Today we need parishioners to be Ticket Agents so that we can disburse many of the 500 tickets. Please stop by one of the tables either in the Altar Server Sacristy or Church Vestibule after Mass and help us make this important fundraiser a success once again
