# Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today we focus on the fact that God has created each one of us with gifts that differ and yet all express unique versions of God's own specific and varied gifts. Deep within our spirit God has planted interior heartbound gifts to help magnify our faith. In the first reading from Proverbs, the ideal woman is praised for a variety of reason, but the chief reason for doing so comes from her deep respect for God in her life. This brings the motivation for all her other pursuits. "Charm is deceptive and beauty fleeting; the woman who fears the Lord is to be praised." Then in the second reading from 1 Thessalonians, Paul reminds the people that the Lord will come on a day that is least expected. Therefore, the people should walk in the light, constantly alert. "We are not of the night or of darkness. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober." And finally, Matthew's gospel presents the parable of the "talents" as a way to give insight int the reality of the kingdom. A "talent" in this context is a very large sum of money. Now the three servants who received "talents" from their wealthy landowner each responded differently. Two were very industrious and made more money than they were given. But the third did nothing with his portion. Fear limited his perception of his master, causing him to lose even what he had been given. "For to everyone who has, more will be given, and he will grow rich, but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away."

Just like the master in today's gospel parable, God has made an investment in each one of us. Jesus taught us a new law and covenant and lived among us as fully human, making our humanity important and precious. Today's gospel prepares us to see with the eyes of faith all that is to come. While the parable is about money to some extent, Jesus has no interest in gaining more money, rather he teaches us to look at the choices we make. The third servant buried his money, because fear limited his perception of the master, causing him to lose even what he had. Faith shares our daily life with God, removing the security of absolute outcomes as we learn to trust God while we live the message of the Gospel. It means growing in trust just as love is meant to be loved in trust. Too many people twist a love relationship into a fear relationship, finding their real security in the observance of laws and rituals. To those who have faith and who live it through investments of hope and love, greater and greater faith is received.

When we live in fear and hide from God's challenge to lay down our lives, faith can fall away. Remember, faith cannot be measured by earthly standards. It depends on a growing, prayerful relationship with Jesus. God offers the gift of faith and the grace to live it. We need to make the trusting leap to live Jesus' teachings.

This coming Thursday, November 23rd is Thanksgiving Day. We celebrate one parish Mass that day at 9:30am in the church. It is the most fitting way to start your family celebration of Thanksgiving by coming to Mass and giving thanks to the giver of all good gifts, our heavenly Father. Make plans to join us Thursday and bring some bread and wine to be blessed that you will have at your family meal later that day.

Thanksgiving Day is also the start of our Countdown to Christmas Raffle. The first winning ticket will be drawn that day with the winner receiving \$500. Then every day till Christmas a winning number will be picked, and a cash prize awarded. What! You're not entered in this raffle yet? Well right after Mass today you can purchase a winning ticket at the tables located in the Altar Server Sacristy or in the church vestibule. ## **Penitential Absolution**



Having spent a brief moment calling to mind our sins and acclaiming together God's mercy, the priest then says words that the Roman Missal calls "the absolution." Is this a "real" absolution, another version of the absolution we receive in the Sacrament of Reconciliation? The short answer is no, it is not the same. Let's look at it a bit more closely.

### Not a Sacramental Confession

In the past, some people (including priests) were incorrectly told that this prayer was the equivalent of the absolution prayer the priest says in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is certainly not the case! To make this clear, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) directly says that this prayer "lacks the efficacy of the Sacrament of Penance" (GIRM, no. 51). The Penitential [Act] of the Mass is not a sacramental confession; therefore, it does not bring immediate remission of mortal sins. Forgiveness of mortal sins has to be obtained in the Sacrament of Penance. It is also important to remember that a person who has committed a mortal sin cannot go to Communion unless he goes to Confession beforehand.

If we think about the actual words of the prayer, this explanation makes sense. The priest here simply asks the Lord to have mercy on us, forgive us, and bring us to heaven. This is clearly different from the words of sacramental absolution where the priest, in the person of Christ, says the words, "God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins: through the ministry of the Church, may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we openly confess our sins and speak them to the priest, whereas in the Mass we review them interiorly. In the Mass, we certainly are acknowledging that we have sins and that we need the Lord's mercy, but we are not directly bringing those sins to God for forgiveness as we do in Reconciliation.

# **Obtaining Pardon**



Even though the words the priest says at Mass are not a sacramental absolution, that does not mean they are not important. As Belmonte says, "the Penitential [Act], if it is said with true contrition, helps to obtain pardon for present venial sins, as well as to stir up new sorrow for past sins that have already been forgiven. In this way, it helps us to purify ourselves and so to take better part in the Holy Mass". The Penitential Act of the Mass certainly can be an important opportunity to review how we have lived since our last time at Mass. It is also a great moment to realize that there might be sins that need sacramental forgiveness before we receive Communion.

For Reflection: Take some time for silent reflection on God's mercy in your life. Conclude by praying the Canticle of Zechariah (Luke 1:68-79), which is part of the Church's daily Morning Prayer.

# Why bring your children to Eucharistic Adoration?

If there is one Bible verse invoked more than any other in the effort to convince parents to bring their children to Eucharistic Adoration, it is this one:



People were bringing little children to him so that he might touch them; the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, Let the little children come to me; do not stop

them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it."

But then, as we attempt to picture our own children there around Jesus, the scene gets a bit messier. The IDEA of kids and the whole family at Eucharistic Adoration is beautiful, all gathered around Our Lord who is truly present there...but the reality is hard and loud and often accompanied by tears. But...pause and reread those verses from Mark with me. Notice that the disciples were annoyed that the children were there. Why? Likely because they were acting like children: they were throwing fits, wandering away, chattering without end, sucking on rocks, and whining for food. I brought my loud, rough kids to a weekly holy hour...and it wasn't easy.

I still prefer to go to adoration alone, but all these years of bringing the kids to Adoration have taught me a powerful lesson. They need to be there. As I read and reread this passage from Mark's Gospel, I noticed something else. Jesus doesn't JUST say, "Let the children come to me" He adds, "for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs." And so, I beg you, listen to the words of Jesus and make time for Eucharistic Adoration as a family. Let the children come to Him, right now, in all their real-life kid-ness.

# Saints Who Promoted the Eucharistic

St. Francis Xavier Cabrini Religious & Founder († 1917)

Feast: November 13



St. Frances' devotion to the Eucharist and the Sacred Heart gave her the strength to minister to the needs of the poor. St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was a remarkable religious sister who worked tirelessly for poor American immigrants. She started schools, hospitals and orphanages wherever she went, a true pioneer in the United States. Yet, she did not rely on her own strength to perform such wonderful deeds, but on the strength, she found in the Sacred Heart and in her times of prayer before the Eucharist.


St. John Paul II commented on this aspect of her life in a Message to the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart in 2000.

"Her extraordinary activity – as you well know – drew its strength from prayer, especially from long periods before the tabernacle. Christ was everything to her. Her constant concern was to discern his will in the directives of the Church's Magisterium and in the events of life themselves."

If you want to do great things for God, do not rely on your own strength, but on the strength of God.

Adopting Mother Cabrini's words as our own can change the focus of our prayers... and the course of our lives:

"I trust in you, my Jesus. I place my poor soul in your hands – mold me according to your divine will."

# ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE

In June, 2022, New York State passed a law targeting pro-life pregnancy care centers for government investigations. This law would have allowed government officials to access sensitive internal documents and force the centers to turn over private information that would jeopardize the trusting relationships with women. It is very important that the women can feel safe with the knowledge that their information be kept confidential. Turning over their information would put the women at risk The good news is that the Becket Fund for Religious Liberty represented the Sisters of Life, pro-bono, asking the federal court to protect them from government intrusion. "Over the past year, 'The Sisters of Life v. McDonald', did not go forward, because the State repeatedly delayed the case rather than defend it. But thanks be to God, the State of New York agreed to a court order that forbids them from demanding our information or punishing us for refusing to provide it. We are profoundly grateful for this victory....May we continue to pray for all pro-life pregnancy centers that, as they walk with pregnant women in their time of greatest need, their efforts may be protected and upheld by law." (The Sisters of Life)




