

Father Chuck's Corner

Good morning on the Twenty-sixth Sunday in ordinary Time! The purpose of this Sunday's readings it to emphasize that we are all on a continuous conversion journey and that God is with us with love every step of the way. In the first reading from Ezekiel, we see that Israel always had the choice to remain faithful to God yet couldn't stay that way. But the opportunity to choose life was always at hand. God's way is not to punish future generations for the sins of their ancestors. "But if he turns from the wickedness he has committed, and does what is right and just, he shall preserve his life...." Then in the second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians, Paul urges the faithful to imitate Jesus who humbled himself for our sakes. Glory is attained through death on the cross. "Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped." And finally in Matthew's gospel we have the parable of the two sons which seems to have a simple message. Based on their responses it is easy to conclude who did the father's will. Upon reflection we see the first son as representing those who repented and changed their attitude and behavior, like the take collectors and prostitutes. The second son who said yes but didn't follow through represented the religious leaders who profess obedience to God but in action really weren't. Authentic obedience, in faith, responds positively to God's ways.

The two sons in today's gospel have a reluctant relationship with their father. Others of less stature and responsibility are getting into heaven over those who reject Jesus' call, even while claiming to be religious. John the Baptist came to prepare the way for Jesus but not all people were open to see a new way of living. One has to be open to conversion, a new way of seeing and living, a new way of loving. Those without hope were waiting for someone to acknowledge their worth, while those who were sure they had it made were not open to a new way of living, loving. They just didn't know how narrow their world was. Jesus challenged his listeners to be on a conversion journey. This requires that you look back and examine what you always believed and assess to see if it still makes sense in light of your new call. Conversion isn't a once in a lifetime event, but rather an ongoing journey. There are multiple stops, insights, and experiences that call us to explore more deeply. Sometimes we get lost and backtrack, looking to become wiser and more open to hearing God in a different way. The important question to ask is: "To whom do you listen?"

Do these voices challenge you and fill you with peace, leading you to be more loving? Or are they voices of division and anger? Is the voice you hear that of a loving God? Remember that the kingdom parables overturn conventional ideas about God. They challenge us as to who is the king of our life. Is he the one with power and might or the king wearing a crown of thorns. You decide!

Today is Respect Life Sunday. As such there will be a special second collection taken at all the Masses. The money raised will be split, half going to the diocesan Respect Life Office and the other half going to our parish's Human Life Committee. In addition, we are once again conducting the Baby Bottle Campaign. Empty baby bottles will be distributed after each Mass at all the doors. Please take a bottle and return it the weekend of November 4-5th with your donation inside. All money raised will go to Women's First Pregnancy Center. Check the Human Life Committee ad for more details.

Next Sunday, October 8th is our next Parish Blood Drive. It will take place from 8am till 2pm in the school cafeteria. There will be a speaker from our Blood Drive Committee after all the Masses this weekend to invite and encourage participation in the drive. Appointments can be made at the Blood Drive tables located in the church vestibule and altar server sacristy. Check the bulletin ad for more information and please consider being a blood donor. It is the very gift of life.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Besides the aforementioned is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, the Blessing of the Animals on Saturday morning, October 7th, the Fatima Prayer Vigil on Wednesday, October 11th, the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold, the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back cover, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.







STATION EIGHT

MULTIPLICATION OF THE LOAVES: THE EUCHARIST, FOOD FOR THE MULTITUDES

"AND TAKING THE FIVE LOAVES AND TWO FISH HE LOOKED UP TO HEAVEN, AND BLESSED, AND BROKE THE LOAVES, AND GAVE THEM TO THE DISCIPLES TO SET BEFORE THE PEOPLE; AND HE DIVIDED THE TWO FISH AMONG THEM ALL. AND THEY ALL ATE AND WERE SATISFIED. AND THOSE WHO ATE THE LOAVES WERE FIVE THOUSAND MEN. "MARK 6:41-42,44

While Jesus was preaching, a very large crowd gathered and followed Him. They followed not only on account of his preaching, but also because of all the signs and miracles He worked. On one occasion near the Passover, He was teaching people who had come from many cities, when it grew late. Jesus desired to feed the large crowd. There were 5,000 men (not including women and children) who were there, and all they had were five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus, taking the five loaves and two fish he looked up to heaven, and blessed, and broke the loaves, and gave them to

the disciples to set before the people, and he divided the two fish among them all. And they all ate and were satisfied. (Mk. 6:41-42).

What is the connection to Jesus?

The multiplication of the loaves foreshadows the words Jesus will speak in the Gospel of John and during the Last Supper, by His giving thanks and blessing the bread. This miracle, Lord, among all Your miracles is so markedly Eucharistic, as we see You say the blessing, break the bread, and distribute it through Your disciples to the multitude. Five loaves among five thousand men. This prefigures Your feeding (through the hands of Your priests) the countless faithful with the Bread of Life, the Most Holy Eucharist. So long as there is Mass, there is the Eucharist, and the multitudes are fed. Not only do You feed us, but You satisfy us. Grant that we may always be satisfied with You alone.

Each week, we will present another of the twelve stations for your meditation for the week.

Step By Step Walk Through the Mass
Do This in Remembrance of Me
By Father Luke Spannagel

Silence Before Mass

When we come to Mass, we recall the graces of our Baptism, genuflect to acknowledge Jesus truly present. If there is a little time before Mass begins, some moments of prayer will help prepare you for the graces of the Mass.

The General Instruction for the Roman Missal says that there should be a quiet opportunity in the church for the faithful to prepare prayerfully for the Holy Mass (GIRM, no. 45). During this time before Mass, you can recall all the great gifts and graces God has given you since you last came to church. This silence also provides the opportunity to reflect on the generosity of our loving Father and to prepare to thank him in the worship of the Mass. In addition to thankfulness, you might also recognize any needs you have—you might talk to God about any difficulties, stresses, or anxieties you are experiencing and offer them to the Lord, asking for his help and grace.

It can be difficult to enter this time of silence to help prepare for Mass, especially if we have not yet made it a habit. If you are short on time, Charles Belmonte encourages you to pray on the way to Mass. He writes, "Prepare your soul for Communion with acts of love of God. Make acts of contrition and atonement...pray for the priest that he may truly minister to the needs of the parish. Pray for the congregation...pray that you may understand what you yourself will be taught at Mass" (Understanding the Mass, pg. 38). Belmonte goes on to also encourage using a missal or missalette to review the readings and prayers of the Mass ahead of time. Being familiar with these will also help you to be more attentive and unite your personal prayer more fruitfully with the Mass.

Give yourself a goal of arriving at church a bit earlier, and take the challenge of spending a little time in prayer before Mass. In addition to the suggestions above, any of our classic prayers or even composing a prayer of your own is a great way to help prepare your heart for the celebration of the Mass.

Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion Saint Jerome

Priest & Doctor of the Church († 420) Feast: September 30

"If Christ did not want to dismiss the Jews without food in the desert for fear that they would collapse on the way, it was to teach us that it is dangerous to try to get to heaven without the Bread of Heaven."

Saint Jerome was born in Strido, Dalmatia (Croatia) in 347 AD and he became a Christian in 366. After being educated by his father, Jerome was sent to Rome where he eagerly studied Greek, Latin, history, and philosophy and built his own library diligently copying most of the works he read. Inspired by preaching he heard in Antioch; he became a priest in 378.

In the following decades, Jerome translated most of the Old Testament from Hebrew and wrote his Biblical commentaries. A difficult and hot-tempered man, he also made enemies as he vigorously opposed various heresies. However, Jerome's greatest achievement was, the translation of the Bible into Latin, known as the Vulgate, from the original Greek and Hebrew texts. Commenting on his translation of the Bible, Jerome affirmed the need to always return to the original texts if disagreements arose in the future regarding the context and meaning of the scriptures.

For example, in the Gospel of Matthew, a unique word stands out during the Our Father prayer: "Give us this day our daily bread (Greek: epiousios)" (Mt 6:11). The word Epiousios is not found anywhere else in the Bible, except in Luke 11:3, in the same prayer. St. Jerome's translation of the Gospel of Matthew into Latin is more literal and translates this word as "supersubstantial." Supersubstantial means above all substance or superior to all things. Therefore, many Church Fathers, including St. Augustine, Cyril of Jerusalem, Cyprian of Carthage, as well as by the Council of Trent understood the petition for "our supersubstantial bread" to refer to the Eucharist.

As his death approached, Jerome confessed his sins and received the Eucharist with great fervor. After throwing himself on the ground, singing "Now let thy servant depart" (Luke 2:29–32), an ethereal light flooded the room. Witnesses saw several angels; others heard a voice, which promised Jerome the eternal reward prepared for him in Heaven. He then uttered his final words: "Behold, I come to thee, merciful Jesus! Receive me whom Thou hast redeemed with Thy Precious Blood."




Vocations Prayer
