

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time! The aim of today's readings is to help us realize that God's presence in our lives becomes real through our relationships with others. It is only through humility that we can put others first and thus spread the love of God throughout the world. In the first reading from Isaiah, only God's saving grace can bring healing to a world wounded by human pride. God brings unity to a world shattered by the self-serving deeds and thoughts of sinful nations. "I know their works and their thoughts, and I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory." Then in the second reading from Hebrews we are told that the trials of life provide valuable lessons from Jesus. We should not be disheartened by the disciplines of Jesus. "So, strengthen your drooping hands and your weak knees. Make straight paths for your feet, that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed." And finally, today's gospel from Luke serves as a backdrop for Jesus' teaching on discipleship and the requirements for entry into the Kingdom of God. Jesus focuses on the narrow gate and not familiarity. Salvation is not handed out as a reward for knowing the right people. Acceptance of Jesus' will and everything about him will bring acceptance by Jesus. Jesus makes one of his very fond statements: "For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."

Most of us have probably had an experience using GPS where we ended up in a place no where near where we wanted to be. This recent technology is created by humans and will only get us so far. Each of us have occasionally been misguided by taking the easy way out or by illusions of knowing the "right way" to go. Then we see the uselessness of our angry words, envy, selfishness, and religious defense of our pride that leads us down the wrong path separated from one another. The word of God on the other hand is not new technology but has been with us since the beginning, leading us close to the heart of Jesus and through the narrow gate. We reject God's directions at our own peril. *First, we are* to love God above all else. But what keeps us from doing this? Is it money, power, greed? And then we have been given directions about how to love one another. When we love one another, we see beyond our differences in religion, politics, skin color and nationalities. We wisely take our directions from the scriptures because they reaffirm the dignity of each person. And that's the only path to unity and peace.

When we lose our way, God gently leads us back to a path with signposts, often not subtly. We may recognize the signs in our sufferings and joy or in God's nudging spirit is relationships with others. We hear Jesus' directions at Mass on Sunday that we may not be first in line. Remember, God will only recognize humble people as Jesus tells us. We should never give up in our efforts to be in solidarity with all people. Reaching beyond ourselves is when we grow in humility, so always knock at the narrow gate. That's where Jesus is waiting to let you in.







SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM TWO MONTH OLD GROWING BABY IN UTERO

Your spiritually adopted baby is making progress developing all of his or her internal and external organs. At just 35 days after conception, the baby has all his or her fingers. Brain waves can be detected at 40 days & the brain is controlling 40 sets of muscles as well as the organs. His or her mother can hear her baby's heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. The jaw forms including teeth buds in the gums. And it has been reported that as early as two months the baby can suck his or her thumb! The eyelids seal during this time to protect the baby's light-sensitive eyes that will re open in the seventh month. The stomach produces digestive juices and the kidneys have begun to function. This tiny human being responds to touch. By eight weeks, the growing baby is now referred to as the "fetus", a Latin word meaning "young one" or "offspring". From this moment onward, your spiritually adopted baby grows and refines his or her body. But everything the baby needs to survive once he or she is born is already present by the end of the eighth week! Please continue to pray daily for your little one as most surgical abortions are done between the 8th and 12th week of the unborn baby's life. Thank you! "You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body, and knit them together in my mother's womb. Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! It is amazing to think about it. Your workmanship is marvelous - and how well I know it. You were there while I was being formed in utter seclusion! You saw me before I was born and scheduled each day of my life before I began to breathe. Every day was recorded in Your book!" (Psalm 139:13-16)

'We Give Thanks to God'

We give thanks to God for today's decision of the United States Supreme Court in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. This just decision will save countless innocent children simply waiting to be born.

On this historic day, our gratitude extends to the millions of heroic Americans who have worked tirelessly toward this outcome for nearly a half-century. Women and men, children and adults, believers and non-believers, people of every culture and background have advocated for life. They have been a charitable and compelling voice for the voiceless, and today, their voice has been heard.

As Catholics, we have prayed and fasted, held vigils, offered Masses, and peacefully witnessed in these last five decades. We have joined others in educating schoolchildren, opening pregnancy care centers, walking with mothers, offering post-abortion counseling, and marching, year after year, to the United States Supreme Court to witness for life. Today, our voice has been heard.

With the entire pro-life community, we are overjoyed with this outcome of the Court. However, we acknowledge the wide range of emotions associated with this decision. We call on all Catholics and everyone who supports the right to life for unborn children to be charitable, even as we celebrate an important historical moment and an answer to a prayer.

We must remember that this is a judicial victory, not a cultural one. The culture remains deeply divided on the issue, which will be evidenced by the patchwork of state statutes pertaining to abortion across the country. To change the culture and build a culture of life, we need to enact family-friendly policies that welcome children, support mothers, cherish families and empower them to thrive. We outlined our vision for a pro-life New York in our recent statement, available here, and we rededicate ourselves to helping every expectant mother to carry her baby to term.

Building a culture of life is not solely the responsibility of the government or those heroic individuals working on the front lines, in crisis pregnancy centers and other ministries. All of us need to respect the dignity and sanctity of human life in everything we do: in how we treat our children, spouses and parents; in the way we behave in our place of work; in sum, how we live Jesus' two great commandments to love God and love our neighbor.

Love, charity and reverence for human life from the moment of conception through natural death - these will build and sustain a culture of life.

Millions of Americans have worked tirelessly for almost 50 years towards this outcome. We thank them with every fiber of our being. Their vital work continues, and we commit ourselves to it.


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION FOR THE 2022/2023 SCHOOL YEAR IS IN PROGRESS.
