Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's scriptures tell us that God calls us to do more than what is acceptable according to the world's standards. We are called to stand out in the world as God's witnesses to the truth. In the first reading from Sirach, we follow the previous verses which spoke of the noble character of human beings. Now Sirach refers to our freedom to choose. Wisdom is the key to making the best choices, and God's graces are offered in abundance to help us along the way. "Before man are life and death; good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given to him." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul is clear that the rulers of this world see only passing things because they are spiritually immature. God's faithful ones listen to what has been revealed through the Holy Spirit and are spiritually mature. "But as it is written: What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him, this God has revealed to us through the Spirit." And finally, in Matthew's gospel Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount through the use of four examples required for good Christian conduct. They are anger, adultery, divorce and oaths. Each one is given a further emphasis by Jesus pushing us to a higher level of Christian living. Anger can be seen as a form of killing. Lust can be a form of adultery. Divorce is absolutely prohibited by Jesus unless the marriage was unlawful to begin with. And the taking of oaths, even as a solemn promise, is opposed by Jesus. If one is a person of integrity and committed to truth you should not need oaths. The quality of one's life should speak for itself. "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."

Today's reading invites us all to "dig a little deeper" by moving from doing what is "good enough" to making a more thoughtful, mature commitment in keeping and actively living God's commands. Just think of how many times we hurry to finish a task or chore and say to ourselves, "That's good enough." Well as daughters and sons of God we are all called to a higher standard of attitude, behavior, and action. Dig a little deeper when choosing to keep the commandments. Take some time this week to reflect on one or more of the Ten Commandments, and ways to "dig a little deeper" in moving from just keeping them to actively living them. Maybe even do one as a family.

We have all made promises that we didn't keep. Think about how not keeping it may have affected another person. See the connection between "Let your Yes mean Yes and your No mean No." Followers of Jesus witness to the truth and keep their promises by telling the truth. Dig a little deeper this week by being promise keepers and truth tellers. Lent begins soon and today's readings suggest ways to dig a little deeper in order to become stronger witnesses of Jesus' truth and love.

While the diocese has been dealing with the Bankruptcy Case for the past several years, many things have happened as well for St. Raymond Parish. The COVID 19 pandemic came along and basically crippled everything for a good while. Then in the midst of that, St. Raymond School closed which was a painful experience for the parish and all involved. Like every parish we have strived to get up off the mat and get things moving along positively again. Many of you have been of great assistance in doing just that. One diocesan project that occurs each year as you know is the Catholic Ministries Appeal. As a parish we have not made a concerted effort to push this appeal since 2019. The reasons being, COVID came along in 2020, then our school closed in 2021 and the lingering bankruptcy case have all made it difficult to engage in the CMA. That being said, the 2023 CMA Appeal is upon us and so I will try to keep it our there for all who will participate. I thank those who through these past years have contributed to the CMA seeing its importance for the financing of many important diocesan ministries.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, an invitation to the next Holy Hour this coming Wednesday, February 15th, an advertisement for the Midnight Run for the Homeless (clothing collection for the homeless), an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand, and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do so will be called least in the kingdom of heaven. But whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called greatest in the kingdom of heaven. I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven. "You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; and whoever says to his brother, 'Raga,' will be answerable to the Sanhedrin; and whoever says, 'You fool,' will be liable to fiery Gehenna. Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Settle with your opponent quickly while on the way to court. Otherwise your opponent will hand you over to the judge, and the judge will hand you over to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. Amen, I say to you, you will not be released until you have paid the last penny. "You have heard that it was said, You shall not commit adultery. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body thrown into Gehenna. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body go into Gehenna. "It was also said, Whoever divorces his wife must give her a bill of divorce. But I say to you, whoever divorces his wife - unless the marriage is unlawful causes her to commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery. "Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow. But I say to you, do not swear at all; not by heaven, for it is God's throne; nor by the earth, for it is his footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. Do not swear by your head, for you cannot make a single hair white or black. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one."
