Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time! The theme of this Sunday's readings is to promote patient waiting and trust that God is working behind the scenes in everyone's life. In the first reading from Ezekiel, the prophet assures the people that God will bring all exiles back to their homeland. All nations are encouraged to turn to God so that his power will be made manifest and those who humbly serve him will have great success. "As I the Lord have spoken, so will I do." Then in the second reading from 2 Corinthians, Paul confidently preaches about living in faith even while physically apart from Jesus. Until that day when he goes home to Jesus, Paul will seek to please Jesus in every way. "We are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight." And finally in Mark's gospel, we have one of Jesus' "seed parables" where he describes the amazing growth process of this reality called "the kingdom of God." It is a mystery how seeds grow just as it is a mystery as to how the kingdom grows. Part of the process of both is that growth happens although no one knows exactly how. Smallness will ultimately be transformed into something big and powerful. "Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle, for the harvest has come."

Growth toward fruition is part of the kingdom's DNA. In spite of seeming obstructions, it is indestructible. The only question is whether we will be part of it. Its growth is often hidden, underground or behind the scenes. When our requests for good things seem unanswered, self-recriminations are not helpful; like you didn't pray hard enough or didn't use the special "never known to fail" prayers. This parable invites us to hope when nothing hopeful is happening; to hope for spiritual progress when we don't feel it, to hope for conversion in someone we love when we don't see it and to hope that the good seeds we have sown will blossom even though we may be gone. May our prayer each day include asking to know our role in building the kingdom of God.

This Saturday, June 12th the 2021 Eighth Grade Class of St. Raymond School celebrated their grammar school graduation.

On behalf of the entire parish, I congratulate the 11 graduates and their families on achieving this milestone in their young lives. I know that they will all have great success in high school. May you continue to grow in wisdom and faith so that your future will be a witness to the wonderful education you received at St. Raymond School both in knowledge and formation as a Catholic. God bless you with much success and all happiness in the years to come.

As we move into the Ordinary Time cycle of the Church calendar, the diocese has announced the loosening of more pandemic restrictions. We are easing into them as the weeks progress. So far, the requirement of wearing a mask in church is lifted for those who have been vaccinated. If you have not as yet please continue to wear a mask. It's the honor system so let's all be understanding and sensitive as we begin to share more common space when praying together in church. We also now come forward to receive Holy Communion up the center aisle in two lines and return by the side. I urge everyone to receive Holy Communion when you come to Mass. There really is no reason to stav away if you are at Mass. We will continue to wear masks and sanitize our hands when distributing Holy Communion. This weekend we have restored some of the *Missalettes* to the pew racks so that you can sing and follow along with the Mass.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass. It contains many items of interest and information with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, information about the upcoming Father's Day Novena of Masses, the opening of CYO Basketball Registration, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand), and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.



SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM

Everyone loves the beauty and innocence of a baby. As an expression of that love, we will begin our annual "Spiritual Adoption Prayer Program" next week-end, June 19th and 20th. Members of our parish family will have the opportunity to spiritually adopt a child who is newly conceived this month and in danger of being killed through abortion. You may adopt a baby individually or as a family simply by signing a pledge card (which will be located at each of the Church's vestibules) and praying "The Prayer for Life" (which is attached to and can be detached from the pledge card) each day for the next nine months. The signed pledge card may be deposited in the box next to the pledge cards. The signed pledge cards will be placed on St. Joseph's altar and remain there for the entire nine months of this program. Each month in the bulletin, there will be information about the baby's growth and development and on the bulletin boards in each of the vestibules, there will be a picture of what the baby actually looks like each month of the mother's pregnancy. Our hope is that this will aid in bringing the awareness of the humanity of this little person in the womb to all and stir all to be a voice for these little ones. Since the infamous Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton Decisions of 1973, over 62 MILLION babies in the womb have died through legalized surgical abortions (this does not include those who have been killed through chemical abortions). Your prayers will not only help the baby in danger of abortion but will help his or her mother to choose life over death for her little one and for the father to be the protector of his baby and a support for the baby's mother. Please consider sharing the gift of life and love by making this daily prayer commitment. Remember, today 3,200 babies in the womb will suffer a painful death through abortion and tomorrow another 3,200 babies will be aborted, and the next day another 3,200 babies will be killed through abortion and the count will continue until one day, please God, we will say, "ENOUGH!"

St. Raymond Memorials

Often people ask if there is something they could memorialize in memory of a loved one. Besides having *Mass Intentions*, there are other opportunities for individuals, families and groups to remember a loved one in a tangible and sometimes lasting way. Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the *Bread and Wine*, the *Rose for Life* and the *Sanctuary Lamp*. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.

There are also other liturgical items that are seasonal, like the *Christmas* and *Easter Flowers*, the *Paschal Candle*, *Advent Wreath Candles* and other holy items we can use for religious services. Then we also have a certain lasting type of memorial called a

"Memorial Brick" that can be set in one of four beautiful outside locations. One location is by the Holy Family Statue on the front lawn of the rectory, the St. Teresa Statue behind the rectory, the God and Country Memorial near the front of the church and finally our newest Padre Pio Statue on the walkway between the rectory and church. Each location is open for anyone wishing to have such a Memorial Brick placed there.

These bricks are 4" by 8" with up to three lines of text. The donation for each brick is \$250. Anyone wishing to purchase one of these bricks should contact the rectory during regular office hours. Maybe you will consider one of these special places on the grounds of St. Raymond to celebrate life and pay tribute to someone dear to you.











The Rose for Life program began here at St. Raymond on Mother's Day, May 12,1985. A rose is placed on the Offertory Table at the 5:00pm Mass and is presented to the priest at the Offertory. The rose symbolizes the life of a preborn baby who dies from abortion. It remains at the tabernacle for the coming week.

CATECHISTS NEEDED


