Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Sixth Sunday of Easter! The readings are encouraging us to get ready to do great things in the name of Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. A Christian life doesn't rely on theory or an intellectual system of laws. We are Jesus alive in the world today because the Holy Spirit dwells within us. In the first reading from Acts, we see, as so often happens, that the Holy Spirit advances the spread of the Gospel in unexpected ways. Though Stephen has been martyred, the community of believers remains strong. Now Philp is going about spreading the Gospel message through preaching and healing. "With one accord, the crowds paid attention to what was said by Philip when they heard it and saw the signs he was doing." Then in the second reading from 1 Peter, the faithful are told that they should be ready and willing at any time to give witness to Jesus. And the faithful needed to be ready to suffer, just as Jesus suffered for the sake of salvation. "For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil." And finally in John's gospel, we have the continuing farewell discourse of Jesus to the apostles. Here Jesus emphasizes the importance of keeping his commandments as the main way of showing love of Jesus. Jesus promises the "Advocate" the Holy Spirit of truth who will be with them always and keep them on the right path. "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him."

Today's readings emphasize the presence of Jesus in the world today though the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. Sent by Jesus to help his followers, the apostles and all of us, to change the face of the earth, the Holy Spirit encourages and intercedes for us. By our faith, the Holy Spirit urges us to go forward and bring the Good News of God's mercy and love to all wherever we go. The Christian mission is not simply to believe in Jesus. It involves using the spiritual gifts received at Baptism to respond to God's love with action. The mission of every Christian is to be Jesus Christ alive in the world, bringing our dynamic faith to every place we experience. The disciples did not understand how Jesus could be with them unseen, or how they would never be orphaned by his absence. Even when he suffered and died, while they felt the depth of his love even more, they were still afraid. But then the Holy Spirit comes to them, and all is different. They then became Jesus Christ alive for the world. Whenever the disciples responded generously to the Holy Spirit that's where Jesus was found, and it is the same for us today.

This Saturday we again celebrated First Holy Communion for our parish's Second Graders.

St. Raymond Parish congratulates the children on reaching the most important day in their life as a Catholic. In receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus you now take part in the most sacred practice a Catholic partakes of. Congratulations to the parents for continuing to be "the best of teachers in the faith by what you say and do." Many thanks to our religious Education Department under the direction of Mrs. Lucy Ostermann and also her assistants and all the catechists who guided the children to this great day. I look forward to seeing each of you and your families at the table of the Lord each Sunday going forward.

Next Sunday, May 21st, we will have our Parish Blood Drive in the school cafeteria from 8am till 2pm. There will be a speaker from the parish committee at all the Masse today to encourage donors and make appointments for those wishing to set up a particular time to donate next Sunday. There is an urgent need for blood so please consider giving this great gift of life.

Thank you for your continued support and generosity. You are always in our prayers.




