Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time as we usher in the month of July! Today's readings point us all in the direction of loving Jesus. We should love him more than anything or anyone else. And this is shown by how we love one another. In the first reading from 2 Kings, we see the prophet Elisha as an agent of life for the people of Israel. He sees the faith this hospitable woman had and wants to help her. The result is that she will within a year bear a son. "Elisha promised, 'This time next year you will be fondling a baby son. " Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul reminds us that in Baptism we die with Jesus. But we also rise with Jesus in Baptism to a new life. That is why we renounce the things of this world as we live for God. "If then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him." And finally in Matthew's gospel, we see Jesus using his authority to send his disciples forth to proclaim his teachings. There will be hardships as well as rewards. The requirements of being a disciple are that you take up your cross and follow, not clinging to anyone or anything. A true disciple will also lose his life and find new life in a faith rooted in the gospel. The rewards will come because of the faith of the disciple. Faithfulness and righteousness provide their own rewards. "Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

In our modern world we think of hospitality as opening our home for the night to family members and friends; sharing what one has with others. But in the biblical world hospitality is sharing not to simply be nice but it is for life. It's also the call Christians have for others. It's not the excess we share but rather what one truly needs, no matter what the cost. Elisha the prophet, in order to do what God commands, needs the kindness of others. He finds that hospitality from a woman of wealth who sees his need. Because of her generosity she is to be rewarded with a son. Paul's letter serves to remind all of us that we live in order to serve Jesus. With trust in God's promise of eternal life, Christians live generous lives because we have been saved in Jesus Christ. Now in the gospel, it seems that Jesus tries to shock us by using the mother and father images. Of course, we love our parents, but Jesus comes first. When we love Jesus above even those closest to us. then we will know how to love generously, like Jesus. For us Christians, carrying one's cross freely and giving all away leads to new life.

Generosity and hospitality are essential elements of "giving it all away." In the biblical word a cup of water may be the difference between life and death. Being a Christian requires true hospitality, even when it hurts to do so. Let us always be reminded in the Eucharist of just how generous, loving and "giving it all away" God has been to us.

Starting this Sunday, July 2nd, the priests, deacons, and Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist will no longer be required to wear a mask when distributing Holy Communion at Sunday Masses. This had been our parish policy at my discretion for the past year, and now it is being lifted. However, anyone distributing Holy Communion may still wear a mask if they so choose as well as anyone attending Mass.

As previously announced, we are now well underway with the "*Return of the Backwards Money Drawing.*" Yes, it has been four years since we last held this fund raiser. I hope that you are ready to make it the successful fund-raising event once again that it had been for many years prior to the pandemic. You should have received the parishwide mailing by now and the bulletin also contains an order form for your convenience. The drawing will be held on Sunday, August 27, 2023, in the school cafeteria. *Everything is the same, the ticket price of \$100, the grand prize of \$10,000 and an additional \$10,000 spread out amongst other winners.* Hopefully you will be in it and a big winner!

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. 




Why is the Eucharist not only a meal but also a sacrifice?

While our sins would have made it impossible for us to share in the life of God, Jesus Christ was sent to remove this obstacle. His death was a sacrifice for our sins. Christ is "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29). Through his death and resurrection, he conquered sin and death and reconciled us to God. The Eucharist is the memorial of this sacrifice. The Church gathers to remember and to re-present the sacrifice of Christ in which we share through the action of the priest and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Through the celebration of the Eucharist, we are joined to Christ's sacrifice and receive its inexhaustible benefits. As the Letter to the

Hebrews explains, Jesus is the one eternal high priest who always lives to make intercession for the people before the Father. In this way, he surpasses the many high priests who over centuries used to offer sacrifices for sin in the Jerusalem temple. The eternal high priest Jesus offers the perfect sacrifice, which is his very self, not something else. "He entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption" (Heb 9:12).

Jesus' act belongs to human history, for he is truly human and has entered history. At the same time, however, Jesus Christ is the Second Person of the Holy Trinity; he is the eternal Son, who is not confined within time or history. His actions transcend time, which is part of creation.

"Passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation" (Heb 9:11), Jesus the eternal Son of God made his act of sacrifice in the presence of his Father, who lives in eternity. Jesus' one perfect sacrifice is thus eternally present before the Father, who eternally accepts it. This means that in the Eucharist, Jesus does not sacrifice himself again and again. Rather, by the power of the Holy Spirit, his one eternal sacrifice is made present once again, re-presented, so that we may share in it.

Christ does not have to leave where he is in heaven to be with us. Rather, we partake of the heavenly liturgy where Christ eternally intercedes for us and presents his sacrifice to the Father and where the angels and saints constantly glorify God and give thanks for all his gifts: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever" (Rev 5:13).

The Eucharist is also the sacrifice of the Church. The Church, which is the Body and Bride of Christ, participates in the sacrificial offering of her Head and Spouse. In the Eucharist, the sacrifice of Christ becomes the sacrifice of the members of his Body who united to Christ form one sacrificial offering (cf. Catechism, no. 1368). As Christ's sacrifice is made sacramentally present, united with Christ, we offer ourselves as a sacrifice to the Father. "The whole Church exercises the role of priest and victim along with Christ, offering the Sacrifice of the Mass and itself completely offered in it" (Mysterium Fidei, no. 31; cf. Lumen Gentium, no. 11).

WISDOM & ENCOURAGEMENT

On June 19, 2023, Pope Francis met with the U.S. National Eucharistic Revival and Congress team. The Pope affirmed the critical need for Eucharistic Revival, and shared his hope for the future of the Church in the United States. He says the Congress will be an occasion for the faithful to "commit themselves with ever greater zeal to being missionary disciples of the Lord Jesus in the world."

The Holy Father reminded us that "the love we celebrate in this sacrament cannot be kept to ourselves but demands to be shared with all. This is the sense of a missionary spirit." The Pope went on to say, "Two groups of people come to mind whom we must always seek out: the elderly, who are the wisdom of a people, and the sick, who are the image of the suffering Jesus."

The Pope continued "It is my hope, then, that the Eucharistic Congress will inspire Catholics throughout the country to discover anew the sense of wonder and awe at the Lord's great gift of himself and to spend time with him in the celebration of the Holy Mass and in personal prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. I believe that we have lost the sense of adoration in our day. We must rediscover the sense of adoration in silence. It is a form of prayer that we have lost. Too few people know what it is. It is up to the Bishops to catechize the faithful about praying through adoration. The Eucharist requires it of us."

The Holy Father especially stressed the importance of fostering vocations to the priesthood, as "There can be no Eucharist without the priesthood" (*Quoting Pope John Paul II's Letter to Priests for Holy Thursday 2004*). Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion Saint John Neumann

Bishop († 1860)

Feast: January 5

"I have one desire, that of being near you in the Blessed Sacrament ...Gladly would I endure hunger, thirst, heat and cold to remain always with you in the Blessed

Sacrament."

In 1852, John Neumann was appointed Bishop of Philadelphia. Neumann wished to establish the Forty Hours' Devotion in his diocese, but his priests were hesitant: There was tremendous anti-Catholic sentiment, and already some churches had suffered arson. One night the bishop fell asleep at his desk and his candle ignited some papers. When he awoke, he found that the fire had done little harm. As he prayed in thanksgiving, he heard these words: "As the flames are burning here without consuming or injuring the writing, so shall I pour out my grace in the Blessed Sacrament without prejudice to my honor. Fear no profanation, therefore; hesitate no longer to carry out your design for my glory." The Forty Hours' Devotion was introduced in Philadelphia soon after, in 1853.






Ocean Financial Federal Credit Union Supports St. Raymond!

ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE

JULY 4, 1776

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

(The Declaration of Independence)

Please note the words: "created equal" - meaning that at each individual's creation, which we know from science is at conception, we are all "equal", and "endowed by their Creator" - meaning that each of us has been given by our "Creator", not the government or another human being, "inalienable rights" - meaning rights that cannot be taken away. Isn't ironic that our forefathers over 200 years ago, who did not have the knowledge of fetal development in the womb, as we do today, used the word "created" not born, and that our basic "right to life" is the first "right" mentioned and a gift of our Creator (capital "C") and must be protected. Today, with the aid of modern technology, we can see into the womb of a pregnant woman and clearly see a live, human being at the youngest phase of his or her earthly life. And yet, many people are still defending a woman's "right" to have her little one "legally" killed through abortion, for any reason, up to and including the time right before the baby's birth. Until the "right to life" is extended to the youngest in our human family, the babies in the womb, we, as a people and as a nation, still have a way to go until we live up to the full potential and greatness of "The Declaration of Independence". Please continue to pray and work for the day when the babies in the womb have the same legal protection for their "right to life" as we enjoy and cherish.




