## Father Chuck's Corner

**Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time!** Today's readings try to encourage Christian witness. In the first reading from Jonah, the people of Nineveh listen to Jonah and the entire city repents of her evil ways so that God relents on his punishment. **"When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them; he did not carry it out."** Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul encourages the community of faith to remember that they live for the kingdom of heaven even while they live in this world. Keep the gaze on heavenly things. **"For the world in its present form is passing away."** And finally, in Mark's gospel, Jesus is continuing the message of John the Baptist who had been arrested. And now he calls four fishermen to leave their nets and join his ranks as disciples. **"Come after me and I will make you fishers of men."**

So, there is the potential for destruction and the sense that the world is coming to an end. Where is the hope? We have been hearing the same message during the year that we just left behind. The novel coronavirus has turned our world upside down. A renewed awareness of hidden racism in our institutions and in our hearts has prodded us to examine our collective and individual consciences. And now we have a new slate of elected public servants to confront the challenges ahead. The times, they are a -changin'. As Christians we turn to God's word for guidance, realizing that we do not have to face the future alone. Jesus preaches Good News, the Gospel. God's kingdom is coming. In Jesus, the kingdom has already come. The Son of God has arrived on earth to become a human being and change history. Now the future looks bright for those who embraced his message and turned their lives around to follow him. Jesus will teach God's ways and make God's paths known, the ways of truth, the paths of compassion and love.

Now Jesus did not expect to do it all by himself. The apostles would continue to proclaim the Good News. And they were ready to follow. Jesus calls each of us to share in this missionary work. The kingdom of God cannot come about if only a select few proclaim it. Yes, we will always need leaders, but we need the whole People of God to **"abound in good works"** so that Jesus' mission can be accomplished.

Each of us has been called to a change of heart by our baptism. Perhaps today we need to renew that call, early in 2021, and then renew it every day to come. With God's grace we can change the Nineveh out there into the kingdom of God.

Well, I am still in the grip of the coronavirus as I write this column. I have regained some strength and am eating a bit again. But there is still weakness, congestion and my voice is always hoarse. Many thanks for all the prayers, cards and Masses that have come my way. They are most appreciated. Believe me, this has been no picnic, but I hope that it is getting out of my system and soon I can return to full duties. Fathers Joseph and Vincent have been terrific, and the quality of our priestly brotherhood has been shone front and center for me these past weeks. So, I implore everyone to stay safe. You don't want this virus.

This coming Friday, January 29<sup>th</sup>, in lieu of the regular March for Life in Washington DC, we will dedicate the 8:45am Mass for these special intentions. And then there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 1-2pm in the church. All are most welcome.

### **ATTENTION 2<sup>ND</sup> GRADE PARENTS**




As I was reflecting on this week readings, I was particularly stuck by the responsorial psalm refrain: "Teach me your ways, O Lord." What a meaningful prayer for each of us currently! What is it that the Lord is trying to teach us during this time of world pandemic, and political and civil unrest? Is it the same message that He sent to the people of Nineveh at the time of Jonah? Should we take to heart the warning to "repent of our evil ways" and to follow the law of the Lord? Sounds like a plan to me! Perhaps that way we also could become "fishers of men" as Jesus promised the first apostles. Let us pray, then, to the Lord to "teach me our ways".

Can you believe that we are already at the end of January? The weather has been such that it does not really feel that way. In a way we have lucked out with just a few cold days and no snow (can not imagine that the children feel the same way!). However, there is still plenty of time for the winds to whirl and the snow to pile. Usually, that kind of weather happens as we prepare for Catholic Schools Week. In a normal year (whatever that may be) we get all spiffed up; it snows, and all the mess (including the salt) gets dragged into the school. Could be that the Lord is making a joke this year. No open house - no messy weather! Of course, it could also be that He is waiting for Catholic Schools Week to begin and this year it does not start until January 31<sup>st</sup>. 
## SPECIAL ONE YEAR MEMORIAL CANDLE

As you know, several years ago we have upgraded our devotional candles by both the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph. The older ones were outdated and ready to break down. In addition we have added four new statues in the rear of the church with smaller new candle stands. They are Mother Teresa, St. Therese of the Little Flower, St. Anthony and St. Jude.
