Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours of the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord! Today is the official ending of the Christmas season. The thrust of this feast is to recognize that the Holy Spirit is more than an abstract idea. A relationship with the Holy Spirit can truly transform our lives. In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet focuses on the character of a loyal servant. Now the emphasis is on humble service. The success of a servant lies in God working through him or her. Such efforts lead others to a right relationship with God. **"Seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near."** Then the second reading from Acts, Peter is preaching the message of God to a Gentile audience. He tries to get the message across that God shows no partiality. **"Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him."** And finally, Mark's gospel places the baptism of Jesus as the prologue to the whole story of Jesus. Divine revelation unfolds in dramatic fashion with the dove-like Holy Spirit descending upon Jesus. And there is a divine voice that accompanies the Holy Spirit which clearly identifies Jesus as God's Son. **"And a voice came from the heavens, 'You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased.'"**

It is important that we move from a passive acceptance of the idea of the Holy Spirit to an active awareness of the Holy Spirit's powerful presence in our lives. When Jesus was baptized, he was joined by the Holy Spirit in a spectacular way for all to see. And at that moment the voice of God poured out from the sky, **"You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased."** Life and the mission of Jesus is linked to the presence of the Holy Spirit who never leaves the side of Jesus and is always powerfully present. Now all of us as baptized Christians also experience the Holy Spirit in our everyday lives. First of all, there is the unconditional outpouring of God's loves into our hearts. The same words said to Jesus, God wants to say to us. Christians experience God's love in real ways through the Holy Spirit. And when we welcome the Holy Spirit into our lives, it's like a new life enters us. There is a new peace and a vitality to our relationship with God as a result. Then there is the courage and strength given us by the Holy Spirit to work for justice and face the darkness of the world. And finally, the Holy Spirit draws us into a deeper desire in our hearts for holiness. So, if you want all this, simply ask for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit into your life.

Ask the Holy spirit to pour mercy, tenderness, and forgiveness into your life. Ask for new life and a resolve to work for justice; to bring light into the darkness. And most of all, surrender your life to the Holy Spirit, who above all is God.

This Monday starts the first week of Ordinary Time for 2021. Ordinary is probably not a word in our vocabulary these days. With so much concern about the rising COVID-19 cases and deaths, the civil unrest in our country and the social ills that plague us, anything ordinary would be most welcome. So now we have the challenge to put our Baptismal graces to work. How? By knowing your faith, your identity as a Catholic Christian and allowing the power of the Holy Spirit to guide and strengthen you as you try to live day to day in God's presence. May we continue to trust in God's goodness and keep remembering in prayer those suffering from COVID-19, their families and all those also suffering from the economic fallout too.

Due to the rising case numbers of the pandemic, our Parish Social Ministry office will be closed for the month of January. Clients and those in need will still be serviced with gift cards at the rectory Monday thru Friday, 9am till 4pm. At this time, we ask everyone to refrain from bringing food donations to the office. We will let you know when we will once again accept such donations.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from **Parish Social Ministry**, info from **Religious Education** and the **Principal's Corner** of St. Raymond School, an order form for the new round of **Parish Picks** which starts in February, an order form for the special **One Year Memorial Candles**, an invitation to join **FORMED** (your Catholic Faith on demand), and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

READINGS FOR TODAY'S MASS

SUNDAY, JANUARY 10, 2021-THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

FIRST READING

Is 55:1-11

Thus says the LORD:

All you who are thirsty, come to the water! You who have no money, come, receive grain and eat; come, without paying and without cost, drink wine and milk! Why spend your money for what is not bread, your wages for what fails to satisfy? Heed me, and you shall eat well, you shall delight in rich fare. Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life. I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David. As I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander of nations, so shall you summon a nation you knew not, and nations that knew you not shall run to you, because of the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified you. Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near. Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked man his thoughts; let him turn to the LORD for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts. For just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats, so shall my word be, that goes forth from my mouth; my word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it.

SECOND READING

1 Jn 5:1-9

Beloved:

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ is begotten by God, and everyone who loves the Father loves also the one begotten by him. In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith. Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood. The Spirit is the one who testifies, and the Spirit is truth. 
SPECIAL ONE YEAR MEMORIAL CANDLE

As you know, several years ago we have upgraded our devotional candles by both the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph. The older ones were outdated and ready to break down. In addition we have added four new statues in the rear of the church with smaller new candle stands. They are Mother Teresa, St. Therese of the Little Flower, St. Anthony and St. Jude. Hopefully they have enhanced people's prayer and desire to light candles as a sign of their devotion.

Once again we will be having special one year devotional candles at both the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph Statues in the front. These candles surround the base of each statue. There are 24 candles available for each statue. The cost is \$300.00 for an entire year of having a candle lit for your intention. 
Look down with mercy upon us and touch the hearts of our people. Open our minds to the great worth of human life and to the responsibilities that accompany human freedom.
