# Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time! The focus of this Sunday's readings is to show us that the work of building up the Church belongs to all of us. In the first reading from Isaiah, the people are warned against trusting in weapons and walls instead of in God. So, God will replace their leaders with Eliakim, who is a true servant. "I will place the key of the House of David on Eliakim's shoulder; when he opens, no one shall shut, when he shuts, no one shall open." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul offers thanksgiving and praise to the God who saves and sustains all things in life. "For from him and through him and for him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen." And finally, in Matthew's gospel we have the question asked by Jesus about his identity. And when pleased with Peter's answer, he makes him the head of the apostles and future leader of the Church. Peter recognizes Jesus as the Messiah who is also the Son of God. So. Jesus makes Peter the foundation of the Church. "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And so, I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it."

There are many Christian Churches all struggling with the same question: Who is Jesus? Throughout history, people have made different interpretations about who Jesus is; always trying to answer the question: "Who do you say I am?" Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God. Jesus is God's Anointed, the one who carries the message of God. and the presence of God to the world. Each of us was anointed at baptism to also carry that message. Now Jesus stands in the prophetic tradition of Elijah, Jeremiah, and John the Baptist. He is the one who carries a message about justice for all and care for the most vulnerable and needy people. Jesus is the Son of the living God. He is not the son of the false Roman or Greek gods, not the god of states, but the God of all creation, and all the people in it. Jesus' God is active, faithful, and just. That is who the disciples came to realize Jesus was. Peter often got things wrong but not this time. Often, we try to figure out what Jesus is asking of us, and we don't get it right. Perhaps we are looking for the wrong things. Jesus was setting the stage for when he would leave, and he wanted to be able to entrust his mission to those who had faith in him. Peter and the apostles eventually got it and their faith blazed forth into the Church. We are all asked the same question and Jesus wants us to also come up with the same life-changing realization about who he is.

Only when we know this answer in the depth of our hearts will we be prepared to be the kind of disciple upon whom Jesus can continue building his Church.


Jesus gave the keys to the kingdom to this new Church, embodied in Peter but including all who believe. The Church has the power to loosen the constraints of laws that bind too tightly. Our living and dynamic Church can come to a clearer understanding of what is required in each age, changing laws and rules accordingly. Simple rules change as well as difficult ones. Jesus is the one who uses laws for greater freedom; not for keeping us constrained. Then it is up to us to use this freedom and show together that Jesus is the one who brings us to the freedom of God. Remember that we are one Body in Christ!

It contains many items of interest and information with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education and the Principal's Corner of St. Raymond School, an order form for the new round of Parish Picks (still plenty of drawings to get in on), an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Let us keep praying for all those suffering from COVID-19. May they soon regain their health. Let us also remember those who have died from this virus and their families. We pray too, for all medical and emergency personnel who continue to meet the challenges of this health crisis. And may those in research find safe and effective treatments and vaccines that will help defeat this virus.



### Principal's Corner Sister Ruthanne

Today's readings speak of the wisdom and knowledge of God. St. Paul writes: "How inscrutable are his judgements and how unsearchable his ways!" During this time of pandemic, I think that for some of us it is rather easy to fall into a questioning stage about God's wisdom. We may ask why He is allowing this virus to take hold of our world and when it will come to an end. However, that may not be ours to know. It is instead a time for us to show our faith in the Lord, to pray for one another and trust that all will be well again - in God's time, not ours.

Now we have about 15 days before the start of the new school year. Hopefully, everyone is excited to return to class after what seems like an eternity! We all know that things will be different than we have experienced in the past, but at least we will all be together. We are scheduled to begin on Tuesday, the 8<sup>th</sup> with children arriving at 7:45 am. Students from Kindergarten to Grade 5 will use the cafeteria door, while the students in our BRIDGE (6-8) will use the front door. All will have temperature checks before being allowed to enter the building. Once inside the students will report directly to their assigned classrooms. There is not general gathering in the cafeteria or on the front lot. (Unfortunately, that also means there will be no "Coffee and Conversation" for the parents this year. Sorry, everyone.)

Though there are many changes this year, one thing that does not change is the requirement for physicals and immunizations. Now more than ever we need to consider the health and safety of all our children and staff. Please remember that ALL immunizations MUST BE UP TO DATE. Normally at this time I would remind parents and guardians that if they were volunteering for any school program or activity with the children that they must be cleared through Virtus and have a background check. It is not a bad idea to be prepared, but for no extra person is allowed in the building (not even for lunch duty!). Thanks for your understanding.

Please note that Paul Effman Music has contacted the school to inform us that the instrumental music program will be taught 100% online this school year - given after-school, outside of school hours and from home. ### SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM TWO MONTH OLD DEVELOPING BABY

Your spiritually adopted baby is making progress developing all his or her internal and external organs. At just 35 days after conception, the baby has all his or her fingers. Brain waves can be detected at 40 days and the brain is controlling 40 sets of muscles as well as the organs. His or her mother can hear her baby's heartbeat now on an ultrasound stethoscope. The jaw forms including teeth buds in the gums. And it has been reported that at just two months the baby can suck his or her thumb! The eyelids seal during this time to protect the baby's light-sensitive eyes that will re-open in the seventh month. The stomach produces digestive juices and the kidneys begin to function. This tiny human being responds to touch. By eight weeks, the growing baby is now referred to as the "fetus", a Latin word meaning "young one" or "offspring". From this moment on, your spiritually adopted baby grows and refines his or her body. Everything the baby needs to survive once he or she is born is already present by the end of the eighth week. Please continue praying for your little one as most surgical abortions are done between the eighth and twelfth weeks of the unborn baby's life. Also, please check out the posters located at any of the Church's bulletin boards which depict the the unborn baby at two months. Pollster Harrison Hickman spoke to the 1989 conference of the National Abortion Rights Action League and warned his pro-abortion audience:

"Nothing has been as damaging to our cause as the advances in technology which have allowed pictures of the developing fetus, because people now talk about the fetus in much different terms than they did 15 years ago. They talk about it as a human being, which is not something that I have an easy answer to cure."

And right he is, what else can the being the mother is carrying in her womb other than a HUMAN being!





### St. Raymond Memorials

Often people ask if there is something they could memorialize in memory of a loved one. Besides having *Mass Intentions*, there are other opportunities for individuals, families and groups to remember a loved one in a tangible and sometimes lasting way. Some of the weekly liturgical memorials that we have are the *Bread and Wine*, the *Rose for Life* and the *Sanctuary Lamp*. These memorials can be arranged at the rectory.

There are also other liturgical items that are seasonal, like the *Christmas* and *Easter Flowers*, the *Paschal Candle*, *Advent Wreath Candles* and other holy items we can use for religious services. Then we also have a certain lasting type of memorial called a "Memorial Brick" that can be set in one of four beautiful outside locations. 
