Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the *Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time!* The focus of today's readings it to get us to better understand who Jesus Christ is and what he means to us. In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet chastises some of the Israelite leaders who have moved away from God and have neglected the needy. In the form of an oracle, Isaiah depicts what will happen to such leaders. However, Eliakim, always being faithful, will have nothing to fear. "He shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and to the house of Judah. I will place the key of the House of David on Eliakim's shoulder "Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul marvels at God's saving wisdom which is far above any that comes from this world. All glory belongs to him for he has no need of human support. "For from him and through him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen." And finally, Matthew's gospel presents Peter's confession of faith. Jesus wants to know from Peter what are his disciples saying about him as well as other people. Peter speaks up and proclaims: "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." The first part was an acceptable opinion of many people, but the last part: "the Son of the Living God" would not be an acceptable opinion. It would be a violation against the first commandment. However, Jesus accepts and approves of Peter's full answer. In response to Peter, Jesus declares that Peter's answer was a divine revelation and then commissions him as the rock upon whom he will build his Church. Peter is given the keys to the kingdom of heaven and the power to bind and loose on earth and in heaven. All of this will only be able to be fully understood after Jesus is raised from the dead.

We have to remember that Jesus is both God and man in his relationship to us. Not only is he teacher, savior, and redeemer but also the founder of the Church, the Body of Christ on earth. Time and again we tend to forget that our achievements and successes come not from our own human efforts but from the grace and abilities given to us by God. God's grace will extend to us when we act according to his will. He will never forsake us. The mystery of God brings a richness to our lives by helping us understand that not everything can be explained. Faith is not scientific proof although science and faith often complement each other. God's wisdom and grace guide us beyond the mundane concerns of daily life into a great, expansive love that helps us reach beyond our own limited lives.

Peter's response to Jesus lays the foundation for building the Body of Christ in this world. He calls Peter *"the rock"* and the Church will be built on his foundation. We too may have our description of who Jesus is which is a model for us and the Church. Hopefully, our understanding provides the opening for the Holy Spirit to infuse us with the power and grace to follow Jesus as faithful disciples.

STATION THREE

THE MANNA: PREFIGUREMENT OF THE EUCHARIST, THE NEW MANNA "THEN THE LORD SAID TO MOSES, 'BEHOLD, I WILL RAIN BREAD FROM HEAVEN FOR YOU." EXODUS 12:7,11,13

After being freed from slavery, the Israelites find themselves in tough times again. They are wandering in the desert with no food. Many cry out to God and begin to complain about the lack of nourishment. They even talk of going back to Egypt to be slaves in order to have food to eat.

God then tells Moses "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion..."(Ex 16:4). The Israelites would eat of this manna for forty years until they came to the Promised Land (cf. 16:35).

What is the connection with Jesus?

In John 6:41-60, Jesus speaks in reference to the manna that the Jews' ancestors ate in the desert. He explains that even though they received this bread, they still died and could not live in eternity with God.



THE TWELVE STATIONS OF THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST STATION THREE

Jesus is the Bread of Life, the new manna that will never go away and will give our souls life for all eternity. The Jews in Moses' time question the miracle of the manna: "...the Israelites asked one another, 'What is this?' for they did not know what it was" (Ex. 16:15). The Jews in Jesus' time question the same thing. They hear Jesus saying "I am the Bread of Life," and they question Him for they do not know who He really is.

The connection between Jesus and the manna from heaven is expressed in the liturgy. The Antiphon for the Fourth Sunday of Advent says, "Skies, let the Just One come forth like the dew, let him descend from the clouds like the rain. The earth will open up and give birth to our Savior" (Isaiah 45:8).

In the Eucharistic Prayer II in the Order of the Mass, the Priest joins his hands, and holding them extended over the offerings, says:

Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, He joins his hands and makes the Sign of the Cross once over the bread and the chalice together, saying: so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Each week, we will present another of the twelve stations for your meditation for the week.

Week 3 Thought: How can I thank God for giving us the Living Bread at every Mass?

St. Monica's Gift to Her Son, St. Augustine: A Love for the Eucharist Excerpts from America Magazine, November 1, 2018

St. Augustine took his mother Monica (Feast Day: August 27th) for granted for most of her life. As a young scholar, he thought that her Catholic faith was fine for simpletons but not for him. Yet by the time of her death, Augustine had come to realize what he had in his mother: a source of unconditional love, a powerful intellect, and a channel of mystical grace. As Monica laid dying, she looked keenly at Augustine and his brother and said, "One thing only do I ask of you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be." What did Monica mean by asking that she be remembered by her sons "at the altar of the Lord, wherever you may be?"

Certainly, she was referring to the Eucharist, which does not vary in meaning or significance from one church to another. Praying for the dead is in evidence at every stage of the church's development, so Monica was clearly asking that prayers be offered on her behalf at the celebration of the Eucharist. There is also a second reading: Monica was also directing her sons to look for her in the Eucharist, telling them that they would know a deeper communion with her within it than by any visit to a grave site.

We cannot see the saints gathered around the altar of the Lord, but we trust that they can see us. We tend to think of the Eucharist as a meal that stretches back in time to the night in which it was first established by the Lord Jesus. Yet on that very night, Christ himself gave his meal an eschatological orientation. It stretches into the future. The Lord indicated that this meal of his also lies ahead of us when we will be gathered by him into it.

Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and said, "Take this and share it among yourselves; for I tell you that from this time on I shall not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes" (Lk 22:17-18; cf. Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion Saint Augustine Priest & Doctor of the Church († 430)

Feast: August 28

"Recognize in this bread what hung on the cross, and in this chalice, what flowed from His side... whatever was in many and varied ways announced beforehand in the sacrifices of the Old Testament pertains to this one sacrifice which is revealed in the New Testament."

Augustine was born in 354 in what in what is now Algeria. His mother, Monica was a devout Christian while his father Patricius was a pagan who converted to Christianity on his deathbed. Augustine was a difficult child and grew to be an atheist.

A highly intelligent scholar who had received the finest education, he founded a school of rhetoric in Rome in 383. However, dissatisfied with the city, he moved to Milan, and it was there that he met the bishop Saint Ambrose The combination of Monica's perseverance in praying for him and Ambrose's persuasive arguments was instrumental in Austine's conversion in 387. The decisive moment for Augustine is said when he opened a Bible and read in the Letter to the Romans an exhortation to abandon licentiousness and follow Christ.

Among his numerous contributions to Catholic Theology and Western philosophy, St. Augustine's teachings on the Eucharist have been significant, among them:

The Eucharist is the same Body of Christ that hung on the Cross.
The Eucharist should be worshiped before it is received, leading to the liturgical practice of adoration of the consecrated host.

 Christ as the Priest and the Victim in the Eucharist at the Last Supper ... it is the true sacrificial offering of Christ's Body and Blood that was prefigured in all the sacrifices of the Old Covenant. The Eucharist alone is the sacrifice of the "body and blood of the priest himself."

 The sacrifice of the Mass involves the sacrifice of Christ, together with interior self-sacrifice of the members who gather to offer the Holy Mass.

"What you see is the bread and the chalice; that is what your own eyes report to you. But what your faith obliges you to accept is that the bread is the body of Christ, and the chalice is the blood of Christ."

Usually when someone needs surgery, the person inquires first about the doctor's qualifications in the particular field of medicine, has the doctor performed many of this kind of surgery, has the doctor had good results, etc. Then, before the actual surgery, there is a meeting with the doctor to go over the procedure, including how long the surgery will take, what to expect after the surgery and the recovery period. In addition, before the surgery, the person usually has shared the up-coming surgery with family members and/or close friends. However, with abortion, the most common surgery, the setting is much different than the former account. There is no talking about the surgery with family and friends, no checking on the doctor's qualifications. Often times, the person doesn't meet the doctor until she is in the procedure room, already prepped for the abortion. And the doctor may not even live in the community. No detailed information is given about the actual abortion procedure. In fact, some important information is actually kept from the person. The most important difference in the abortion surgery and other medical surgeries is that the purpose of abortion is not to heal but to end a human life. The purpose of other surgeries is to heal or prolong life. "It is morally and ethically wrong to do abortions without acknowledging what it means to do them. I performed abortions. I have had an abortion, and I am in favor of women having abortions when we choose to do so. But we should never disregard the fact that being pregnant means there is a baby growing inside of a woman, a baby whose life is ended. We ought not to pretend this is not happening." (Dr.Judith Arcana, abortionist)
