## Father Chuck's Corner

*Greetings and God's continued Easter blessings be yours on the Fifth Sunday of Easter!* Today's readings point out that Jesus is the cornerstone who directs our lives, always leading us to our heavenly Father. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we see the apostles facing a challenge from within the community. It is a language dispute between those speaking Aramaic and those speaking Greek. To solve the potential rift within the community, seven members were elected to have authority in the community. Through prayer and the Holy Spirit, the Good News continued to be spread and the number of new believers continued to increase.

"The Word of God continues to be spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even large groups of priests were becoming obedient to the faith." Then in the second reading from 1 Peter, Jesus is seen as the stone rejected by the builders which has become the cornerstone. If one believes in Jesus, they become a chosen race and a royal priesthood. "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own, so that you may announce the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light." And finally, John's gospel gives us the start of the "Final Discourse" as Jesus is telling his disciples that he must leave them and return to the Father. This causes much consternation among the disciples. Jesus personifies himself as the way, the truth and the life. Follow him and this is what you will receive. Belief in Jesus leads one to the Father because Jesus and the Father are one. "Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works themselves."

Peter's letter points in two directions. One is toward the building of Christian communities, guided by love and justice. And the second direction is to eternal life knowing that Jesus is the *"way, the truth and the life."* Thus, he is the cornerstone who guides all things and sets all things right. When our faith connects with Jesus, we become a special people. The early Christians were rooted in Jesus and formed into communities of faith, hope and love. Prayer and trust were needed in order to meet the challenges of living peacefully together while the apostles continued to preach and teach the good news. With trust in Jesus, they worked though their difficulties. Success came because they built their lives and communities on Jesus, the cornerstone. John' gospel invites us into eternal life, while acknowledging that is easy to stumble and fall. Living spiritually with Jesus will bring us eternal live in the dwelling place that Jesus has prepared for us. The key is to keep centered on Jesus as the *"way, the truth and the life."* One can only get to the Father through Jesus. The best way to keep grounded in Jesus as the cornerstone is by receiving Holy Communion, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus.

This weekend we celebrated First Holy Communion at two Mases for our Second Graders. St. Raymond Parish congratulates the children on reaching the most important day in their life as a Catholic. To be able to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus in Holy Communion is the most sacred practice Catholics partake of. It gives us full participation in the Mass and unites us to the great gift of salvation that Jesus won for us through his death and resurrection. I congratulate the parents for continuing your role of being the "best of teachers in the faith by what you say and do." Many thanks to our Religious Education Department under the direction of Mrs. Lucy Ostermann and also to her assistants and all the catechists who guided the children to this great day. I look forward to seeing you and your families at the table of the Lord each Sunday going forward.

"Life has a very long history, but each of us has a very definite beginning -the moment of conception". (Venerable Jerome Lejeune) "One of the most renowned 20th century geneticists, Jerome Lejeune is best known for discovering the cause of Down Syndrome, and he is also recognized as a faithful Catholic and pro-life advocate.....After studying to become a doctor, he dedicated his research to helping those with Down Sundrome. In 1958, Lejeune discovered that a chromosome abnormality, trisomy 21, causes Down Sundrome. For this discovery he is considered the father of modern genetics...However, he soon realized that his discovery was leading some women to abort their babies .... He received the William Allan Memorial Award, the highest honor in his field and gave a speech in which he firmly spoke against abortion. 
#### Ocean Financial Federal Credit Union Supports St. Raymond!




