Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The topic of leprosy in today's gospel offers a challenge to action and gratitude. Leprosy is still with us. In the first reading from 2 Kings, Naaman puts aside his pride and practices some humility in following the instructions of the prophet Elisha. Freed of leprosy he goes back to Elisha professing faith in the God of Israel and in his heart, pride is replaced with humility. "Now I know there is no God in all the earth, except in Israel. Please accept a gift from your servant." Then in the second reading from 2 Timothy, Paul says that endures his imprisonment for the sake of Jesus Christ who rose from the dead. He points to Jesus as the best example of faithfulness and pledges his total loyalty. "Therefore, I bear with everything for the sake of those who are chosen so that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, together with eternal glory." And finally, Luke's gospel shows Jesus and the apostles journeying along when they encounter 10 lepers. Jesus is very direct with his healing, and he wants the lepers to show themselves to the priests. Only one returned to give thanks to Jesus for his healing and he was a Samaritan. Jesus points out that he was the only one to return and show gratitude while the others didn't. Furthermore, being a Samaritan is also highlighted by Jesus and he declares him a true man of faith. "Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God? Then he said to him, 'Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.""

In the days of Jesus when a person developed the rash that turned into leprosy, they immediately became an outcast. This disease was very contagious and in ancient times people thought it was a way of God punishing people. It seems that one day you were fine and then next day your world was turned upside down. I think that the COVID-19 pandemic was likewise caused by a combination of known and unknown factors and became as frightening for us as leprosy was to ancient people. And like Naaman doubting the instruction from Elisha we may have doubted the suggested remedies for the pandemic. But let's hope that like the Samaritan in the Gospel, the healing that many of us have experienced has stopped us in our tracks in gratitude. Related to leprosy and the pandemic it is necessary that we embark on bold and sustained action. We need to become aware of what we are doing to the earth, to ourselves and how we treat each other.

As much as everyone longs for peace and security, they are not achieved without hard work, especially those that seek to make civil conditions throughout the world as just as possible for as many people as possible. It seems that world events, tragedies and wars constantly plague our world. But it is because of these conditions that we as Christians, as Catholics, should be doing whatever we can to put an end to them. When war is over or a tragic disaster is finished wreaking havoc, the real work of rebuilding begins. That is the time, now and always, to help in any way we can to bring peace and healing to suffering people wherever they may be.

As we bid farewell to *Father Emanual Patrick* for spending time with us this past month, we wish him well on his continued mission appeals. And now I welcome an old friend, *Father Edmund Barretto* from Goa back to St. Raymond's for a visit during October. Father Ed has been with us several times over the years, and it is always good to have him with us. Look for Father Ed at a Mass near you.

Today is our semi-annual *Parish Blood Drive* from 8am till 2pm in the school cafeteria. The need for blood is very acute in our area and so your donation is of crucial importance. You don't need an appointment, just come over to the cafeteria during this time. Remember, giving blood is giving the gift of life.

At all the Masses this weekend our Human Life Committee once again is sponsoring the **Baby Bot***tle Campaign* as a witness to the sanctity all human life. This fundraiser helps support the Life Center of Long Island which has four pregnancy centers throughout Long Island. By taking a bottle and returning it five weeks later with your donation you will be a big help in support of this most important work.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation, with something for everyone. Of special needs is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, an ad for the Fatima Prayer Vigil this Wednesday evening, October 12, a request for Parishioner Emails to help foster better communication from the rectory, an invitation to join FORMED (Your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. 



SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

'We Give Thanks to God'

We give thanks to God for today's decision of the United States Supreme Court in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization. This just decision will save countless innocent children simply waiting to be born.

On this historic day, our gratitude extends to the millions of heroic Americans who have worked tirelessly toward this outcome for nearly a half-century. Women and men, children and adults, believers and non-believers, people of every culture and background have advocated for life. They have been a charitable and compelling voice for the voiceless, and today, their voice has been heard.

As Catholics, we have prayed and fasted, held vigils, offered Masses, and peacefully witnessed in these last five decades. We have joined others in educating schoolchildren, opening pregnancy care centers, walking with mothers, offering post-abortion counseling, and marching, year after year, to the United States Supreme Court to witness for life. Today, our voice has been heard.

With the entire pro-life community, we are overjoyed with this outcome of the Court. However, we acknowledge the wide range of emotions associated with this decision. We call on all Catholics and everyone who supports the right to life for unborn children to be charitable, even as we celebrate an important historical moment and an answer to a prayer.

We must remember that this is a judicial victory, not a cultural one. The culture remains deeply divided on the issue, which will be evidenced by the patchwork of state statutes pertaining to abortion across the country. To change the culture and build a culture of life, we need to enact family-friendly policies that welcome children, support mothers, cherish families and empower them to thrive. We outlined our vision for a pro-life New York in our recent statement, available here, and we rededicate ourselves to helping every expectant mother to carry her baby to term.

Building a culture of life is not solely the responsibility of the government or those heroic individuals working on the front lines, in crisis pregnancy centers and other ministries. All of us need to respect the dignity and sanctity of human life in everything we do: in how we treat our children, spouses and parents; in the way we behave in our place of work; in sum, how we live Jesus' two great commandments to love God and love our neighbor.

Love, charity and reverence for human life from the moment of conception through natural death - these will build and sustain a culture of life.

Millions of Americans have worked tirelessly for almost 50 years towards this outcome. We thank them with every fiber of our being. Their vital work continues, and we commit ourselves to it.
