Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's Easter Blessings be yours on Divine Mercy Sunday-the Second Sunday of Easter! Now we start to reflect on the lifestyles and values of the early Christian community in the days soon after the death and resurrection of Jesus. In the first reading from Luke's Acts of the Apostles we have a description of the community of faith. It is a real ideal way of life that is guided by the Holy Spirit. They show that there is inspiration as to what is possible when God's plan comes first. And it comes first by the great bond the members had, not selfishly clinging to possessions or property. "All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's **need.**" Then in the second reading from the First Letter of Peter, we have a basic tenet of the Christian faith which says that God has granted us new birth and a lasting inheritance through the resurrection of Jesus. And finally, Johns' gospel describes two post-Resurrection stories. First Jesus appears to a group of his disciples hiding in fear behind locked doors. And then secondly, he appears again, this time with Thomas present. In the first appearance, Jesus starts with offering peace to his friends. Once they recognize Jesus there is great rejoicing. Then when he appears again and confronts Thomas giving him the same experience as he had given the other apostles. Now Thomas has caught up to the others as he makes a full profession of faith. "My Lord and my God." To which Jesus counters with: "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

The days after Jesus' death and burial were difficult ones for his apostles. They though that they might suffer the same fate and so they covered in a locked room. But the words of Jesus gave much comfort: "Peace be with you." There was no finger pointing or castigation. Today the Christian communal lifestyle and values we read about continue through the lives and works of people in intentional communities and the new monastic movement as well as in Catholic groups and with committed individuals throughout the world. A parish can and should be just such a community, embodying the ways of the early Church. The mission of the early apostles was to spread the Good News everywhere. And they were very effective because they relied on the power and grace of the Holy Spirit.

They had a strong spirit of generosity and a commitment to shared resources. As Jesus' words overtake the fear of the apostles, they come to realize that the kingdom of God would be a place of peace. Like the disciples, our mission as Christians sends us out into the world to spread the Good News. And like the apostles we too have the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in this work. Remember that the shared sense of Christian community that we hold as members of the Catholic Church reaches its highest expression in the Eucharist. That's why we "Do this in memory of me."

Today on the Second Sunday of Easter we also celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Divine Mercy means that God loves us and wants us to come to him always for his mercy and forgiveness, which is greater than any of our sins. If we let his loving mercy touch us where needed, we can come to experience the joy of Easter even more deeply. A special Prayer Service will be held today in our church from 2-4pm. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the praying of the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction during this time as well as time for reflective prayer.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Re*ligious Education*, an invitation to new sessions of our parish's *Bereavement Ministry* on Thursday evenings in the school cafeteria, information about the **Sodality of Our Lady's Spring Dinner** on Wednesday, April 19th, an ad for those needing Adult Confirmation, which will be celebrated on Pentecost Sunday, May 27th, an invitation to join **FORMED** (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Second Week of Easter! Keep celebrating the joy of the Easter Season and remember: Church is open between Easter and Christmas. God bless always.







ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE

Special Appeal

St. Raymond's Human Life Committee began in 1970 to oppose the proposed legalization of abortion in NYS. Tragically, the legislation passed and the killing of the unborn, up to 6 months in utero, through abortion, was legalized, 3 years before the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade Decision. Since that time, our Committee has tried to be a visible witness to the plight of the unborn babies through educational programs, providing free prolife literature for our parishioners and students (elementary and high school), prayer vigils outside of abortion facilities, conducting fundraiser for the pregnancy care centers, etc. Our ministry membership was never large in number (10-12 active members), but with the help of you, our fellow parishioners, we were able to successfully conduct many of the above programs and fundraisers. Now, our ministry has but 3 active members, and as life would have it, we are a bit older and what we once could do is now restricted. And so, we are appealing to our parishioners to consider joining the Human Life Committee, so that there will continue to be, in St. Raymond's parish, an active ministry committed to be a voice for the voiceless pre-born babies residing in their mothers' wombs. For the past several years, our meetings were held in the afternoon. Realizing that time is not conducive for many people, we are having a special meeting this month to discuss the possibility of having the meetings at night. Our prayer is that some will attend this meeting, even if only to get information, and our hope is that one or two will decide to join with us in our ministry to pray and work to end abortion. Could it be You?




