

#### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's readings remind us that we are all qualified for leadership through the Holy Spirit. Jesus promises to carry our burdens, freeing us to not only follow his ways but to also lead others into a closer friendship with him. To live a holy life includes prayer, sacrifice and the willingness to serve as a Christian leader in ordinary ways. In the first reading from the prophet, Zechariah, we see the ideal king being a humble leader who serves the God of Israel whom he recognizes as the true king. He serves with justice and relies on the power of God to bring peace to the land. "His dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the river to the ends of the earth." Then in the second reading from Romans, it is through Baptism in Jesus that the Spirit of God comes to dwell within us. The spirit gives new life to our bodies so that we are no longer bound by limitations of the flesh. "For if you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live." And finally, in Matthew's gospel we have Jesus in a dialogue with the Father in which he refers to the rejection he experiences by Israel yet knows he has a strong relationship with his Father. This leads to Jesus' being meek and humble of heart. "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy and my burden light."

The gospel tells us to let go of the burden of being "wise and learned" and focus more on what God has already revealed. A heart that is filled with gratitude for all God has provided, trusting in God's goodness, has no room for fear. Chances are most of us don't look in the mirror and see a leader, yet Jesus calls each of us to lead. At Baptism our natural qualities are enhanced by grace. This type of leadership is not based on intelligence or wealth but relies purely on God's grace. As a leader we bring initiative, willingness to risk, a generous spirit, and above all our faith in God's love. Also, remember that we all have free will, never forced or manipulated to participate in God's will. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit provides the courage to act upon our decisions to follow God's will. Still, being human we will fail to act, to forgive one another, and so we ask for God's mercy which moves us to try again and again. Being apprehensive is a natural feeling. We all make mistakes and Jesus invites us to give these burdens to Jesus to carry for us. Doing this allows us to accept our vulnerability and overcome our fears. Then pray that your words and actions reflect God's love and lead others to the heart of Jesus.

## When the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, why do they still look and taste like bread and wine?

In the celebration of the Eucharist, the glorified Christ becomes present under the appearances of bread and wine in a way that is unique, a way that is uniquely suited to the Eucharist. In the Church's traditional theological language, in the act of consecration during the Eucharist the "substance" of the bread and wine is changed by the power of the Holy Spirit into the "substance" of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the same time, the "accidents" or appearances of bread and wine remain. "Substance" and "accident" are here used as philosophical terms that have been adapted by great medieval theologians such as St. Thomas Aquinas in their efforts to understand and explain the faith.

Such terms are used to convey the fact that what appears to be bread and wine in every way (at the level of "accidents" or physical attributes - that is, what can be seen, touched, tasted, or measured) in fact is now the Body and Blood of Christ (at the level of "substance" or deepest reality). This change at the level of substance from bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is called "Transubstantiation."

According to Catholic faith, we can speak of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because this transubstantiation has occurred (cf. Catechism, no. 1376).

This is a great mystery of our faith—we can only know it from Christ's teaching given us in the Scriptures and in the Tradition of the Church. Every other change that occurs in the world involves a change in accidents or characteristics. Sometimes the accidents change while the substance remains the same. For example, when a child reaches adulthood, the characteristics of the human person change in many ways, but the adult remains the same person—the same substance.

At other times, the substance and the accidents both change. For example, when a person eats an apple, the apple is incorporated into the body of that person—is changed into the body of that person. When this change of substance occurs, however, the accidents or characteristics of the apple do not remain. As the apple is changed into the body of the person, it takes on the accidents or characteristics of the body of that person. Christ's presence in the Eucharist is unique in that, even though the consecrated bread and wine truly are in substance the Body and Blood of Christ, they have none of the accidents or characteristics of a human body, but only those of bread and wine.

Transubstantiation

"If it's just a symbol, to hell with it," American novelist Flannery O'Connor in response to a friend who described the Eucharist as a "pretty good symbol."

In 1551 The Council of Trent declared as a dogma of the Catholic Church that "in the most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ, is truly, really and substantially contained" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1374).

Our belief in Christ's real presence in the Eucharist is based on the words of Jesus in the Bible and the constant belief of Christ's followers from the very beginning to the present day. The biblical reasoning begins in St. John's Gospel, Chapter 6:22-71, where we find the Bread of Life Discourse. When his listeners question "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus doesn't back off and say it's a symbol or clarify what he meant; he doubles-down: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the son of man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." If they thought Jesus was using symbolism, why would his Disciples leave? Father John Carville, Diocese of Baton Rouge

St. Paul I Corinthians 23-27: "For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes. Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord."

Saints Who Promoted Eucharistic Devotion Saint Pius X Pope († 1914) Feast: August 21

"Those who have charge of the children should zealously see to it that after their First Communion these children frequently approach the Holy Table, even daily if possible ..."

In 1910, inspired by the miraculous events surrounding a little girl known as Nellie of God—who had a special Eucharistic devotion and whose body remained incorrupt after her death at age four, Pope Pius X lowered the age of First Communion by issuing the decree Quam Singulari (which means "how singular" or "how special", in reference to Jesus' love for children). He commanded pastors to read the decree to their congregation every year at Easter time.

The decree brought the age of First Holy Communion from twelve down to seven, the "age of reason" at which the sacrament of Confession was first received. It also taught that only a good intention and freedom from mortal sin were necessary to receive Communion, beyond the required fast. "A full and perfect knowledge of Christian doctrine is not necessary either for First Confession or for First Communion."

By this proclamation, Pius X greatly increased access to the Eucharist, a powerful antidote to help all Catholics be "freed from daily faults and...preserved from mortal sins." Adapted from Magnificat Magazine June 2023

# ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE

On the one year anniversary of the Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Health Org. ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court ruling, 31 Catholic members of Congress authored a public statement of principles. falsely invoking specific teachings of the Catholic Church to defend their support of a legal right to abortion. Archbp. Briglio, Pres. USSCB, Bp. Burbidge, Chrmn. of Comm. on Pro-life Activities, and Bp. Flores, USCCB's Comm. on Doctrine issued the following corrective statement in response: "Members of Congress who recently invoked teachings of the Catholic faith itself as justifying abortion or supporting a supposed right to abortion grievously distort the faith. It is wrong and incoherent to claim that the taking of innocent human life at its most vulnerable stage can ever be consistent with the values of supporting the dignity and well-being of those in need. 'Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception', including through civil law. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2270, 2273). Abortion violates this with respect to preborn children and brings untold suffering to countless women....Conscience rightly enjoys a special regard both in Church and in the public sphere... Nevertheless, conscience is not license to commit evil and take innocent lives. Conscience can not and does not justify the act or support of abortion. In fact, conscience 'must be informed and moral judgement enlightened' with the Word of God in faith and prayer, and 'guided by the authoritative teaching of the Church' (CCC 1783,1785). Moreover, the reality that the preborn are our living sisters and brothers is not only a matter of faith, but is attested to by science and reason." It is not uncommon to hear that those who work in abortion facilities. but have not seen nor participated in an actual abortion, believe that they are helping women and doing "God's work." Abby Johnson, a former director of a PP facility, has given testimony that she believed she was helping women until the day she was asked to participate in an abortion and witnessed, in real time, the truth of what abortion is and what it does to the baby. She has left the abortion business, speaks out against this evil, and is helping workers leave their jobs by helping them get employment else where. With her help, over 500 abortion workers have left the abortion business.




