Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time! It has been quite a while since we used the designation of **"Ordinary Time"** for the Church's liturgical year. And by no means can we describe anytime as ordinary these days. It was great to see our parishioners who came to Mass last Sunday as we resumed receiving the Body of Christ. I know that it all seems very awkward. Wearing the masks, keeping distance seating, no missalettes, and receiving Holy Communion after Mass actually ends; all seem very strange. But the important thing is we are back to celebrating Mass as a parish family. All of our Masses and Sacramental celebrations are going to be different for quite a while, but at least we can have them again. And hopefully in the not too distant future there will be more loosening up of these restrictions. Please remember that the obligation to attend Mass is still suspended and if you are feeling sick or are vulnerable due to age and health concerns you are still encouraged to remain at home and view the Mass on tv or online. Continue to make a Spiritual Communion during the Mass you view. Confessions will resume at the 3:30-4:30pm time on Saturday afternoon. Funerals are again being celebrated as well as individual Baptisms, all following the proper guidelines. And we will also resume the weekly Adoration on Thursday afternoon from 1pm till 4pm in the church. The time is meant for personal adoration only. All other devotions will be brought back into the mix as time goes by and we feel comfortable doing so. So, for now, outside of Mass, personal prayer is still the guideline to follow in church.

Today we celebrate Father's Day and so we remember all our Dads, living and deceased. We thank our Dads for all they have done to care for us and especially protect us during the time of Covid-19. And we especially thank you for loving our Moms and being a good teacher to us of how important Jesus is in your life. We wish all our Dads a great day with your family. Time to get that grill fired up!

The message from today's readings is to grow in fearlessness. In the first reading from Jeremiah, the prophet remains confident that God will help even when things seem at their worst. **"Sing praise to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked."**



Then in the second reading from Romans, while it seems that death had a lasting hold on humanity, it is the Risen Lord who has won the victory over death. **"For if by the transgressions of the one the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one-man Jesus Christ overflow for the many."** And finally, Mathew's gospel strings together some loosely connected sayings of Jesus. We are not to be afraid no matter what is happening. If we claim Christ as our Lord and Savior no harm can come to us. **"Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly father."**

By our Baptism we have entered into a serious relationship with God. It is one of **"give and take"** where our giving is to spread the **"good news"** of Jesus Christ. Each of us, not just the ordained or vowed religious are called to be disciples and share the **"good news"** by what we say and do. What exactly is the job description? We are to love and sacrifice for those people we will never know, to try and ease the suffering of the world now and for the future. We are to love and sacrifice for those we know and care about. This is easier, because it seems we often hurt the ones we love. We are to love and sacrifice for our own betterment. This is not selfish but to build up ourselves in order to give better witness to God's love. And finally, we are to love and sacrifice for God. **That is our #1 priority!** It begins by knowing God through his word where we learn a hard truth. God wants something from us. We draw the courage we need and the power to make it happen from the love of Jesus and the community of our Church. Together we can become one of the most powerful forces for love on the face of the earth.




The Eucharistic Adoration is a prayer (it normally lasts an hour, called Holy Hour) that is made before the Blessed Sacrament.

Steps to pray:

- 1. REALIZE WHO IS PRESENT**
Place yourself in the presence of Christ.
- 2. GIVE THANKS**
Be thankful for this moment of prayer and for all the blessings the Lord has given you.
- 3. ASK**
Present Him all your intentions and the intentions of those around you.
- 4. MEDITATE**
In a moment of silence, try to listen to the voice of God.
- 5. ASK FOR FORGIVENESS**
Express your sorrow for the world's sins and your own.



SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM

This week-end we will begin our "Spiritual Adoption Prayer Program". Members of our parish family will have the opportunity to spiritually adopt a baby who is newly conceived this month and who is in danger of being killed through the abortion procedure. You may adopt a baby individually or as a family simply by signing a pledge card (which will be located on the ledges of the front and rear pews of the Church) and praying "The Prayer for Life" (which can be detached from the pledge cards) each day for the next nine months. The signed pledge cards may be deposited in the boxes by the cards. The signed pledge cards will be placed on St. Joseph's altar and remain there for the entire nine months of the program. Each month there will be information in the bulletin about the development of the baby and on the bulletin boards there will pictures of what the baby actually looks like during his or her growth in the womb. Our hope is that these aids will bring a heightened awareness of the baby's humanity and vulnerability and the need for all of us to actively become a voice for these little ones. Your prayers will not only help the baby in danger of abortion but will help his or her mother choose life for her little one and for the father to be the protector of his baby and a support for the baby's mother. Please consider sharing the gift of life and love by making this daily prayer commitment. Thank you! "He will turn the hearts of fathers toward their children and the hearts of children to their fathers." (Malachi 4:6)
