Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's final Lenten blessings be vours as we celebrate Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week! Today begins our week-long movement from the Passion and Death of Jesus to his glorious Resurrection on Easter Sunday. This is the time to really show your Catholic identity and faith by prayer, reflection, repentance, and most of all attending Church services. Today's scriptures affirm that Jesus did not live his life seeking the crowd's praise. Rather he chose to glorify the Father by his life, death, and resurrection. Imagine the setup of this week. Jesus goes from being praised to being hurt by the same people. The first reading from Isaiah shows how the people of Israel have grown wiser from the experience of exile. No more does a wise servant try to resist God's ways. "I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame." Then in Paul's letter to the Philippians, Jesus is shown to be one of us even to the point of accepting death on a cross. "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped." And the two gospel passages used today from Matthew presents the final entry of Jesus into Jerusalem followed by the entire passion narrative. The final entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and his crucifixion are literally earthshattering events.

So, on day one of Holy Week Jesus is as the promised Son of David, the Messiah, with only later in the week for the same people to be clamoring for his death. But the end is Jesus being glorified by the Father. One day Jesus is greeted with palm branches, and a few days later he is hung upon a tree. How could this be? It has to lie in the realization that Jesus as the Messiah, rules not like a worldly ruler. He is a humble Messiah. He was born into humble circumstances. He rides a donkey, not a horse. As Messiah he came to suffer in order to enter the glory of his eternal reign. His suffering, death and resurrection make us a messianic people, a holy, royal, and anointed people. When Jesus rose on the third day, he received a glory that far exceeded what the crowds gave him when they laid palm branches at his feet and shouted "Hosanna."



While Jesus accepted the praise of the people, he did not live his earthly life primarily for this praise. He lived only for the praise and glory of the Father. This is why he offered himself to a painful and shameful death. He knew his death would reconcile all creation to the Trinity and would enable us to glorify the Father in the Holy Spirit. Jesus is now praised not only by the people but by all creation, as well as people not even born yet. Jesus shows us that we also should not seek the praise of our neighbors nor allow happiness or our sense of worth to depend on it. What we need to do is live in communion as best we can with God, and to glorify him alone by our words, prayers and every action. Remember, people are fickle, but God is constantly good to us and never forgets everything we do out of love. May his passionate love for us console us when down and empower us to live for the glory of God.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note besides the Holy Week Schedule is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (especially concerning the Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 15th, the Easter Masses of Remembrance envelopes, the next Bereavement Program starting April 13th, the Communal Prayer before Mass on the inside back cover, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.


Penitential Act

Abstinence & Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.

THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS STATIONS 1-7



THE FIRST STATION-JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DIE

Just as Jesus was wrongfully accused, sometimes people falsely place blame on me to escape the responsibility themselves. And yes, sometimes I also put others down in order to build myself up. When Jesus was condemned to death, even those who had once followed Him went along with Pilate. Do I care more about being accepted by those around me than returning your love? Help me Lord. Be with me Lord.

THE SECOND STATION-JESUS IS GIVEN HIS CROSS

Lord, help me remember the humble and loving way You carried Your cross up to Calvary when I experience life's heavy burdens and strife. Sometimes I think I can't go on. Help me remember I am not alone. You are always with me. May I imitate Your virtues of love, humility and perseverance while dealing with my crosses and offer them up on behalf of my sins, for the sick and less fortunate. Help me to understand that there is nothing You and I can't get through together.





THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. Jesus, You fell under the weight of my sins. I fall by accepting temptation and giving into evil. I fall when I give in to gossip or hurt others. You carry my sins to death so I can be free. THE FOURTH STATION-JESUS MET HIS MOTHER

I need to have the strength and faith of Mary when I am faced with the loss of a loved one. Lord, while I know death is not an end but really a beginning, please give me the strength of faith that Your mother showed, and help me to be strong for the others who are grieving.





THE FIFTH STATION-SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS

I need Your help to get me through these tough situations that I encounter during my day. Help me discover my options through prayer. Please help me to be nicer to those who are against me, and let me be trusting in my relationships with my friends, family and neighbors. I have enough to handle on my own. Why, then, am I further burdened with worry about family members or friends? Why does it always seem to be me who has to take on their problems as well as my own? Lord, show me the way.

He knows He must continue in order to save me and lead me on the path to God. He loves me so much that He just keeps on going-for me. With Your help, I can have the courage and the faith to get up again and continue on. Help me to pray that I will not follow my own way but, instead, the way of the Lord, for which Jesus was sacrificed.

THE EIGHTH STATION-JESUS MEETS THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM

Lord, You have shown me love and compassion for others even when they scorn You. Please help me to look beyond the exterior of others and help me to show compassion as You did. Please don't let me be selfish. Instead, let me always be merciful in my journey through life.



THE NINTH STATION-JESUS FALLS THE THIRD TIME

I Sometimes fear the future. I become afraid of change. I am just so unsure of myself, let alone others. I need confidence. I need to know I am not alone. I need to understand that I am worthy of love and respect. Lord, forgive me for each day of my life that I sin against You. Sometimes I have the best intentions, but I turn away from You anyway. Help me to appreciate all you have done for me. Give me strength and wisdom to seek kindness in others and see myself in the image and likeness of God.

THE TENTH STATION-JESUS IS STRIPPED OF HIS GARMENTS

My possessions are very important to me. I surround myself with beautiful and expensive things. I have far more clothes than I really need, and sometimes I spend money on silly things and forget about others who don't even have necessities. Dear Jesus, you not only sacrificed everything, You laid down Your life for me. Help me to be a strong spiritual follower in faith. Please show me the right way towards eternal happiness by following Your example.





THE ELEVENTH STATION-JESUS IS NAILED TO THE CROSS

O, my God, sometimes I persecute others because they are different. I am embarrassed when I think of some of the things I've said about others. It's so easy to gossip. Sometimes I just don't like people because of their skin color or religion. Give me the courage to not give in to the pressures of putting others down.
