

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's readings point out that doing the works of God brings forth life in abundance so that goodness flourishes. If we fail to follow God's, will we go down the path to disrepair and decay. Maintaining God's kingdom is a responsibility for those who honor his will. In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah uses a song to impress upon the people of Israel that while they had been given everything by God to live in peace and prosperity, they had abused God's graciousness. Therefore, what they have will be destroyed and taken away from them. "The vinevard of the order of hosts is the house of Israel and the people of Judah are his cherished plant; he looked for judgment, but see, bloodshed! For justice, but *hark, the outcry!*" Then in the second reading from the Letter to the Philippians, Paul encourages the people to make requests to God through constant prayer. They should always pursue excellence in all its forms. If the people do all this, Paul says: "Then the God of peace will be with you." And finally, Matthew's gospel is a parable describing the events of salvation history as seen through the eyes of the early Church. It is a sobering question that was asked by the early Christians concerning what happened to us that people end up killing the Messiah who was supposed to save them. Everything had started out well with Israel and then people changed but God persisted until finally: "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes."

God desires justice for his people, for the nation of Israel and for the world. The Israelites were the chosen race, beloved by God. They were to be his witness to the world. But when they failed to produce justice and good fruits by turning away from God, they were not abandoned by God; instead he changed course and continued his plan for salvation through Jesus. When one follows Jesus, they do the work of God and bring justice and good fruits to the world. Ruin and destruction do not come from God abandoning us but rather flows from our own injustice. God is always hoping we learn from our past mistakes, remembering that by following God's ways we can be restored to goodness and life. Jesus was sent to fulfill the law and the Father's will. Jesus says that it is the responsibility for tending the kingdom of heaven on earth to those who follow God's ways do what is honorable and just. This is how the fulfillment of God's plan for salvation will come about.

We who follow Jesus bring his ministry to all the world, a fruit that will remain, and thus the perfection of the kingdom of God is made whole.

This Sunday, October 8th is our semi-annual *Parish Blood Drive* from 8am till 2pm in the school cafeteria. It is not too late to donate even if you haven't made an appointment. Walk-ins are most welcome. Check the bulletin and please consider making this gift of life. It really makes a difference and is greatly appreciated.

As you know we have been dedicating the centerfold of each bulletin to the Eucharistic Revival that is being conducted throughout the Church in our country. I hope that you have been finding this material helpful in your own formation of Eucharistic spirituality. This past week we began the Religious Education classes for all our children from second grade through eighth grade. I was struck by the eagerness and spirit of all the opening gatherings as we once again take these children on a faith journey to enhance their relationship with Jesus, while forming them to become good, strong, and faithful Catholics as they grow older. A most important part of this formation is that our children develop a real appreciation and desire for the Eucharistic presence in their lives. And this starts with our parents supporting and strengthening this effort. To all parents I plea just as we prayed at the baptism of your children: "Be the best of teachers of your children in the faith by what you say and do."

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and information with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an invitation to the Fatima Prayer Vigil on Wednesday, October 11th, info about the Sodality of Our Lady's Communion Breakfast on Sunday, October 15th, the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold, the Communal Prayer Before Mass (found on the inside back cover), an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand and much more. STATION NINE The Bread of Life Discourse: Jesus, the Bread of Life "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that a man may eat of it and not die." -John 6:47-50


Soon after the miracle of the loaves and fish, the crowds come to Jesus asking for more bread. Jesus takes this time to reveal that no bread can give them life except the living bread, which is He Himself:

I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die.

I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.

For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and

drinks my blood remains in me and I in him (Jn. 6:48-51:55-56).

What is the connection to Jesus?

Jesus leaves no wiggle room here. He is speaking calmly but forcefully to all who will hear. He speaks the truth of the Eucharist.

Saint Hilary of Poiters reflects: "It is no longer permitted to me to raise doubts about the true nature of the Body and Blood, for according to the statement of the Lord Himself as well as one faith, this is indeed Flesh and Blood."

Saint John Chrysostom amplifies this further when he writes: Let us in everything believe God, and gainsay him in nothing, though what is said be contrary to our thoughts and sense ...Let us act wise in respect to the [Eucharistic] mysteries, not looking at the things set before us, but keeping in mind his words. For his word cannot deceive.

Each week, we will present another of the twelve stations for your meditation for the week.

Now that we have reminded ourselves of our Baptism (holy water), given reverence to Jesus present in the tabernacle (genuflection), and quietly said our prayers of preparation, we are ready to stand for the Introductory Rites. For most parishes, these rites will begin with a hymn or the Entrance Antiphon.

The General Instruction for the Roman Missal (GIRM, #39) explains the importance of singing: "The Christian faithful who come together as one in expectation of the Lord's coming are instructed by the Apostle Paul to sing together Psalms, hymns, and spiritual canticles (cf. Col 3:16). Singing is the sign of the heart's joy (cf. Acts 2:46). Thus St. Augustine says rightly, 'Singing is for one who loves,' and there is also the ancient proverb: 'Whoever sings well prays twice over'''.

At the beginning of Mass, the common options for the "Entrance Chant" are an Entrance Hymn or Entrance Antiphon. The purpose of singing at this time is "to open the celebration, foster the unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgy, and accompany the procession of the Priest" (GIRM, no. 47). This singing especially reminds us that we are a community, because it is the first act that we all do together at the Mass. "... IN THIS WORLD THERE IS NOTHING OF THE MOST HIGH HIMSELF THAT WE CAN POSSESS AND CONTEMPLATE WITH OUR EYES, EXCEPT HIS BODY AND BLOOD."

Eucharistic Nature of Mary's Role Our Lady of the Rosary Feast: October 7

In the last encyclical of his pontificate, St. John Paul II focused the Church's attention on the Most Holy Eucharist. In doing so, he knew the Church would have no better model for Eucharistic faith than the Blessed Virgin Mary.

In this teaching, he meditates on the Visitation, quoting St. Elizabeth's words, "Blessed is she who believed" (Lk 1:45). St. John Paul II offers this contemplation on the Mother of God: "When, at the Visitation, she bore in her womb the Word made flesh, she became in some way a 'tabernacle'-the first tabernacle in history-in which the Son of God, still invisible to our human gaze, allowed himself to be adored by Elizabeth, radiating his light as it were through the eyes and voice of Mary." He then asks: "And is not the enraptured gaze of Mary as she contemplated the face of the newborn Christ and cradled him in her arms that unparalleled model of love which should inspire us every time, we receive Eucharistic communion?"

Mary shows us the most amazing way to adore the Lord Jesus and to receive him. With her consent and in her womb, the Word was made flesh. The eternal Son of God became her Son for our salvation. She shows us the way to follow him through all the joys, lights, and sorrows of this earth to the unending glory of reigning with him in heaven.

When we pray the Rosary, we are moved to contemplate the face of Christ with his Mother. God is now lavishing the graces of a Eucharistic Revival, a time for the Holy Spirit to work in new ways in our hearts. By the power of the Spirit, we can pray the Rosary with a love that will lead us to adore and receive Christ himself, present in the Holy Eucharist, to the glory of God the Father. In this way, when it is time to approach Holy Communion, we can receive the grace to become living tabernacles of the Lord in a world made for his presence.




"My neighbors and I often say that we are tremendously relieved to have dignified, affordable housing and are very grateful to this ministry of the Church assisting us in our time need."
