Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessing be yours on the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The focus for this Sunday's readings is to allow God to nourish our spiritual lives. In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, the people who had been people in exile are invited to draw closer to God. Israel is encouraged to pursue a right relationship once again with God. ***"I will renew with you the everlasting covenant, the benefits assured to David."*** Then in the second reading from Romans, the people are told that there is nothing on earth, below or above that should shake their confidence in God's love for them. ***"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."*** And finally, in Matthew's gospel we have the miracle of the loaves and fish where Jesus with five loaves, a couple of fish and a prayer to his Father multiplied what he had so that the immense crowd could eat. ***"They all ate and were satisfied, and they picked up the fragments left over-twelve wicker baskets full."***

Eating healthy is about being nourished, sustained, strengthened, and cared for. Our bodies are made to be nourished so they can flourish. And just as we are called to nourish our bodies, so must we care for our souls, so that our spiritual lives can blossom. If we go to our God, he promises to nourish us, feed us, and strengthen us each day so that we can flourish. ***Wherever you are in your relationship with God, he wants you to be spiritually fed and to give you fullness of life.*** God calls each of us to come as we are, not as we wish we were, or who we hope to be one day, but as we truly are. In times of trial, anguish, and difficulty, we often realize what has been true, namely that God is always with us, offering us strength, compassion, direction, and salvation. God is with us during the big moments of our lives and in our ordinary days. Think of a time when you were struggling and you experienced God nourishing you with what you needed at that time (strength, hope, joy or maybe mercy). God wants to feed our spirits in every season, no occasion is too massive or mundane to avoid turning to God with our needs.



Even in our spiritual lives, we can experience lifeless and disconnected from our relationship with God. But just like the abundance of Jesus gifts of healing and feeding, he wants to give each of us abundance in our spiritual lives. He wants our relationship to flourish so that the overflowing of his grace in our lives nourishes not only us but the world around us. To be spiritually fed there are four simple things to do each day. The first is to pray and the Our Father is the simplest and most direct prayer we have. Secondly read some scripture. The Word of God offers us encouragement, hope, healing, joy, and the experience of God's love outpoured. Thirdly we should receive the sacraments when possible for they are a source of healing, strengthening, and restoring our spiritual lives. And finally, we need to practice discernment. Don't consume spiritual junk food. What you read, watch, and scroll through certainly impacts one's spiritual life. Put into practice these four ways and I believe we can experience the tremendous love of God every day.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass or read it on the parish website (www.SaintRaymonds.org). It contains items of interest and information with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from ***Parish Social Ministry***, information from ***Religious Education***, an order form for the new round of ***Parish Picks*** (we really need everyone's help to make this new round a rousing success), an invitation to joined ***FORMED*** (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Let us keep praying for all those afflicted with the coronavirus. May they speedily recover. Let us also keep praying for the safety of all medical personnel and those who care for the sick, plus those working diligently on effective treatments and vaccines. Our regular Mass schedule is still in effect but remember the obligation to attend is not in force and those who are vulnerable due to age or medical conditions should stay home and pray along with Mass online or on TV. Have an enjoyable first week of August. ***Keep cool, calm, and collected. Remember: Worrying doesn't stop bad things from happening, it just stops you from enjoying the good.*** God bless always.

May we walk with God and preach the word of God to all. May the angel of peace watch over us and lead us at last by God's grace to the eternal Kingdom.

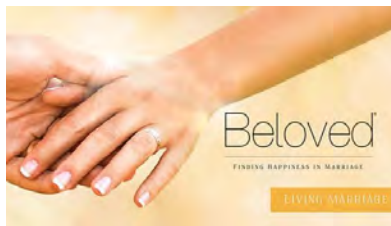
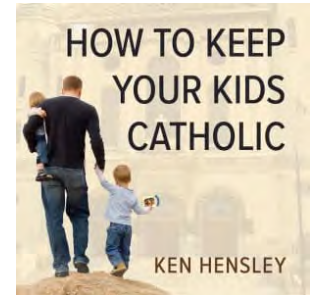
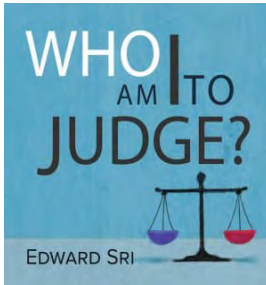




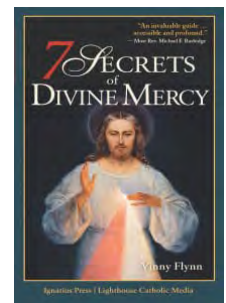
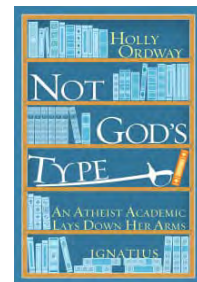
