Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's Lenten blessings be yours on the First Sunday of Lent! We start the Season of Lent by seeing Jesus as a man on a mission. He has total obedience, even in the face of trial and suffering which will ultimately upend the course of history and restore to humanity what had been lost. The first reading from Genesis captures what is so often lacking in humanity's response to God's graces and blessings. Too often people choose to overlook all God has given and instead go their own way. As Genesis shows us, Adam and Eve had all the divine gifts at their disposal. God's protection is also with them, but human pride clouds their judgment, and the first fall of man occurs. "No, God knows that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul explains that Adam's sin brought judgement and death for the world's people, but the one righteous act of Jesus will restore humanity for those who believe in him. "In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so, through one righteous act, acquittal and life came to all." And finally, we have the traditional gospel for the First Sunday of Lent where Jesus is tempted by the devil. Jesus never answers the devil on his terms no matter how intense the temptations get. He makes it very clear that he will worship God and serve God alone. Jesus answers him forcefully, "Again it is written, You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test."

God made the world and all within it very good, giving the breath of life to humanity. But even though God was the source of life, Adam and Eve succumbed to temptation. What follows then is death which Jesus reverses by embracing the cross and opening the gates to eternal life. Often what we think is the answer to our problems isn't what we expected. Oftentimes, it is exactly the opposite of what you would expect. Jesus came to bring peace and eternal life, but in order to do this he had to embrace struggle and even death itself. The easiest path is usually not the answer. Where pride and disobedience were the door to sin and death; Jesus' humble obedience is the door out of it and into eternal life. The original temptation for Adam and Eve and all of us is to replace God with oneself. This is pride. By turning away from the source of all goodness and toward self we all become vulnerable and subject to death.

And in the gospel to start Lent, we see Jesus himself tempted three times, with food, comfort, and power. They seem to be good and reasonable things on their own, but for Jesus, they would lead him on a path away from his mission. If pride and disobedience brought sin and death into the world, then Jesus had to remain humble, accepting even death on a cross. That's how the course set out by Adam and Eve is reversed and we are shown a new path of life to follow. Being humble leads to exaltation. Dying to self leads to eternal life. Again, as for Adam and Eve, the choice is ours.

During this past week, we conducted a clothing drive for the *Midnight Run for the Homeless*. This effort in our parish was led by our Seminarian, Patrick McCormack. Patrick extends a heartfelt thanks to all those who made donations of clothes and money to help this cause be a huge success.

Starting next weekend, the first one in March, all regular envelope users will have received the March/April packet from our new parish envelope company, *The Cathedral Corporation*. I trust that the quality and efficiency of this new company will be a positive and satisfactory one for our parish. If there are any problems or you haven't received your packet before next Sunday, please notify the rectory.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, our parish's updated Lenten Schedule for the month of March, an invitation to Adult Bingo on Saturday, March 4th, an ad for the Lenten Evening of Recollection on Monday, March 13th led by Al Barbarino, a registration form for the Sodality of Our Lady Scholarship Exam, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great First Week of Lent. Get your Lenten smile going with prayer, fasting and good works. Plus remember: When the enemy knocks on your door, just say: "Jesus, it's for you." God bless always.

READINGS FOR TODAY'S MASS

FEBRUARY 26, 2023-FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

FIRST READING

Gn 2:7-9; 3:1-7

The LORD God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being. Then the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and placed there the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God made various trees grow that were delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Now the serpent was the most cunning of all the animals that the LORD God had made. The serpent asked the woman, "Did God really tell you not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?" The woman answered the serpent: "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, 'You shall not eat it or even touch it, lest you die.'" But the serpent said to the woman: "You certainly will not die! No, God knows well that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil." The woman saw that the tree was good for food, pleasing to the eyes, and desirable for gaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

And the gift is not like the result of the one who sinned. For after one sin there was the judgment that brought condemnation; but the gift, after many transgressions, brought acquittal. For if, by the transgression of the one, death came to reign through that one, how much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of justification come to reign in life through the one Jesus Christ. In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so, through one righteous act, acquittal and life came to all. For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so, through the obedience of the one, the many will be made righteous.

GOSPEL Mt 4:1-11

At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread." He said in reply, "It is written: One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God." Then the devil took him to the holy city, and made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down. For it is written: He will command his angels concerning you and with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." Jesus answered 'Again it is written, You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Then the devil took him up to a very high mountain, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence, and he said to him, "All these I shall give to you, if you will prostrate yourself and worship me." At this, Jesus said to him, "Get away, Satan" It is written: The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve." Then the devil left him and, behold, angels came and ministered to him.

Abstinence & Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.












