Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Second Sunday of Lent! Our Lenten journey continues as a time to purify our lives, so we listen more attentively to Jesus in preparation to be transformed by the power of God's love at Easter. The pillars of Lent (prayer, fasting, and almsgiving) are meant to wake us up from spiritual slumber in order to hear what Jesus is calling us to become. In the first reading from Genesis, God is promising Abram that he will become the father of many people, more than the stars counted in the sky. While Abram does profess faith in God's word, there is also an element of human doubt as he struggles to trust fully. To assure Abram, God carries out an elaborate covenant ritual to seal the agreement at which time he said. "To your descendants I give this land, from the Wadi of Egypt to the Great River, the Euphrates." Then in the second reading from Philippians, Paul urges the people to learn from him and others how to live as servants of the Lord. In salvation the faithful will have their bodies conformed to the glorified body of Jesus. "Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, in this way stand firm in the Lord, beloved." And finally, Luke's gospel of the *Transfiguration* is meant to uncover the true identity of Jesus. All of a sudden as Jesus slowly but surely was revealing who he is, there is this dramatic, visual event that invites the disciples to see who Jesus really is, as well as give a glimpse of his future glory. The confirmation of who Jesus is, as the fulfillment of the law in the prophets, shown by the presence of Moses and Elijah; comes from the voice emerging from the cloud, indicating the identity of Jesus as God's beloved Son. "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

God seals the covenant with Abraham in the darkness of night and sleep overcomes Peter, James and John prior to the Transfiguration. We too can be in a spiritual daze. Lent gives us the chance to awaken from this spiritual slumber and recognize Jesus' presence in our lives and how we can be transformed into the saints we are called to become. The practices of prayer, sacrifice and good works help us to move from darkness into the marvelous light of Jesus. Lent prepares us to become a new creation through the risen Jesus. The message of the Transfiguration is to listen to Jesus. Prayer is most necessary to do the required listening. After the Transfiguration, Jesus continues journeying to Jerusalem, not pausing to have a celebration of any kind. Like Jesus and the apostles, we are on a pilgrimage.

Fasting helps us to separate what aids us from what obstructs it. Jesus continues to do good as he journeyed. We need to use God's love and blessings to reveal the love of the Father to all whom we meet. Almsgiving helps promote this way of living. Let us all remember that this holy season of Lent prepares us to become a new creation through Jesus' saving work on the cross. We are born again from the water and blood of Jesus' side, to become the people God has made us to be.

The attendance on Ash Wednesday was very encouraging as it also was on the First Sunday of Lent. Hopefully more people will take the opportunity to come to church for Mass on Sunday and even during the week. There is the additional 12:15pm Mass Monday thru Friday during Lent and the *Stations of the Cross* prayed every Friday of Lent at 7:30pm in the church. I also urge everyone to take advantage of the website *FORMED* (your Catholic faith on demand) which offers a plethora of great spiritual programs for Lent. This platform is free and all you have to do is register which can be done through there parish website (www.SaintRaymonds.org). Don't miss out on this great spiritual aid for Lent and all times of the year. I also again urge everyone to watch the short video on YouTube entitled, "The Veil Lifted." It is a very powerful and moving depiction of the Mass. May we continue to be less contentious due to politics and pandemic mandates. And most of all may we keep our brothers and sisters in Ukraine uppermost in our thoughts and prayers. Through the intercession of the Blessed Mother, may God bring peace and harmony to Ukraine.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, an invitation to the Sodality of Our Lady's Annual Retreat Day on Saturday, April 2nd, information about the St. Patrick's Celebration on Saturday, March 19th, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus, an order form for the new round of Parish Picks (still time to join), an ad about FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great second week of Lent. Keep that Lenten smile going by your prayer, sacrifices and good works and remember: Dig the well before you are thirsty. God bless always.

MARCH 13, 2022-SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

FIRST READING Gn 15:5-12, 17-18

The Lord God took Abram outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so," he added, "shall your descendants be." Abram put his faith in the LORD, who credited it to him as an act of righteousness. He then said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land as a possession." "O Lord GOD," he asked, "how am I to know that I shall possess it?" He answered him, "Bring me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old she-goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." Abstinence and Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS STATIONS 1-7



THE FIRST STATION-JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DIE

Just as Jesus was wrongfully accused, sometimes people falsely place blame on me to escape the responsibility themselves. And yes, sometimes I also put others down in order to build myself up. When Jesus was condemned to death, even those who had once followed Him went along with Pilate. Do I care more about being accepted by those around me than returning your love? Help me Lord. Be with me Lord.

THE SECOND STATION-JESUS IS GIVEN HIS CROSS

Lord, help me remember the humble and loving way You carried Your cross up to Calvary when I experience life's heavy burdens and strife. Sometimes I think I can't go on. Help me remember I am not alone. You are always with me. May I imitate Your virtues of love, humility and perseverance while dealing with my crosses and offer them up on behalf of my sins, for the sick and less fortunate. Help me to understand that there is nothing You and I can't get through together.





THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. Jesus, You fell under the weight of my sins. I fall by accepting temptation and giving into evil. I fall when I give in to gossip or hurt others. You carry my sins to death so I can be free. Help me, Jesus, to really understand all that You have done for me. Help me to make my burden lighter.

THE FOURTH STATION-JESUS MET HIS MOTHER

How does anyone have the strength to watch someone they love suffer and die? Death knows no boundaries and takes everyone. I need to have the strength and faith of Mary when I am faced with the loss of a loved one. Lord, while I know death is not an end but really a beginning, please give me the strength of faith that Your mother showed, and help me to be strong for the others who are grieving.





THE FIFTH STATION-SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS

I need Your help to get me through these tough situations that I encounter during my day. Help me discover my options through prayer. Every day I see people who are suffering or in need of help. They seem to be everywhere. I wish someone would help them. I'm so busy; I just don's have the time. That isn't really true. I guess I just don't want to be involved. I have my own problems, I don't need to take on any more. O Lord, teach me to see Your face in the faces of those who need comfort. You have assured us that random acts of kindness will have their own rewards, if not here and now, then later, with you in the kingdom.





THE SEVENTH STATION-JESUS FALLS AGAIN

In spite of my best intentions, I am so weak and fall again. I try to do the right thing, but temptations are so strong. I know, when Jesus stumbles and falls, He is suffering greatly. He knows He must continue in order to save me and lead me on the path to God. He loves me so much that He just keeps on going-for me. With Your help, I can have the courage and the faith to get up again and continue on. Help me to pray that I will not follow my own way but, instead, the way of the Lord, for which Jesus was sacrificed.

Lord, You have shown me love and compassion for others even when they scorn You. Please help me to look beyond the exterior of others and help me to show compassion as You did. Please don't let me be selfish. Instead, let me always be merciful in my journey through life.



THE NINTH STATION-JESUS FALLS THE THIRD TIME

I Sometimes fear the future. I become afraid of change. I am just so unsure of myself, let alone others. I need confidence. I need to know I am not alone. I need to understand that I am worthy of love and respect. Lord, forgive me for each day of my life that I sin against You. Sometimes I have the best intentions, but I turn away from You anyway. Help me to appreciate all you have done for me. Give me strength and wisdom to seek kindness in others and see myself in the image and likeness of God.

THE TENTH STATION-JESUS IS STRIPPED OF HIS GARMENTS

My possessions are very important to me. I surround myself with beautiful and expensive things. I have far more clothes than I really need, and sometimes I spend money on silly things and forget about others who don't even have necessities. Dear Jesus, you not only sacrificed everything, You laid down Your life for me. Help me to be a strong spiritual follower in faith. Please show me the right way towards eternal happiness by following Your example.





THE ELEVENTH STATION-JESUS IS NAILED TO THE CROSS

O, my God, sometimes I persecute others because they are different. I am embarrassed when I think of some of the things I've said about others. It's so easy to gossip. Sometimes I just don't like people because of their skin color or religion. Give me the courage to not give in to the pressures of putting others down. Dear Jesus, please forgive me and the others like me, and help me, instead to be Your messenger of love and care to all I meet so that they may experience Your love and concern through me.

THE TWELFTH STATION-JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS

Jesus, give me the strength so that I can survive the mysteries of life that are ahead of me. I know I'm going to fall many times. Give me the courage to stand back up. Let me recognize all the good things that surround me each day of my life. Our heavenly Father gave all of us a beautiful world. You even died so our sins would be forgiven. May I be like You in Your perfect example of sacrifice and love. Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.





THE THIRTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS

Lord I am truly sorry for forgetting You. I am sometimes preoccupied by my life when I should be focusing on You. I really don't know why, but I always seem to let all the things in my life crowd you out. Often, when I do pray, I do not concentrate on my prayer. I sometimes just say the words and don't pay attention to what I am saying. Help me to show that You are my first priority by setting aside time for You each day.

THE FOURTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS LAID IN THE TOMB

Dear Jesus, following Your death, helplessness and despair was felt by many. Your death on the cross left those who really knew You empty inside. Lord, when I am feeling empty inside, help me to attain inner strength and peace to make it through the day. Knowing that You love me and believe in me, gives me the reassurance I need. Help me to face my problems, and to remember that You are with me always until the end of time.

New families to the program (grades 1-8) must be registered with the Parish, fill out a New Student


