

# Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Lenten blessings be yours on the Fifth Sunday of Lent! The story of the raising of Lazarus gives us a foreshadowing of Jesus' victory over death for all eternity. In the first reading from the prophet Ezekiel, we have an oracle that takes the despair of the people and brings them back to a good place of hope and restoration with God. Captivity will not last forever. The divine promise is an assertion that he is the Lord. "I will put my spirit in you that you may live, and I will settle you upon your land, thus you will know that I am the Lord." Then in the second reading from Romans, it is the indwelling of the Holy Spirit that keeps believers committed to what is right and pleasing to God. "But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness." And finally, the gospel story is about the raising of Lazarus from the dead. This is the final sign in John's gospel. It powerfully points to Jesus as the giver of life. It seems Jesus knew what he was going to do, which is why he didn't rush to be with Lazarus. He doesn't mourn the death of Lazarus, but rather uses his death to teach a lesson which reveals something about himself. Now both Martha and Mary profess a belief in the resurrection on the last day, yet don't quite get what Jesus is talking about when he says: "Whoever believes in me even if he dies will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." When Jesus comes to the tomb, he simply orders Lazarus to come out of the tomb and be untied and released to live again. This is how Jesus shows that he is the giver of life, as he reveals later when he claims to be the way, the truth, and the life. "Now many of the Jews, who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him."

The saying, "the greatest comeback since Lazarus" has been applied to the world of sports as well as politics and various other situations. Harry Truman in 1948, Japan after WWII or the US Olympic Hockey team in 1980. The raising of Lazarus is featured on the walls of Roman catacombs, on frescoes and sarcophagi. His tomb in Bethany is still visited today. Imagine being Lazarus and how he reacted to coming back to life and what people thought of him at the time. I would imagine that his time in a tomb changed him, and he realized that the greatest enemy, namely death had been put down by Jesus. Well, he certainly hit the jackpot on that. And us, how do we identify with the other characters in the story?

Do we have the anguish of Martha and Mary who wanted Jesus to do something to prevent Lazarus from dying in the first place? Are we like Lazarus, bound to a dead-end job. Worried about health issues? Maybe we are like the bystanders watching from a distance: uninvolved, uninterested-and safe? I believe that Jesus challenges us today so that there will be no bystanders. "Unbind him and let him go." We can call by name isolated and lonely people. Lament with those who sorrow, warm hearts that are cold. Release those who are bound, raise up those in fear and lift the spirits of the despairing. Ultimately, we can bring light to those entombed in darkness. Jesus certainly gives death a "one-two" punch in this story. But it's nothing like the knockout punch that he gives it at the Resurrection. Death becomes but a fleeting thing, a brief interlude.

This coming Wednesday evening, March 29th, there will be a special Holy Hour from 7-8pm in the church. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Scripture, Reflection, Music and Benediction to help us prepare our minds and hearts for Holy Week. What better way to set the tone for Palm Sunday and the Triduum than to spend some time with the Lord in prayerful adoration. Come join us and bring a friend.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass (don't leave it in the pew). It contains many items of interest in invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education, the updated Lenten Schedule with the schedule for Palm Sunday Masses and Holy Week, the Easter Masses of Remembrance envelopes, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Have a great Fifth Week of Lent. Keep your Lenten smile going. Why? Because you're on to something good. And remember: Be the things you love most about the people who are gone. God bless always.

# GOSPEL

Jn 11:1-45

Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. Mary was the one who had anointed the Lord with perfumed oil and dried his feet with her hair; it was her brother Lazarus who was ill. So the sisters sent word to him saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disci-ples, "Let us go back to Judea." The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you, and you want to go back there?" Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." He said this, and then told them, "Our friend Lazarus is asleep but I am going to awaken him." So the disciples said to him, "Master, if he is asleep, he will be saved." But Jesus was talking about his death, while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disci-ples, "Let us also go to die with him." When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them about their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying, "The teacher is here and is asking for you.' As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still where Martha had met him. So when the Jews who were with her in the house comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out, they followed her, presuming that she was going to the tomb to weep there. When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping, he became per-turbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go." Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

# Abstinence & Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat/poultry on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired and excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fast and abstinence.






























## THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. Jesus, You fell under the weight of my sins. I fall by accepting temptation and giving into evil. I fall when I give in to gossip or hurt others. You carry my sins to death so I can be free. Help me, Jesus, to really understand all that You have done for me. Help me to make my burden lighter.

## THE FOURTH STATION-JESUS MET HIS MOTHER

How does anyone have the strength to watch someone they love suffer and die? Death knows no boundaries and takes everyone. I need to have the strength and faith of Mary when I am faced with the loss of a loved one. Lord, while I know death is not an end but really a beginning, please give me the strength of faith that Your mother showed, and help me to be strong for the others who are grieving.





# THE FIFTH STATION-SIMON OF CYRENE HELPS JESUS CARRY HIS CROSS

I need Your help to get me through these tough situations that I encounter during my day. Help me discover my options through prayer. Please help me to be nicer to those who are against me, and let me be trusting in my relationships with my friends, family and neighbors. I have enough to handle on my own. Why, then, am I further burdened with worry about family members or friends? Why does it always seem to be me who has to take on their problems as well as my own? Lord, show me the way.

# THE SIXTH STATION-VERONICA WIPES THE FACE OF JESUS

Every day I see people who are suffering or in need of help. They seem to be everywhere. I wish someone would help them. I'm so busy; I just don's have the time. That isn't really true. I guess I just don't want to be involved. I have my own problems, I don't need to take on any more. O Lord, teach me to see Your face in the faces of those who need comfort. You have assured us that random acts of kindness will have their own rewards, if not here and now, then later, with you in the kingdom.





# THE SEVENTH STATION-JESUS FALLS AGAIN

In spite of my best intentions, I am so weak and fall again. I try to do the right thing, but temptations are so strong. I know, when Jesus stumbles and falls, He is suffering greatly. He knows He must continue in order to save me and lead me on the path to God. He loves me so much that He just keeps on going-for me. With Your help, I can have the courage and the faith to get up again and continue on. Help me to pray that I will not follow my own way but, instead, the way of the Lord, for which Jesus was sacrificed.

### THE EIGHTH STATION-JESUS MEETS THE WOMEN OF JERUSALEM

How difficult I find it sometimes to think of others particularly when I am troubled or hurting. Sometimes I get so wrapped up in myself that I shut others out, and I wonder if I can go on. Lord, You have shown me love and compassion for others even when they scorn You. Please help me to look beyond the exterior of others and help me to show compassion as You did. Please don't let me be selfish. Instead, let me always be merciful in my journey through life.



### THE NINTH STATION-JESUS FALLS THE THIRD TIME

I Sometimes fear the future. I become afraid of change. I am just so unsure of myself, let alone others. I need confidence. I need to know I am not alone. I need to understand that I am worthy of love and respect. Lord, forgive me for each day of my life that I sin against You. Sometimes I have the best intentions, but I turn away from You anyway. Help me to appreciate all you have done for me. Give me strength and wisdom to seek kindness in others and see myself in the image and likeness of God.

## THE TENTH STATION-JESUS IS STRIPPED OF HIS GARMENTS

I have far more clothes than I really need, and sometimes I spend money on silly things and forget about others who don't even have necessities. ## THE ELEVENTH STATION-JESUS IS NAILED TO THE CROSS

O, my God, sometimes I persecute others because they are different. I am embarrassed when I think of some of the things I've said about others. It's so easy to gossip. Sometimes I just don't like people because of their skin color or religion. Give me the courage to not give in to the pressures of putting others down. Dear Jesus, please forgive me and the others like me, and help me, instead to be Your messenger of love and care to all I meet so that they may experience Your love and concern through me.

### THE TWELFTH STATION-JESUS DIES ON THE CROSS

Jesus, give me the strength so that I can survive the mysteries of life that are ahead of me. I know I'm going to fall many times. Give me the courage to stand back up. Let me recognize all the good things that surround me each day of my life. Our heavenly Father gave all of us a beautiful world. You even died so our sins would be forgiven. May I be like You in Your perfect example of sacrifice and love. Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace.





### THE THIRTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS

Lord I am truly sorry for forgetting You. I am sometimes preoccupied by my life when I should be focusing on You. I really don't know why, but I always seem to let all the things in my life crowd you out. Often, when I do pray, I do not concentrate on my prayer. I sometimes just say the words and don't pay attention to what I am saying. Help me to show that You are my first priority by setting aside time for You each day.

## THE FOURTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS LAID IN THE TOMB

Dear Jesus, following Your death, helplessness and despair was felt by many. Your death on the cross left those who really knew You empty inside. Lord, when I am feeling empty inside, help me to attain inner strength and peace to make it through the day. Knowing that You love me and believe in me, gives me the reassurance I need. Help me to face my problems, and to remember that You are with me always until the end of time.
