

## Father Chuck's Corner

Alleluia! Alleluia! Jesus Christ is risen today! God's special blessings be yours on this Easter Sunday, as we celebrate the start of the great Fifty Day Feast. What a joy it is this day to celebrate our incredible God, a God who loves us more than we could ever imagine. There is truly only one word that can express the hope that fills our hearts. **Only** one word will do-Alleluia! In a sense we are gathered here in church because of one thing, one event, one act, one miracle--the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. This one profound experience is the totality of the Christian message. This experience has been unfolding for the faithful for over 2000 years as we try to understand more clearly what it meant back then and what it means today. We can see Easter as the day on which we are saved, rescued from the darkness of sin and death. Easter is also seen as the day of redemption when Jesus restored our rightful relationship with the Father, something we could never do on our own. Easter is the day to truly accept God's forgiveness and let go of the burdens we have been carrying around. And may we also see today as a day of overwhelming hope, realizing the possibility of life with God for all eternity. Today, try to discard cynicism and pessimism, and replace them with deep hope, confidence, and trust in God and in each other.

Easter is the day when we can see evidence of God keeping his promises. His is a profound faithfulness that we aspire to but sadly fall short of time and again. Today might be a day to start being there for someone in your life who could really use a true friend. Easter should also be seen as a time we pledge to make the world a better place, more like the world God created. See every single thing, every person as beautiful and worthy of our care. We should also be able to see a holy pattern for each of our lives. This is the Paschal Mystery whereby God brings something good out of something painful or tragic. Today be grateful for the blessings you are aware of and those known only to God. Today there is clear evidence that love always wins, that God always wins. Today teaches us to always choose the loving thing, no matter how difficult. All of these things show us the incredible power of Easter unleashed into the world through the saving acts of one man, one God, one divine person willing to go where we are so often unwilling to go. He remained faithful, no matter the cost. He refused to become anything but his truest self. And he showed us completely and for all time what love can achieve, a love with no conditions and that doesn't count the cost.

Ultimately, Easter is not just a hope for something that comes when our earthly lives end. No, Easter means something for each of our lives right now, in this time and place. Jesus wants to help us live right now the most beautiful, loving, meaningful lives ever. So, let him. *He is risen! Alleluia!*



## Intercessions

We likely recognize the phrases "We pray to the Lord" and "Lord hear our prayer" from the General Intercessions at Mass. After the Creed, as a conclusion to the Liturgy of the Word, the community prays together, asking God for various needs. This part of the Mass has several names, including the Prayer of the Faithful, General Intercessions, Universal Prayer, or Petitions.

As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal teaches, "In the Universal Prayer or Prayer of the Faithful, the people respond in some sense to the Word of God which they have received in faith and, exercising the office of their baptismal Priesthood, offer prayers to God for the salvation of all. It is desirable that there usually be such a form of prayer in Masses celebrated with the people, so that petitions may be offered for holy Church, for those who govern with authority over us, for those weighed down by various needs, for all humanity, and for the salvation of the whole world" (GIRM, 69).

Of course, praying together as Christians has been part of our life from the beginning. As the author Charles Belmonte notes, "To pray for the needs of the Church and of the world is an early Christian custom. St. Paul admonishes Timothy, one of his disciples: 'First of all, then, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity.' (1 Tim 2:1–2)" (Understanding the Mass, p. 104). Thus, it shouldn't surprise us that this part of the Mass stretches all the way back to those earliest descriptions of the Mass, including the one by St. Justin Martyr (+165 AD).

### The Church United in Prayer

The names "General Intercessions" and "Universal Prayer" instruct us on the composition of these prayers. They are prayed in a general way for wide-ranging needs, typically following a pattern of praying for the needs of the Church, for public authorities and the salvation of the world, for those burdened by any kind of difficulty, and for



the local community. Often, the final intercession will include prayers for the deceased. While these prayers

are envisioned to be "general," the General Instruction of the Roman Missal does note that for a particular celebration like a Confirmation or a wedding, "the series of intentions may be concerned more closely with the particular occasion" (GIRM, 70). After the series of petitions, the Prayer of the Faithful ends with the concluding prayer said by the priest, asking God to accept our petitions.

As the name "Prayer of the Faithful" indicates, from the baptized members of the earliest times the congregation (the faithful) took part in this prayer (those who weren't yet baptized were dismissed after the readings and homily so that they could further study and prepare to be received into the Church). In a wonderful way, the Prayer of the Faithful highlights one of the great privileges we have as God's people: being able to join together in asking God for what we need. Having just listened to God's Word and professed together our Faith through the Creed, we are then standing united together in faith as we ask God for what we need. Jesus has told us that our prayers are powerful when even two agree on what to pray for (Matthew 18:19). Just imagine how powerful our prayer is when the whole Church is joined together in union. It is amazing to think about!

#### For Reflection:

• Take time to reflect on Matthew 18:19, which Father Luke alludes to above: "Again, [amen] I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father." Consider your experience of praying with others for particular needs, and bring these insights to your next participation in Mass.

 Prepare your heart to enter fully into the Prayer of the Faithful, or Universal Prayer, by considering how you desire to pray for the world at this time. Listen attentively to the prayers of the congregation and unite your heart to this universal prayer.

## Easter and the Holy Eucharist by Servant of God Fr. John A. Hardon, S.J.

We do not usually associate Easter and the Holy Eucharist. But we should. Our faith tells us that God became man in order that, by His death on the Cross, He might redeem the world. But this same faith tells us that, when Christ died on Calvary, the Church came into existence. We may therefore say that we were delivered from sin by the Savior's death, and receive the blessings of His grace through the Mystical Body which came into being the moment Jesus expired on Good Friday.

## The Eucharist is the Risen Christ

At the Last Supper, when Christ pronounced the words, "This is my Body" this is the chalice of my Blood," the Body and Blood that were to be nailed to the Cross and shed on Calvary. As some of the Church's earliest commentators explain, on Easter Sunday night when Jesus sat down with the disciples at Emmaus, they recognized Him in the "breaking of bread," which was the Eucharist. Since the Resurrection of Christ, the Holy Eucharist is indeed the true, living Body and Blood of Christ. But it is now the Risen Christ in His glorified humanity. What are we saying? We are affirming an article of the Catholic faith. In the late eleventh century, when the monk Berengarius denied the Real Presence, he was told to profess what has since come to be known as the Eucharistic Creed:

I believe in my heart and openly profess that the bread and wine placed upon the altar are, by the mystery of the prayer and words of the Redeemer, substantially changed into the true and life-giving flesh and blood of Jesus Christ the Lord, and that after the consecration, there is present the true Body of Christ which was born of the Virgin and offered up for the salvation of the world, hung on the cross and now sits at the right hand of the Father, and that there is present the true blood of Christ which flowed from His side. They are present not only by means of a sign and of the efficacy of the Sacrament, but also in the very reality and truth of their nature and substance (Gregory VII, 1079).

Words cannot be clearer. Christ in the Eucharist is now the Risen Savior who is seated at the right hand of His heavenly Father and will come on the last day to judge the living and the dead.

## Eucharist: The Presence of Mercy

In His great love for us, the Lord Jesus gave us a great miracle of mercy: the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

God did not only become man in the Incarnation to give His life for us on the cross and to rise again in glory. The Incarnation

also looked forward to Jesus remaining with us to the end of time in the Eucharist. By this great miracle of Our Lord's love, the Real Presence of Jesus remains with us under the form of bread and wine.

The Eucharist is central to devotion to The Divine Mercy, and many of the elements of the devotion are essentially Eucharistic - especially the Image, the Chaplet, and the Feast of Mercy. The Image, with its red and pale rays, represents the Eucharistic Lord Jesus, whose Heart has been pierced and now pours forth blood and water as a fountain of mercy for us. It is the Image of God's sacrificial gift of mercy made present in every Mass.

Several times in her Diary, St. Faustina writes of seeing the red and pale rays coming, not from the Image, but from the Sacred Host; and once, as the priest exposed the Blessed Sacrament, she saw the rays from the Image pierce the Host and spread out from it all over the world (see 441). So too, with the eyes of faith, we should see in every Host the merciful Savior pouring Himself out as a fountain of mercy for us.



He wrote: "Christendom has had a series of revolutions and in each one of them Christianity has died. Christianity has died many times and risen again; for it had a God who knew the way out of the grave."

This Easter and every Easter we celebrate this Everlasting Man who knew his way out of the grave and who invites us and the Catholic Church on Long Island to a great Resurrection.
