**Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
September 22, 2019**

Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time! The main thrust of today's readings is to realize that God's gifts are always given to be shared for our good and the good of others. In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Amos, there are visions leading up to a pronouncement of judgments against the northern kingdom of Israel. Amos had been trying to steer the people in the right direction, but they refused to listen. As a result, the end is coming, and their world will collapse. God is very aware of the schemes of those who oppress others. The desire for earthly gain causes some to trample the poor and needy. Yet God will protect those victimized by the schemes of others. **"The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Never will I forget a thing they have done."** Then in the second reading from 1 Timothy, Paul exhorts the people to always pray as a community for the salvation of the world. **"This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth."** And finally, in Luke's gospel we have a story told as an example. It is a hard story to interpret because it's wrapped up in the business practices of first-century Palestine which appear very strange to modern readers. At the heart of the story is Luke's conviction that those who have possessions should share them with the needy and use them to benefit others. That emphasis holds together the parable of the dishonest steward and its interpretation. **"You cannot serve both God and mammon."**

Paul's exhortation to pray for everyone is also a hard concept to grasp, just as it is also hard to realize that God's love and his gifts are for everyone. Jesus says in today's gospel that God's gifts are always given to be shared. Some background is necessary to understand what Jesus was getting at. In his time slavery was well known. The steward mentioned in the gospel was most certainly a slave. This steward was only another object, a **"thing"** assigned for another steward to watch over-like oil or wheat. But this steward knew something that the master did not; that all of God's gifts are given to be shared because the greatest gifts of all are good relationships. Jesus was condemning the master and an economic system that turned people into **"things."**

True wealth comes from relationships, not things. If we believe what we say in the Creed at Mass each Sunday than every human life comes from God. From conception to natural death, all human beings are God's gifts to every other human being, related to God and each other. Our lives are made to be freely shared in relationships of love and trust, never simply used or abused. Maybe the steward also had some things to learn about being responsible. Sincere prayer for others points us in the direction of sharing God's gifts from our hearts with both generosity and gratitude. At this Eucharist may we realize that God is sharing the greatest gift of all with us, God's very self, so that we can share that gift of love, of sacrifice, and of prayer with others.

At this time, I would like to welcome our old friend, **Father Joseph Rwamwenge** back for a visit to St. Raymond Parish. Father Joseph has been a friend of mine for 20 years and has been a regular yearly visitor to our parish since 2011. Father Joseph will be with us till the end of the year sharing his priestly ministry with our parishioners. We wish you, Father Joseph, a restful and joy-filled time once again at St. Raymond's. Look for Father Joseph at a Mass near you.

Next weekend we are scheduled to begin our **"Enhanced Offertory Program"** sponsored by The Cathedral Corporation. There will be mailings and presentations made at all the Masses, starting the weekend of September 29th. This program has been sanctioned and recommended to all the parishes of the diocese, especially those facing regular decreased offertory collections. I hope that we can all prayerfully and with open minds and hearts respond favorably for the benefit of St. Raymond Parish.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from **Parish Social Ministry**, info from **Religious Education** and the **Principal's Corner** of St. Raymond School, an order form for the **2019 Backwards Money Drawing**, an information sheet about **FORMED** (your Catholic faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

Many retired priests in our Diocese, who have given their life in union with Jesus, find a home at St. Pius X Enriched Living Facility in Amityville.

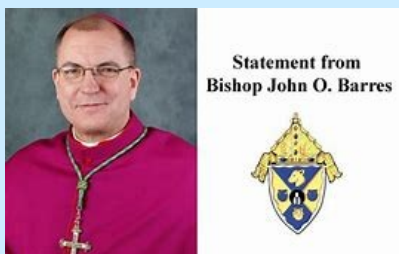

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PRAYER PROGRAM THREE MONTH DEVELOPING BABY

Your baby is quite active in the womb now - although his or her mother won't feel the baby's movement for another couple of months. Unique fingerprints are evident and never change! The baby now sleeps, awakens, and exercises his muscles by turning his head, curling his toes, and opening and closing his mouth, moving his tongue - often sucking his thumb! His palm, when stroked, will make a tight fist. He breathes amniotic fluid to help his respiratory system. By just 12 weeks, all organs and systems of his body are functioning. The only major activity from now until his birth is growth - the increase in his size. The baby you are praying for now weighs one ounce. What a miracle he is! (The baby is referred to as "he" in order to make for easier reading. We know that the baby may be a girl, or for that matter, twins or triplets. Yes, twins and triplets are also destroyed through abortion.) You may view an accurate picture of the unborn baby at this time of his growth on the bulletin boards located at each of the Church's entrances. Please stop and view these pictures so that when anyone talks about abortion or the "right to choose", you will have a picture in your mind of whose life is being chosen to be killed in order to "terminate" a pregnancy. You will see that the rhetoric of "a blob of tissue" or a "clump of cells" does not accurately describe these little ones in the womb. Please continue praying for your spiritually adopted baby and his mother and father. As you know, do to the recent enacted law in NY State, these babies will not be safe from abortion throughout their entire nine months in the womb. Did you know? It used to be thought that a baby had not developed the proper nerve cells to feel pain. Some even thought they didn't feel pain until well after birth. Recent studies have shown that this not the case, and that babies are able to feel sensations, including pain, very early in their life. Through ultrasound and fetal evidence, we know babies do feel pain during most abortions. (Vanhatalo & Van Nieuwenhuizen, "Fetal Pain? Brain & Development, 2000). This information given is not to harm anyone, but to educate all of us to the truth about abortion so that we may not be fooled any longer by the lies and the misuse of language the abortion industry has used to help legalize and promote this evil as a good, a "woman's right".

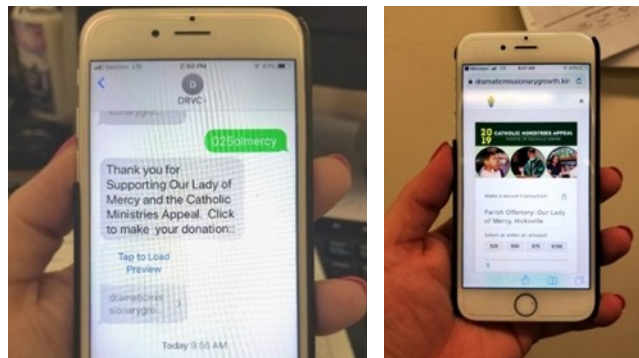

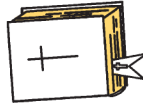

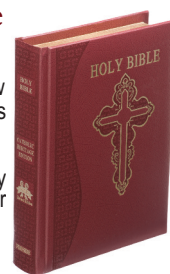
