

Father Chuck's Corner

Alleluia! Alleluia! Jesus Christ is risen today! God's special blessings be yours on Easter Sunday as we celebrate the start of the great Fifty Day Feast! Let us rejoice and be glad! "Christ is risen!" These three simple words make all the difference in the world for you, for me and for the Church. Without these three words our faith would be a foolish endeavor, and our hope would be folly. Centuries of liturgy, art, philosophy, not to mention, the lives of the saints and the sacraments would be utterly incomprehensible. And in the end without these three words, our efforts to transform our lives and the world would be foolhardy. We proclaim that Jesus Christ conquered death for all and that crucifixion, suffering and death do not have the last word. We profess that in the resurrection of Jesus we have both our path to eternal life and our paradigm for Christian living. As Christians we are called to practice resurrection in crucified places.

Crucified places are the personal, individual, and collective places that experience suffering and oppression because of sin, injustice, isolation, war and violence. We experience them also in our personal lives, within our families and in our communities. How does one practice resurrection? It means following in the footsteps of Jesus, working to bring about reconciliation, healing, and new life wherever there is suffering and oppression. As far as sin is concerned, in our personal lives our past mistakes can be a constant source of suffering. Through the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Reconciliation we can practice resurrection as Jesus offers us new life and forgiveness of sins. When it comes to injustice, practicing resurrection can mean taking steps, no matter how small, to work for justice and freedom from oppression. When it comes to isolation, remember that after the crucifixion, the apostles were scattered. Their fear, sadness and disorientation drove them into isolation. Practicing resurrection means taking meaningful steps to share life in friendship, mutual support and in authentic connections. In our families there can be crucifixion too for the ones we love can hurt us the most. Think of Peter and his betrayal of Jesus. How painful that must have been for Jesus. So, practicing resurrection means taking steps toward reconciliation and forgiveness in our families, accepting responsibility for our failures and committing to new ways of thinking and behaving.

Like crucifixion, resurrection is both an individual and communal reality. Our communities suffer the crucifixion of racism, sexism, poverty, addiction, and in many other ways. But new life as resurrection can come through s sense of belonging to a community. Practicing resurrection means taking the steps to build a loving, welcoming, and life-giving community. Hopefully, St. Raymond Parish and all parishes strive to do just this. *Remember: Christ is risen is more than an historical claim.* It is an enduring call to bear witness to the resurrection in our daily lives, to follow Jesus and practice resurrection in crucified places.

I want to give special thanks to all the people who have helped to make Lent, the Triduum and Easter a special time of prayer and celebration for our parish. Many thanks to our **Decorators and Rosary Altar Society** for the care and attention given to our church, to our *Maintenance Staff* for their timeless efforts in keeping our buildings and grounds in terrific shape., to our *Rectory Staff* for being the face of Jesus to all who come and call, to our Social Ministry Office and St. Vincent de **Paul Society** who bring Easter joy to so many of our neighbors in need, to our Religious Education **Department** for teaching our children the lessons of our faith, especially for Lent and Holy Week. Thanks also to all our Liturgical Ministers (Ushers, Altar Servers, Sacristans, Lectors and *Eucharistic Ministers)* who prayerfully aid us in worship and to our *Music Ministry (Adult Choir,* Folk Group and Cantors) for their inspiring music of glory and praise now and all throughout the year. Thanks also to our *Deacons* and my fellow *Priests* who always strive to serve our people with style and grace. 





THE FIRST STATION-JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DIE

Just as Jesus was wrongfully accused, sometimes people falsely place blame on me to escape the responsibility themselves. And yes, sometimes I also put others down in order to build myself up. When Jesus was condemned to death, even those who had once followed Him went along with Pilate. Do I care more about being accepted by those around me than returning your love? Help me Lord. Be with me Lord.

THE SECOND STATION-JESUS IS GIVEN HIS CROSS

Lord, help me remember the humble and loving way You carried Your cross up to Calvary when I experience life's heavy burdens and strife. Sometimes I think I can't go on. Help me remember I am not alone. You are always with me. May I imitate Your virtues of love, humility and perseverance while dealing with my crosses and offer them up on behalf of my sins, for the sick and less fortunate. Help me to understand that there is nothing You and I can't get through together.





THE THIRD STATION-JESUS FALLS THE FIRST TIME

I am like you, Jesus, in that I take up my own cross. But my cross is made up of my sins, temptation and Materialism. I carry my cross through my life, like You, Jesus, carried Your cross to Calvary. 
THE THIRTEENTH STATION-JESUS IS TAKEN DOWN FROM THE CROSS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

Every Easter, you and I are reminded of the power of the Paschal Mystery. Commemorating the celebration of the first Eucharist at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, walking with Jesus on the road to Calvary on Good Friday in the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, and celebrating Christ's triumphant conquering of sin and death in the Mass of the Resurrection on Easter is a potent reminder of God's love for us.

During this season of Easter and this time of National Eucharistic Revival, it becomes even clearer to us that the Paschal Mystery is not a mere historical event, but a mystery in which we are privileged to participate every time we celebrate the Mass. In the Easter sequence, we sing: "Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer your thankful praises!" The word, *Eucharist*, which means, *thanksgiving*, implies that every time the Church gathers for the celebration of the Mass, she offers an act of "thankful praise" to the Lord. In this act of offering thanksgiving to God in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we as a priestly people offer the sacrifices of our lives with the offering of the Body and Blood of the Lord, by which our sacrifices take on new value and meaning (see, CCC, §1368).

Love is central to the mission of the Church. The sacrifices that we offer to God each day and in the celebration of the Eucharist are an expression of our love for him and for his people. When Christ appeared to Peter and the apostles on the Sea of Galilee after his Resurrection, he asked Peter: "Do you love me?" As he responds, "yes, Lord" to that three-fold questioning, Christ calls him to mission: "feed my lambs...tend my sheep...feed my sheep" (see John 21:15-19) Like Peter, you and I are faced with that same question from the Lord: "do you love me?" In other words, do we take the contemplative time that our hearts yearn for to renew our love for the Lord? In the offering of our time in prayer we are reminded of the very nature of God's love. Through that experience of true love, we realize that as disciples of Christ, you and I are called to mission: to bring the love of Christ to world; to glorify the Lord by our lives; to extend the Divine Mercy to those who suffer; to let the earth shake with the joy of the Resurrection!

Every human heart is created to love. As we grow deeper in our devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus as a Diocese this June, we ask the Lord to strengthen our hearts to love as Jesus loves and for the zeal to proclaim to those we encounter that "God is Love" (1 John 4:8,16).

I wish you and your families a blessed Easter Season!



ST. RAYMOND'S HUMAN LIFE COMMITTEE

According to the Center of Disease Control (CDC), the majority of abortions are now done chemically through a 2 pill regimen, mifepristone and misoprostol. Originally, a girl/woman needed to seen by a doctor and obtain a prescription for these abortion pills. The Food and Drug Administration, has removed these restrictions. "This means there's no physical exam, there's no ultrasound to make sure that the gestational age is correct, to make sure the pregnancy is not in the fallopian tube where it could rupture. There are no safeguards to make sure a woman is not being coerced into an abortion. No one doing labs to determine if she has an RH-negative blood type and needs a RhoGAM shot to prevent future pregnancy complications." (Dr. Ingrid Skop, OB-GYN, senior fellow & director of medical affairs at the Charlotte Lozier Inst.) "Chemical abortion has a complication rate 4 times higher than surgical abortion. 1 out of 5 women will suffer a complication. Chemical abortions are over 50% more likely than surgical abortions to result in an ER visit within 30 days affecting 1 in 20 women. Some abortion advocates encourage women to lie. to their doctors if they need urgent care and say they are having a miscarriage. However, if a chemical abortion is miscoded as a miscarriage in the ER, the woman is at significantlu greater risk of needing multiple hospitalizations & follow-up surgery ". (The Catalyst, Vol.50, No.3, April, 2023) We bring attention to this again because now local pharmacies are dispensing these chemical abortion pills over the counter and the ease of obtaining them may fool us into thinking, "It must be safe, don't even need a doctor's prescription". These are powerful medications. Babies are killed by them and who knows which girls or women will suffer the serious effects. physically, emotionally, spiritually, of these abortion pills?


Through Campus Ministry, there is much hope for our Catholic Faith on Long Island.


