Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Feast of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of *Christ)!* Today's readings powerfully remind us about what centers us as Catholic Christians, namely the celebration of Mass as a remembrance of Jesus' sacrifice of his body and blood for our salvation. In the first reading from Deuteronomy, we see Moses speaking to the people who have been on a 40-year journey in the desert to the Promised Land. He reminds them of how God provided for all their needs, from food, and water to protection. "He therefor let you be afflicted with hunger and then fed you with manna, a food unknown to you and your fathers, in order to show you that not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the Lord." Then in the second reading from 1 Corinthians, Paul reaffirms the tradition handed down to him that the cup and bread we bless is truly Jesus Christ. "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" And finally, in John's gospel the Eucharist is treated in a lengthy discourse about the bread of life. John connects the Eucharist with the feeding of the Israelites in the desert and with the Body and Blood of Jesus for the life of the world. "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

From the earliest times, Christians have observed rituals centered around a meal focused on bread and wine. Bread was a staple of the Hebrew diet and wine was a common drink in biblical times. One of Jesus' early resurrection appearances was to two disciples on the road to Emmaus. He was only recognized by the two disciples in the breaking of the bread. A sense of community is solidified when people gather together around food. That's the principle our Eucharistic liturgy is built upon. You could argue that in today's world, spiritual nourishment is more important than physical nourishment. Most of us are blessed to have access to healthy food and drink. However, our souls often ache with the troubles in our lives and in the world. The United States is built on principles of individualism, but it seems that it has reached a level in this time and place where our individual beliefs, wants and needs leave us rather than unite us. The sense of community that is so critical to who we are as human beings has been fractured, most recently by the pandemic that isolated us for months.

Much of our sense of community has migrated to social media, which can only offer a pale facsimile of true community. More than ever, we need to remember and celebrate our communal nature. It is most profoundly and meaningfully found in our Holy Mass where we re united and affirmed in the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

The United Conference of Catholic Bishops has designated this time as one of a Eucharistic **Revival.** It is no secret that there has been a lessening in the Catholic appreciation and worship of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is an article of our faith that the bread and wine used at Mass truly becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus. Its appearance remains the same, but its essence is physically changed. That is why worshipping at Mass and receiving Holy Communion is the most important spiritual practice a Catholic can do. It is what makes us uniquely Catholic and unites us with his body, blood, soul, and divinity. The Eucharistic Revival is aimed at bringing a greater awareness, appreciation, and participation in the Eucharist amongst Catholics. Today's feast of Corpus Christi is our parish's starting point for this revival. There is a centerfold section of the bulletin with information about this feast. We will continue to print material to aid your own participation in this revival. In addition, we will initiate certain Eucharistic gatherings for praise and adoration in the coming months. The Communal Prayer Before Mass will continue to be prayed before each Sunday Mass to gather us as one mind and heart for this most profound mystery of our faith. Let us all use this time to grow in our appreciation and unity with Jesus as we "Do this in memory of me."

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and information with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), an invitation to the Fatima Prayer Vigil this Monday evening, June 12th from 7-8:30 pm in the church, the Eucharistic Revival centerfold, the Common Prayer Before Mass (on the inside back cover of the bulletin) an invitation to join FORMED your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

History

2023 marks the 759th celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi
(Latin for "Body of Christ") – also known as the Solemnity of the Most
Holy Body and Blood of Christ. St. Juliana of Liège (1192-1258) possessed a
deep devotion to the Holy Eucharist and, she played a key role in the creation
of the Feast of Corpus Christi, first instituted in Belgium (1246) before being
made a global feast by Pope Urban IV (1264).

In 1263 a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena [Italy] while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He... [was] a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. While celebrating Holy Mass above the tomb of St. Christina (located in the church named for this martyr), he had barely spoken the words of Consecration when blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal. The priest was immediately confused. At first, he attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted the Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, where Pope Urban IV resided. The Pope listened to the priest's account and absolved him.



He then sent emissaries for an immediate investigation. When all the facts were ascertained, he ordered the bishop of the diocese to bring the Host and the linen cloth bearing the stains of blood to Orvieto. With archbishops, cardinals and other Church dignitaries in attendance, the Pope met the procession and, amid great pomp, had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen corporal bearing the spots of blood is still reverently enshrined and exhibited in the Cathedral of Orvieto. It is said that Pope Urban IV was prompted by this miracle to commission St. Thomas Aguinas to compose the Proper for a Mass and an Office honoring the Holy Eucharist as the Body of Christ. One year after the miracle, in August of 1264, Pope Urban IV introduced the saint's composition, and by means of a papal bull instituted the feast of Corpus Christi. The beauty and innocence of a baby touches people. As an expression of that love, we will begin our Spiritual Adoption Prayer Program next week-end. Members of our parish family will have the opportunity to spiritually adopt a baby who is newly conceived this month and in danger of being aborted. You may adopt a baby individually or as a family simply by signing a pledge card (which will be located in the pews of the Church) and praying "The Prayer of Life" (which is attached to the pledge card) each day for the next nine months. The detached, signed pledge card may be deposited in the boxes located at each of the Church's vestibules. The signed pledge cards will be placed on St. Joseph's altar and remain there for the entire nine months. Each month, in the bulletin, there will be information about the growth of the baby and a picture of the actual development of the baby at that month. Our hope is that this will bring a heightened awareness of the humanity, beauty and vulnerability of the babies in womb and the need for all of us to be a voice for them. Your prayers will help not only the baby in danger of being aborted but will help his or her mother to choose life over death for her little one and for the father to be the protector of his baby and a support for the baby's mother. 
