Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessing be yours on the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time! And Happy Father's Day to all our dads. Thanks for all you do for us and also for loving our moms. The focus of today's readings is to encourage the followers of Jesus to live out his vision in their lives. We are his messengers in our time and place and are called to contribute to the building of God's kingdom on earth. In the first reading from Exodus, the Israelites are about to become God's chosen people at Mt. Sinai. Moses as the mediator, reminds the people of God's many gifts to them, especially their deliverance from Egypt. With all the goodness God has given the Israelites, it is only fitting that they show gratitude and be loyal to the covenant God established with them. "Therefor if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine." Then in the second reading from Romans, Paul emphasizes that Jesus proved his love for us by dying on the cross even while we were helpless sinners. The result is that we have been saved. "But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." And finally in Matthew's gospel, Jesus starts out by showing compassion and then calling the Twelve Apostles to go forth in his name and do the same work he is doing. "As you go make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons."

Trying to put a jigsaw puzzle together is kind of like living one's life of faith in a relationship with God. Like a puzzle where you start with the border and then fill in the rest of the design, a life of faith starts with the covenant of the Old Testament which gave structure and boundaries to the Israelites. If they kept faithful to the covenant their lives would have order and safety. Without the border, the picture falls into chaos. Each of us has the puzzle of our own life with the goal of seeing how that picture fits into God's universal picture. Eventually there is only one piece left which is the one that takes us home to God. If we follow God's ways, we become one of God's favored possessions. If we follow God's ways we will be held together in harmony, just as a puzzle border holds the puzzle together. If we live in God's ideal picture, Jesus' mission will be complete. So, the question for each of is: How do I live my life as a favored daughter and son of God? Jesus could not complete his work by himself, he sent apostles to do what he did: preach, teach, and heal. When we were baptized, we also were sent on a journey of life to follow this same mission, to help set the world in balance and harmony.

The ultimate finished puzzle is God's kingdom, which according to Jesus is already among us. To bring the kingdom to conclusion we must always be counterculture, witnessing to the Gospel of love at all costs. So, when you put in the last puzzle piece of your life, will the resulting picture reflect your baptismal call?

At this time, I would like to welcome *Father Eric Dadson* from the Diocese of Secondi Takoradi in Ghana to St. Raymond Parish for the next two months. I have known Father Eric for 25 years and he has visited us here twice, the last being in 2019. On behalf of all our parishioners I welcome you, Father Eric, once again to St. Raymond Parish and hope you have a restful and joyful time sharing your priestly ministry with our parishioners. Look for Father Eric at a Mass near you.

Please take time to read the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold in the bulletin. Like I mentioned last week, we will continue to have printed data in the Sunday bulletin as well as plans for gatherings and prayer opportunities as we move along during the revival period. I would recommend that everyone take time on FORMED to view the presentation entitled "Presence" which is about the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass as well as watch the short YouTube video entitled "The Veil Removed." Both will surely enhance your appreciation and devotion to the Eucharist.

Please remember to take home a copy of the bulletin when you leave Mass today. It contains many items of interest and invitation with something for everyone. Of special note is news and needs from Parish Social Ministry, info from Religious Education (Faith Formation), the Eucharistic Revival Centerfold, information about the Father's Day Novena of Masses which starts today, an invitation to join FORMED (your Catholic Faith on demand) and much more. To keep informed, keep a copy of the bulletin at home each week for quick and easy reference.

This week-end we begin our annual Spiritual Adoption Prayer Program and are asking our parishioners to participate in this prayer program. This program is very simple - no meetings, no dues, no work. It consists simply of making a commitment to pray "The Prayer for Life", daily, for the next nine months for a baby that is in danger of being aborted. You will find pledge cards, containing "The Prayer for Life", and pens in the pews of the Church. Simply sign the pledge card, detach the signed pledge card, keep "The Prayer of Life" and after Mass place your signed pledge card in the plastic boxes located at each of the Church's entrances. Each month, from July until March, there will be a description of the growth of the baby for that particular month. Your faithful prayers will make the difference between life and death for this special babu. FYI: When the committee chose the Spiritual Adoption Prayer Program for our parish, we had it begin on Father's Day week-end in June. This was intentionally done to acknowledge the importance of fathers in family life to the mothers and the well-being of the children. And when we checked to see when the nine months ended, it fell in March on the feast day of St. Joseph, faithful and courageous protector of Mary and Jesus! A great role-model for boys and men.

"He will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers. (Malachi 4:6)

We wish all fathers a very Blessed and Happy Father's Day! During weekly Adoration on Thursdays, from 3:00 pm - 3:30 pm, we pray The Chaplet of Divine Mercy and the Rosary of Our Lady for the intention of "an end to abortion and the return to the respect, dignity and protection of all God's children, from conception until natural death." We invite all to join us.




