

## Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's blessings be yours on the Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time! One given in being a person of faith, and especially a Christian, is that God's ways are different from ours. Once again, our readings are about the mercy and forgiveness of God. Even though we are made in the image and likeness of God, we are not God-which is good. Remember that his ways are not ours, nor his thoughts our thoughts. In the first reading from the prophet, Isaiah we see the people more willing to listen to God as a result of being in exile for many years. They are made aware that God has always remained near to them, even when they have shattered the bond made with God. Isaiah encourages the people to take advantage of the enduring love and forgiveness that God is offering them. "Seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near." Then in the second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians, while looking forward to eternal life, Paul recognizes that he must continue to work in God's vineyard. Others still need his preaching and teaching to bring them closer to Christ. "I long to depart this life and be with Christ, for that is far better. Yet that I remain in the flesh is more necessary for your benefit." And finally, in Matthew's gospel we have the parable of the workers in the vineyard. A careful reading seems to point to the primary theme of God's extraordinary generosity contrasted with the exploitation practices of many landowners. In response to the complaints of some of the workers about their pay Jesus responds: "Are you envious because I am generous? Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Any time is a good time to turn from our sinful ways and ask for God's mercy and forgiveness. We can find God no matter where we look. He is within us, in the world in which we live and in the people whom we encounter. We may have times when we don't feel that God is near. Simply listening may not be enough. It is the habits of our lives that can bring us closer to God or keep us at a distance from his presence. When we truly open our minds and hearts to know God, we realize that his justice is beyond our human understanding. What God sees as acceptable is not the way our society would respond. While we may see payment and reward as something merited proportionately, God's plan has everyone sharing equally. It's hard to imagine any of us being as generous as the gospel's vineyard owner and yet this attitude is at the heart of equity for the poor and disenfranchised. We can be assured that God's gifts are given freely and without limits. Our job is to be grateful recipients of his love and mercy.

As you know this is *IHM Weekend at St. Ray*mond Parish. After a rousing "Nuns on the Run **Bingo**" night on Saturday we will be honoring Sister Ruthanne and Sister Lorraine at the 12 o'clock Mass followed by a parish reception in the school cafeteria. All are most welcome to come to show your own personal thanks and best wishes for the Sisters. While it is a sad parting after all these years, both Sister Ruthanne and Sister Lorraine are starting a new ministry for the IHM Congregation in Scranton, PA. On behalf of the entire St. Raymond Parish Family, I extend warmest appreciation and best wishes to Sister Ruthanne and Sister Lorraine as they begin a new phase in their life's mission to serve God's people. May God bless you both and may Our Blessed Lady keep you close to her heart and though her to her son, Jesus Christ. Ad Multos Annos!



## GOSPEL Mt 20:1-16a

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vinevard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vinevard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

## STATION SEVEN

THE WEDDING FEAST AT CANA: WATER TO WINE, WINE TO BLOOD "JESUS SAID TO THEM, 'FILL THE JARS WITH WATER.' AND THEY FILLED THEM UP TO THE BRIM. ...[T]HE STEWARD OF THE FEAST TASTED THE WATER NOW BECOME WINE...AND SAID TO HIM, 'EVERY MAN SERVES THE GOOD WINE FIRST ... BUT YOU HAVE KEPT THE GOOD WINE UNTIL NOW.' "JOHN 2:7,9,10

Little is known about the first thirty years of Jesus' life. He comes bursting onto the scene when He performs His first miracle:

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So, they filled them to the brim.

Then he told them, 'Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter.' So, they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from (although the servers who had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the

bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now" (Jn. 1-5, 7-10).

#### What is the connection to Jesus?

He once in Cana of Galilee, turned the water into wine, akin to blood, and is it incredible that He should have turned wine into blood? When called to a bodily marriage, He miraculously wrought that wonderful work; and on the children of the bride chamber, shall He not much rather be acknowledged to have bestowed the fruition of His Body and Blood?

The sign of water turned into wine at Cana already announces the Hour of Jesus' glorification. It makes manifest the fulfillment of the wedding feast in the Father's kingdom, where the faithful will drink the new wine that has become the Blood of Christ.

Each week, we will present another of the twelve stations for your meditation for the week.

Week 7 Thought: Just before Jesus turned the water to wine, Mary told the wedding attendants, "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5). Do I follow Mary's advice and do whatever Jesus tells me?

#### Step By Step Walk Through the Mass Do This in Remembrance of Me By Father Luke Spannagel National Eucharist Revival Blog Genuflection

As we arrive at the church to join with Christ in his perfect offering to the Father, our first gesture at the church door is to bless ourselves with holy water. After we have recalled our Baptism by making the Sign of the Cross with water from the font, the next thing we do is look for a place to sit. Before we slide into the pew, however, if the Blessed Sacrament is present in the sanctuary of the church, we genuflect.

You will see the priest and servers genuflect at times during the Mass. When the tabernacle with the Most Blessed Sacrament is present in the sanctuary of the church, the priest and servers genuflect when they approach the altar at the beginning of Mass and when they depart from it after the final blessing (General Instruction for the Roman Missal, no. 274; Ceremonies of the Modern Roman Rite, no. 199). The priest also genuflects at the altar after the elevation of the consecrated host, after the elevation of the chalice, and before receiving Holy Communion (GIRM, no. 274). The priest's genuflection at these points in the Mass helps us recall the incredible gift of Jesus present in the Most Holy Eucharist. Since during Mass, the focus is on the altar, you will notice that at other times during the Mass, the ministers bow as they cross the sanctuary.

What is a genuflection, and why do we genuflect? The simple answer is that when we genuflect, we touch our right knee to the floor to honor Jesus, who is really present in the tabernacle! The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines genuflection as "a reverence made by bending the knee, especially to express adoration of the Blessed Sacrament" (CCC, Glossary). By genuflecting or bowing deeply in a spirit of prayer and as a sign of adoration of the Lord, "we express our faith in the real presence of Christ under the species of bread and wine" (CCC, no. 1378). Francesco Forgione was born on May 25, 1887, in Pietrelcina, a town in the Southern Italian region of Campania. In 1897, he was drawn to the life of a friar after listening to a young Capuchin who was in the countryside seeking donations. At the age of 15, Francesco entered the novitiate of the Capuchin friars at Morcone and took the name of Fra (Friar) Pio (Italian for 'Pius'), in honor of Pope Pius I, whose relic is preserved in the Santa Anna Chapel in Pietrelcina. In August 1910, he was ordained and served as a teacher at a seminary as well as a spiritual director.

In September 1918, Padre Pio began to display the wounds of Christ on his hands and feet, known as stigmata. His reputation of holiness grew rapidly, attracting hundreds of believers daily to the monastery. To penitents who went to him for confession, Padre Pio shared his five rules for spiritual growth: weekly confession, daily Communion, spiritual reading, meditation, and examination of conscience. His advice on the practical application of theology he often summed up in his now famous quote: "pray, hope, and don't worry". He directed Christians to recognize God in all things and to desire above all things to do the will of God.

Padre Pio loved the celebration of Mass and the reception of Holy Communion. He fully believed that Jesus was truly present, body, blood, soul and divinity during the celebration of Mass. This great gift inflamed in his own heart a deep and abiding love of God. He said, "At times during the Mass I am consumed by the fire of Divine Love. My face seems to burn."

Encouraging the practice of Eucharistic Adoration, Padre Pio counseled "Kneel down and render the tribute of your presence and devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Confide all your needs to him, along with those of others. Speak to him with filial abandonment, give free rein to your heart, and give him complete freedom to work in you as he thinks best."






