#### Father Chuck's Corner

Greetings and God's continued Advent blessings be yours on the Second Sunday of Advent! There is great hope in today's readings in addition to great challenge. It is the normal tension that permeates all our Advent preparations. In the first reading from Isaiah, there is hope built in the assurance that even from the remnants of a grand tree, even from a stump, new life blooms. No matter what has torn us down or stunted our growth, blossoms can still bud in our lives. "On that day, a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom." Then in the second reading from the Letter to the Romans, Paul preaches unity amongst the people so they may with one voice glorify God. "Whatever was written previously was written for our instruction, that by endurance and the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope." And finally in Matthew's gospel hope is essential in the midst of trying to practice repentance. We need to remember that God promises to enter into our broken relationships if we allow him to. John the Baptist asks us to prepare by repenting. We are called to turn away from the idols of power, money, comfort, self-reliance, distraction, or anything else that we might be in the place where only God should stand. We are to allow the purifying fire of God's love to clear space for the new growth he desires during this Advent season. "Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." Do this with silence, prayer, scripture and worship. Listen for God's voice and raise your hearts to him in worship.

While we all disagree about many things, there is one thing we should all be on the same page about. We should all be working toward creating the kind of world that God wants. But how can we do that when our differences feel almost unfixable, un-mendable, un-reconcilable. Too often I work for the kind of world that I want and hope for, what I think is best. Sadly, I too often leave out the most important criteria. What kind of world does God want? Today we hear John the Baptist, crying out for us to repent. Not tomorrow, or next year, but now. For if God's world has a chance of us helping to build it, we must change our hearts-now! We have heard this every year during Advent, and to an extent we do heed these words.

Yet often I know that I only do some minor tweaking at best. I don't really let the Holy Spirit baptize me with his purifying fire. We all have to agree on what this world should really look like, how it can resemble the world God wants for us. It is a world of true peace, a world of understanding, kindness and compassion. It is a world of generosity and humility. And it is a world of justice, tenderness and love. Jesus didn't come into this world to leave it unchanged. No, his coming was meant to change it forever. The best gifts we can give to God is to want the same, meaningful, loving world that God wants us to help bring about.

Have a great Second Week of Advent. Keep sharing hope and this week peace with everyone you meet. And remember: Hope is the ability to hear the music of the future. Faith is having the courage to dance to it today. God bless always.

#### GOSPEL Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken when he said: A voice of one crying out in the desert, Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. John wore clothing made of camel's hair and had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. When he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones. Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand. He will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

# SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT TIME WEEKLY GUIDE FOR PERSONAL PRAYER



### Come & See

Until you do, you will never know

#### **Summary of the Readings for the Week**

On the Second Sunday of Advent (Year A), we are called to prepare, to ready our hearts and lives through repentance, welcome, and hope, so that



we might truly receive the Savior who is coming. The Gospel gives a stark call to conversion and readiness when John the Baptist declares, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" ... prompting us to turn from sin and make straight the paths for the Lord's coming.

For the Second Week of Advent, the Catholic Church honors Mary in three celebrations with each one emphasizing a different dimension of her role in salvation history. Each Marian feast brings a message of tenderness and reassurance: purity (Immaculate Conception), home and nearness (Loreto), and loving protection (Guadalupe). These speak to the heart of Advent, a season that teaches hope in darkness and trust in God's promises.

Monday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Patroness of the United States of America: Holyday Day of Obligation with special Mass readings) in which we honor that Mary was preserved from original sin from the first moment of her conception in her mother, Saint Anne's, womb.

Wednesday is the Optional Memorial of Our Lady of Loreto which recalls Mary's "yes" and the mystery of the Incarnation. Friday is the Feast of Our Lady of



Guadalupe (with special Mass readings) recalling that Mary is mother of the poor, the marginalized, and the entire American continent. This underscores Advent's missionary dimension: Christ comes for all, and Mary leads all people to Him.

The Church also honors three saints, inviting us to adopt their dispositions: humility before God, readiness of heart, trustful faith, and fidelity to the Gospel as we await the coming of Christ: Saint Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin (Layman; Optional Memorial on Tuesday), Saint Damasus I, (Pope; Optional Memorial on Thursday), and Saint Lucy (Virgin and Martyr; Memorial on Saturday.

The First Readings for this week are mostly from the Book of Isaiah calling Israel to hope in God's saving action, trust in His divine justice and protection, and watchful waiting for the fulfillment of God's promises. Excluding the special readings for the Marian feasts, the daily Gospel readings for the second week of Advent are taken from the Gospel of Matthew. In Matthew 18:12–14 (Tuesday), Jesus tells the Parable of the Lost Sheep, saying that a shepherd leaves the ninety-nine to search for the one lost sheep. The key theme is God's merciful, personal love which illustrates that every single person matters to Him.

On Wednesday, (Matthew 11:28–30), Jesus invites all who are weary and burdened to come to him for rest. Jesus offers rest for our souls, not burden. On Thursday (Matthew 11:11–15), Jesus speaks of the greatness of John the Baptist yet says the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than John, as with Jesus, a new stage of salvation begins.

Finally, on Saturday (Matthew 17:9a, 10-13) at the moment after the Transfiguration, when the disciples ask Jesus: "Why do the scribes say that first Elijah must come?" Jesus explains that Elijah has already come (referring to John the Baptist), but people did not recognize him, and so he suffered. Believers are called to discern God's action among them, even when it does not match expectations.

Looking ahead to the Third Sunday of Advent, the Gospel assures us that the presence of the Messiah is already making a difference in the world: the blind see, the lame walk, the poor hear good news, all signs that the kingdom has begun among us, reminding believers to trust not just in words, but in God's works.

#### Daily Prayer This Week Conversion & Readiness

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
(Matthew 3:2)

The Second Week of Advent asks me to go deeper into conversion of my heart, moving from simply "waking up" spiritually during the First Week to actively allowing God to reshape my attitudes, desires, and priorities.

Saint John the Baptist calls me to honest repentance, reminding me that preparing for Christ means clearing away whatever in my heart does not bear fruit for God: "Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance" (Mathew 3:8).

The Father Who Seeks Me
"It is not the will of your
heavenly Father that one of
these little ones be lost"
Matthew 18:14



Jesus reveals the Father's relentless love; He searches for the one who has strayed and rejoices when it is found. As I enter this Advent week, I am invited to let God find me in the places where I feel distracted, overextended, or spiritually distant, trusting that His desire is never to lose me but to restore me.

My Prayer: Father, seek out the places in my family where healing and unity are needed, and bring us back together in Your peace.

Rest in Christ "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest." Matthew 11:28 Jesus' invitation to come to Him with all my burdens speaks directly into the pressures, responsibilities, and emotional strain that family and work life sometimes carry. "Elijah has already come... Then the disciples understood..." Matthew 17:12–13

Jesus explains that Elijah has already come in the person of John the Baptist, showing me that God often arrives in forms I do not expect. This encourages me to look for Christ in the ordinary moments of family life–kindness, forgiveness, sacrifice–and to recognize that He is already at work renewing and guiding us.

My Prayer: Lord, open my family's eyes to recognize You in each other, so that Your presence may shape our home with love and mercy.


